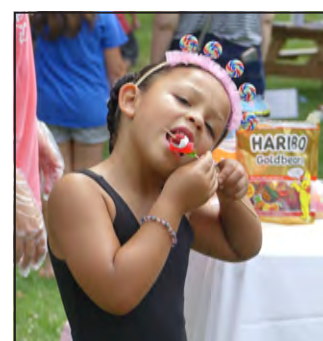

Streamwood Advances EV Readiness

The Village of Streamwood has advanced from Bronze to Silver status in the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus EV Readiness Program, which helps communities prepare for growing electric vehicle (EV) use and charging infrastructure. To level up, we completed an assessment of our municipal fleet for future electric vehicle purchases, added EV provisions to local zoning and building codes, and completed training programs for inspectors and first responders. This recognition reflects the Village's ongoing work to plan for future transportation needs and support a more EV-ready community.

VILLAGE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

What a wonderful way to end the 2026 school year for our Streamwood students. In April, we held another successful Student Government Day, giving more than 20 Streamwood High School students the ability to experience local government firsthand. They reviewed residential plans, approved mock budgets at a Board Meeting, rode in the tower basket, worked with our K-9 units, and planted a new tree on Village grounds—engaging with every aspect of municipal life.

Our May 7 Board meeting was equally exciting as we welcomed students from elementary to post-secondary school to celebrate their achievements. We recognized the three first-grade winners of the Hope Coloring Contest: Briana Espindola from Hanover Countryside, Ruqayyah Mustafa at Hilltop Elementary, and Kayleen Ramirez from Heritage Elementary.

That same evening, we honored nine Streamwood High School seniors who competed at State for DECA and HOSA. DECA prepares emerging leaders in marketing, finance, hospitality, and management, while HOSA furthers student education in health occupations and leadership. Among the students recognized: Amaan Siddiqui – 1st Place at HOSA in World Health Disparities, Zaina Siddiqui – 3rd Place at HOSA in Medical Reading, Anaya Correa-Navarro, Ashley Perez, and Sharon Salazar - DECA State Champions with their team Innovation Plan, and Seniors Alex Martinez (Automotive Services Marketing), HeeSoo Yang (Retail Merchandising), Lizbeth Garcia Martinez and Chloe Anna Paulo (Business Law Ethics – Team Decision Making) all placed in the top ten of their respective areas. We are incredibly proud of our students and know they have bright futures ahead.



The Village and its Community and Economic Development Commission (CEDC) proudly announced the winners of the Community Scholarship Award. Now in its second year since reinstating this program, we doubled last year's applicant pool, with 18 talented applicants. Thanks to the support of our business community, we also doubled the total award to \$5,000 so we could recognize five students. This year's recipients are: Evelyn Hernandez (\$2,500 Award, planning to pursue a degree in Exercise or Health Science), America Jimenez Martinez (\$1,000 Award, planning to pursue a degree in pre-Law), Janelly Malagon (\$500 Award, pursuing Biological Sciences at Benedictine University), Jade Martinez (\$500 Award, pursuing Psychology & Criminal Justice at Aurora University), and Anneliese Van Hauter (\$500 Award, Exercise Science at North Central College). Congratulations to all our students. Your hard work and dedication truly inspire us!

On behalf of the Village Board, I'd like to thank the Veterans Memorial Commission members for their tireless efforts in making our Memorial Day Observance a deeply moving experience. This year, we proudly dedicated our new Space Force pole and flag at the Memorial.

As we approach our nation's 250th anniversary, you have likely noticed the 94 Hometown Heroes banners adorning Irving Park Road. These banners honor local heroes and will remain on display through Veterans Day in November, when they will be presented to families. It is crucial that we continue to celebrate, honor, and remember the service and sacrifice of the brave men and women who gave their lives protecting our nation's freedom.

The Streamwood Blood Drive Commission reported a successful April Community Blood Drive, with 41 units donated. Please remember that personal emergencies and ongoing medical needs require a constant blood supply. Every two seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood. Results from the June 2026 drive will be shared soon, and we look forward to seeing you at our next drive on **August 26**.

VILLAGE CODE CORNER

Pet Regulations

A friendly reminder for pet owners: under Village Code, no person may keep more than three adult dogs, cats, or other animals. Please help keep Streamwood clean and safe by keeping pets leashed during walks and picking up waste immediately. The Village does not require pet licenses, but you may register your animal for free to help the police contact you if your pet is lost. License applications are available on the Village's website. If your pet is lost, call the Police Department main number at (630) 736-3700.

Avoiding Nuisance Wildlife

Keeping our community free from nuisance wildlife is our priority, and ground feeding feral animals is prohibited. Make your property less inviting to critters like rodents, coyotes, and skunks with these simple tips:

- Secure garbage: Ensure trash cans and dumpster lids are tightly closed, especially during the night.
- Bird feeders: It's best to remove bird feeders from your property.
- Pet food: Avoid leaving pet food outdoors overnight to discourage unwanted guests.
- Brush and wood piles: Clear away these to remove potential shelters.
- Seal openings: Close off any gaps around your home's foundation.
- Window wells: Use covers or wire mesh to prevent skunks from getting stuck.
- Fencing: Consider adding fences to keep skunks away, particularly from gardens or small areas.
- Motion-activated devices: While they're not always effective, they might help in certain situations.

