The Village and its Community and Economic Development Commission are proud to offer a Community Scholarship to help residents pursue post-secondary education - whether you're a graduating senior, current student, or returning to school to upgrade skills or retrain. The Commission may award one or more scholarships, with the total amount awarded not to exceed \$2,500. These funds may be used for tuition, instructional materials or supplies, computers/software, and other education-related expenses. Applicants must live in the Village (12 months or more), be a high school senior/graduate (or have a GED), and demonstrate financial need. Students may be enrolling in (or already attending) a U.S. college/university or technical/trade school. Ready to apply? Financial Reporting Award



The Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) has recognized the Village of Streamwood for the quality of our 2024 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report—also known as the ACFR. We again earned GFOA's Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting, considered the highest recognition for state and local government financial reporting. To qualify, a community must publish a report that is clear, well-organized, and prepared in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles, or GAAP. This recognition is not automatic; it requires annual application and review. This is Streamwood's 37th consecutive year receiving the Certificate. Our community should be proud that we continue to meet this high standard, something only a small number of communities across Illinois have maintained for so long.

Garage Sale Permits: Set Yourself Up for Success

Before you start selling your treasures, remember to grab a garage sale permit! **Permits are now free**, available on our website, and will help ensure everything runs smoothly – giving you a heads up about where you can place signs and other Village regulations. As a reminder, each address is limited to two garage sales per year. And if you're planning a multi-day sale, don't worry - it can be held on consecutive days between 9 AM and 5 PM Visit our website to get your permit and additional information, such as important sign placement regulations. ***New this year! Block Party Permits - Get Ready to Celebrate

If you plan to host a fun-filled gathering in our neighborhood, we want to help make it happen! You can download and submit your block party application at the Village Hall Cashier's Counter or online through our website under "Village Clerk/Permits and Licenses." To ensure everything runs smoothly, the form will guide you through some essential details, like scheduling a visit from the Fire Department and Police Department and arranging for Public Works barricades. 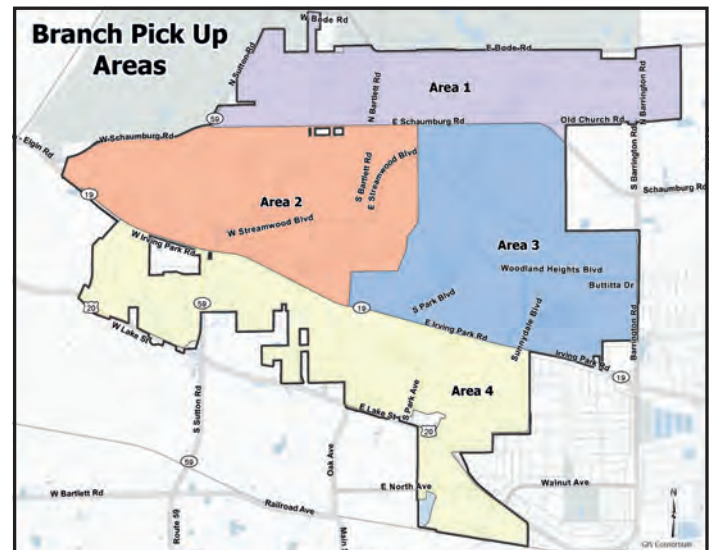
Parking Restrictions Ensure a Clear Path for All

Parking on Village streets is not allowed from 1–5 AM, except in specific subdivisions where signs are posted. Please help us keep the sidewalks clear and accessible to all. From March 1 through November 30, if you park in your driveway, your vehicle may not block the sidewalk. This rule applies on weekdays (Monday through Friday) from 7 AM–9 PM and weekends (Saturday and Sunday) from 9 AM–9 PM.

Branch Pick-up Returns in April

Take advantage of our annual branch collection program and let us do the clean-up for you! The Village is divided into four service areas, as shown on the map. Each area receives branch pick-up once a month. During designated collection days, our team will collect branches from your curbside at no charge to you. For a successful pick-up, please follow the pick-up schedule and branch guidelines. Place branches at the curb by 6 AM on your scheduled collection day. Please have them out in time to avoid missing the pick-up crew. They do their best to collect branches as soon as possible but cannot guarantee a return visit if they're unavailable. Branches must be placed with the cut ends facing the street. They should not be longer than ten feet or have a diameter larger than six inches. Questions? 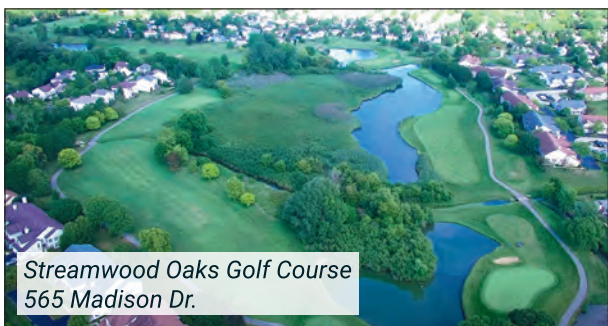

