#### **Holiday Shopping Tips**

- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash.
- Carry your purse close to your body and put your wallet in an inside pocket or front pants pocket.
- Have your keys ready to enter your vehicle when you approach
  it. Use your "panic button" on your key fob if you become nervous
  or think you are being followed.
- Lock your doors immediately upon entering your vehicle.

Mark sure the online stores you're shopping from start with https://.



#### 4. Use one credit card

Dedicate one credit card for all your shopping needs.



#### 5. Beware of phishing attacks

Don't enter sensitive or financial information into pop-up windows on suspicious emails.



## 6. Update, update!

Make sure your security software is up-to-date before shopping.



#### 7. Download secure apps only

Use a mobile security solution so that you know the apps you download are safe.



December's Spotlight Employee of the Month is Officer Mitch Van Jacobs. Officer Van Jacobs has been with the Department for three and a half years and is currently assigned to a night shift patrol team. Officer Van Jacobs has demonstrated a passion for making a positive impact on the lives of those we serve and it's clear that he takes pride in his job.

Recently, Officer Van Jacobs stopped a vehicle near the intersection of Irving Park Rd. and Vine St. A probable cause search of the vehicle was conducted, and officers located a backpack containing a handgun and 100 grams of cannabis. The individual in possession of the firearm did not have a FOID or CCL and was charged with Unlawful use of a Weapon. His proactive approach likely prevented a serious crime from taking place.

Officer Van Jacobs is being acknowledged for his outstanding teamwork and dedication to serving the community, and he deserves to be recognized as "One of Streamwood's Finest"!



## **POLICE SOCIAL SERVICES**

### **Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day**

Reflecting on historical events can offer perspective, clarification, awareness, and respect. Please see below for some information regarding the Attack on Pearl Harbor (a date which will live in infamy)...





- Tension had been building between the U.S. and the Empire of Japan for years; both countries were actively monitoring each other for further escalations.
- In 1940, President Roosevelt (FDR) moved the United States Naval Fleet from San Diego to Pearl Harbor, located on Oahu Island, Hawaii.
- On the morning of December 7th, 1941, the Imperial Japanese Navy conducted an aerial attack on the United States at Pearl Harbor.
- The U.S.S. Colorado (Battleship) and all three of the Naval Fleet's Aircraft Carriers (Enterprise, Lexington, and Saratoga) were not present for the attack.
- Sources vary, though it is estimated that approximately 2,400 service members and civilians died at Pearl Harbor. Approx. an additional 1,000 were injured.
- Approx. 1,177 of those service members that died (including 38 sets of brothers)
  were aboard the U.S.S. Arizona, now a sacred memorial which remains partially
  sunken, the last resting place for hundreds of soldiers whose bodies were unable
  to be recovered.