Noise Control Regulations

The Village's noise control regulations help ensure a peaceful environment for all by establishing specific times when louder activities are not allowed. In residential areas, we focus on minimizing disruptions from sources like loud music, late-night parties, and other noises. In business areas, we focus on noise from amplified sounds, garbage collection, and loading activities, for example. In general, no construction, loud music, garbage collection, loading or unloading is permitted from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. on weekdays, and 10 p.m. to 10 a.m. on the weekends. Exceptions are permitted for emergencies, and other events. If you are concerned about loud noises in your area, please contact the Streamwood Police Department by calling or texting 911.

When our community comes together for a common cause, small actions can make a big impact in Streamwood and beyond. At the Cultural and Environmental Awareness Commission's April S.E.E.D. event (Streamwood Environmental Education Day), hundreds of residents came out to drop off 21,407 pounds of e-waste and 45 large totes of paper for shredding. In addition, 150 pounds of medication and 800 pounds of batteries (including lithium batteries) were disposed of safely. Attendees also learned about gardening and native plants, waste reduction, water and energy conservation, the benefits of bicycling, and more. Still have items to dispose of? Village Extends Refuse and Recycling Collection Contract

The Village has renewed its agreement with Groot Industries to continue residential refuse and recycling collection service for Streamwood homes. Under the new five-year contract, residents will continue to receive the same level of service they do today, including weekly refuse and recycling pickup, yard waste collection, and contractor-provided carts. As part of the renewed agreement, residents will see a modest increase in monthly service fees beginning in July. The first-year increase will be \$1.44 per month, with smaller annual increases in the following years. Despite the increase, the new rates remain competitive with surrounding communities.

Help Protect Your Home From Unexpected Repair Costs

The Village has partnered with Service Line Warranties of America (SLWA; a HomeServe company) to offer optional repair service plans designed to help protect homeowners from the cost and inconvenience of certain home repair emergencies. Residents can purchase optional coverage for exterior water service lines, exterior sewer lines, and in-home plumbing and drainage repairs. Simple Tips for a Safe Summer

Our Fire Department would like you to keep these tips in mind as you enjoy the summer with family and neighbors:

- Outdoor fires: Fire pits, fireplaces, and chimineas should be at least 10 feet from your home, shed, and trees. Don't leave it unattended unless the fire is completely extinguished. Also, do not store your portable fireplace in the garage, near the house, or under the deck until it's completely extinguished and allowed to cool for at least 24 hours.
- Grilling: Grills are intended for outdoor use only. Indoor use (even in the garage with the door open) can cause a fire and carbon monoxide poisoning. Keep your grill well away from your siding and deck railings. Never use a grill on a balcony and keep them out from under eaves and hanging branches.
- Fireworks: Even legal, consumer-grade fireworks can cause serious burns. For example, legal sparklers reach temperatures of 1,200° F. Stay safe and leave the fireworks to the professionals.
- Swimming: Never leave children unattended in or near pools, hot tubs, and other bodies of water.
- Cycling: Children and adults should always wear a bike helmet and have reflectors on their bicycles.
- Weather: When thunder roars, go indoors. The safest place to be during a storm is inside a stable structure and away from windows.

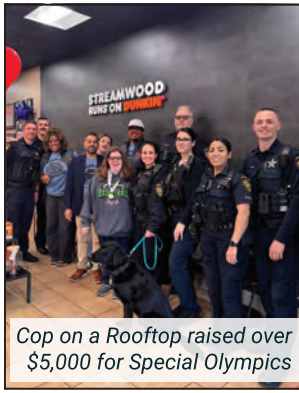
File of Life: Important Medical Info When Seconds Count

Seconds count during medical emergencies and quick access to patient information can help emergency responders identify medical conditions, allergies, medications, emergency contacts, and more. The Fire Department's File of Life program puts this information at the fingertips of firefighters/paramedics when they respond to your home. Each kit includes a magnetic pouch with a 'file' card insert. These cards are meant to be kept on the refrigerator or somewhere easily seen by first responders. Go Behind the Scenes at the Citizens Police Academy



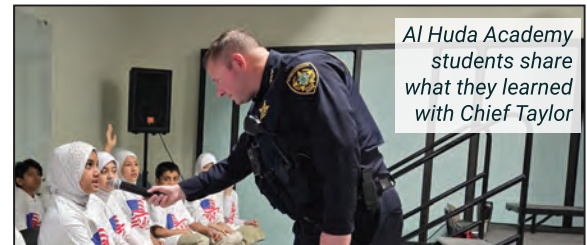
The 2025 Citizens Police Academy Class