Yard Waste Collection Resumes in April

Spring is here and residents are digging in – cleaning up their yards and gardens. From April 1 to mid-December, you can dispose of landscape and yard waste at the curb. This includes grass clippings, leaves, weeds, shrubbery, brush and branches (up to four feet, bundled with twine), and other materials from routine lawn and tree care. Place items at the curb on the day/time of your regular garbage pick-up, using either brown Kraft paper bags (available at local stores) or a dedicated yard waste trash can that is no larger than 33 gallons and no more than 50 pounds. Plastic “biodegradable” bags are not accepted. Good news – yard waste stickers are no longer required. Yard waste does not include wood timbers, plastic edging, plant pots or trays, fertilizer or landscape material bags, landscape fabric, root sections, sand, gravel, sod, firewood, or animal waste. 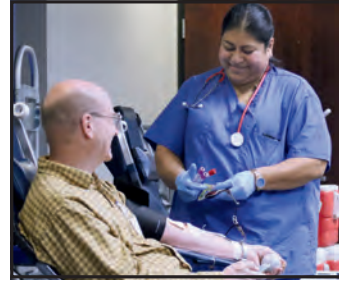

Submit a Request Through the 311 System



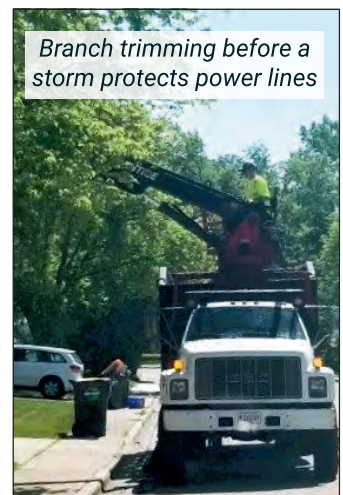

Severe Weather Preparedness

Spring brings warmer temperatures and new life, but it also means increased risk of severe storms in our area. Our Fire Department encourages you to be weather-aware by checking local forecasts regularly to see if there's a risk of severe weather. Local news, NOAA Weather Radio, or a smartphone weather app can also provide alert options. Conduct a severe weather drill for your family, practicing safe evacuation routes, meeting points, and safe places to shelter during a storm. Prepare your home by trimming trees and branches, securing loose objects, and keeping battery-powered flashlights and lanterns in your home. Use surge protectors and ensure you have working smoke and carbon monoxide alarms. When a storm is forecast, close your windows and doors, and move valuable items inside or under a sturdy structure. If there's flooding, do not enter a flooded basement or enter floodwater on foot or by car. Flooding is the leading cause of storm-related deaths. Six inches of fast-moving water can knock you over, and one foot of water can carry away most cars. Seek shelter immediately if you can hear thunder, since it means you're within range of a lightning strike. Visit weather.gov/safety for more information or contact our Fire Department.

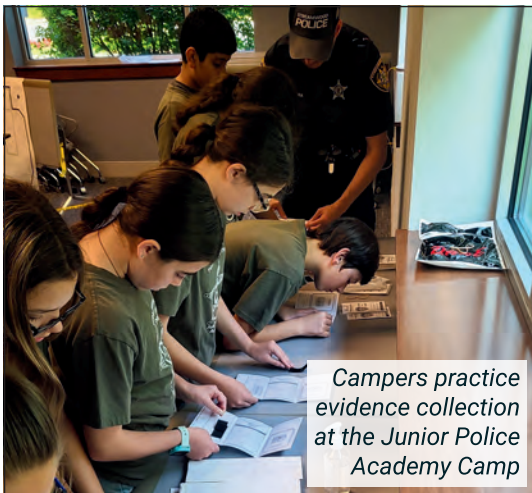
Guns vs. Hoses Charity Basketball Game

Remember to secure your belongings – every time. Even if you're only stepping out for a few minutes, please lock your home doors and windows, garage doors, and your vehicle. Most burglaries and vehicle thefts are crimes of opportunity, and an unlocked door is an easy invitation. Before you leave, secure cash, jewelry, keys, and other valuables in a locked safe or other secure location, out of sight and away from doors and windows. In vehicles, keep belongings hidden or remove them entirely. If you see something suspicious, trust your instincts and call or text 911.

CPR and Stop the Bleed Training Available



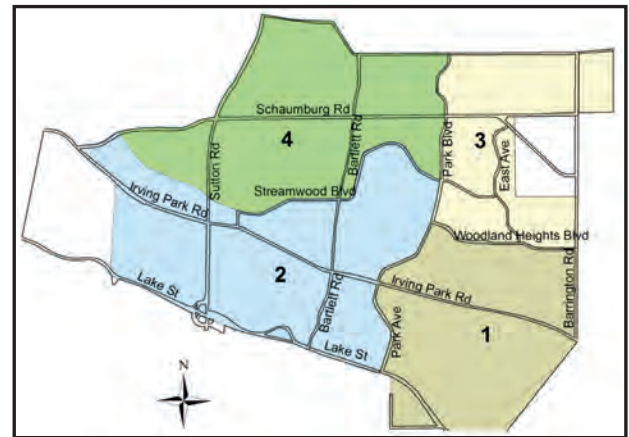

This course will teach you to recognize life-threatening bleeding and act quickly to control it using three quick techniques: applying pressure, packing a wound, and using a tourniquet. Police Beat Meetings

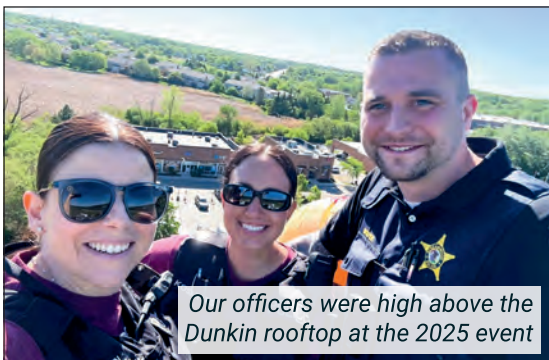

Save Time by Filing a Police Report Online

Skip the trip to the Police Station. Our new Online Police Report Submission System lets residents file reports for certain minor, non-emergency incidents at any time, from anywhere. Use it to report credit card fraud, identity theft, lost property, theft, criminal damage to property, and vandalism. Visit streamwood.nwcds.org or access it through the Village's website under Police Department - Patrol. All submissions are reviewed, and we'll contact you if more info is needed. Please note that this system is not continuously monitored. Call or text 911 if you have an emergency, need an officer to respond or follow up in person, or if you have additional information to share with the police (e.g., you believe you know who committed the crime or evidence was left behind).

Cop on a Rooftop Supports Special Olympics Athletes



On Friday, **May 15**, Streamwood Police officers will be stationed at the Dunkin' store on Sutton Rd. to collect donations for the 23rd Annual Cop On a Rooftop event. The Community Development Department works to ensure a safe community and high quality of life for all residents, businesses, students, and visitors. When a building is constructed or modified, our team reviews permit applications and construction plans, conducts inspections, and issues licenses, acting as a neutral party to ensure that the work performed complies with building, zoning, and property maintenance regulations. They also conduct code enforcement, administer the Rental Residential Licensing Program, and assist the Planning and Zoning Board.

Building Permits Required

The Village requires permits for rehabilitation and renovation projects. The plan review and inspection processes ensure that your home or business - your largest investments - are protected and that work is designed and performed by fully licensed and bonded contractors according to all required building, health, and safety codes. Apply and pay for your permit then track its progress from the comfort of your chair by using our Citizen Self-Service Portal at streamwood.org. You can also find permit applications on our website and at the Village Hall in the Community Development Department. Questions? Walking Inspection Program Begins this Spring

Each spring, the Community Development Department conducts its annual Walking Inspection program to enhance the community's appearance and encourage compliance with Village Codes. In this program, Code Enforcement Officers randomly select streets for inspections, checking for exterior property maintenance items such as tall grass/weeds, home condition (roof, siding, gutters, windows, paint), excess exterior storage, and improperly stored refuse containers. Homeowners who live on the selected streets will be notified by mail before the scheduled inspection date. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. Questions? Contractor Registration Requirements



Homeowners can perform nearly any home improvement project without obtaining a licensed contractor; however, permits and inspections are still required. Furthermore, some projects *must* be performed by licensed and certified professionals such as new electrical services, tapping into the Village's water lines, or connecting to the Village's sewer system. If you hire a contractor, verify their registration with the Village before work begins to ensure they're fully licensed and bonded/insured. The Village does not recommend specific contractors; instead, you can find a list of all contractors that recently registered with the Village at <https://bit.ly/4b3zFfj>.
