# PREPARATION, FORMULATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF HERBAL SOAP AND DISTRIBUTION TO LOCAL COMMUNITY



# INTRODUCTION

Herbal soap is made from natural ingredients such as juice, extracts, and vitamins derived from fresh medicinal plants. The complexity of combining various herbs makes the job both enjoyable and challenging. It's a lot of fun to come up with one's unique combination using artistry and creative imagination.

Herbs are natural and are safe, but those with sensitive skin should also be vigilant about herbal ingredients that may irritate the skin. Making herbal soaps is the same as with any other soap making. The trickiest part of it is choosing the herbal ingredients for the family. Soaps with synthetic chemicals strip the skin of its protective oils and may cause dryness, flaking, and skin dehydration.

# **AIM**

The purpose of this project is to provide community-based support for the prevention of communicable disease and to promote good hygiene.

# **OBJECTIVES**

- 1. To provide community-based support.
- 2. To help community who is unable to purchase hand soap.
- 3. To promote Lincoln University College (LUC) Faculty of Pharmacy.
- 4. To instill awareness and promote practice hygiene.
- 5. To estimate the effective soap and the complete protection time provided by asanitizer after application on the skin.

# **Laboratory Studies**

Sequence of stages for evaluation of technical grade hand sanitizer materials and single-dose formulations of sanitizer products applied to human skin for personal protection.

Sanitizers containing alcohol concentration between 60% - 85% are suggested to kill 99.99% of microorganisms on hands. The sanitizers are effective on bacteria, virus and vice versa. Therefore, we were forced to assess the efficacy of alcohol-based hand sanitizers only on the selected bacteria but not on virus (SARS-CoV-2) due to our laboratory set up constraint for viral isolation and growth. Following this assumption and reviewing related literature, Staphylococcus Aereus, Escherichia Coli, Pseudomonas Aeruginosa, Klebsiella Pneumoniae, Salmonella Typhimurium and Shigella Boydii were selected at the department of microbiology laboratory at Lincoln University College (LUC).



The microorganisms were isolated from clinical specimens with culture, gram stain and biochemical test. During the study, clinical specimens were inoculated on chocolate agar, blood agar, and Monnitol Salt agar incubated overnight (35°C - 37°C) for colony isolation.

On the second day, the gram stain test was examined to differentiate gram positive from negative bacteria for all colonies. At the third day, the test organisms were isolated with biochemical tests using their biochemical characteristics after overnight incubation (35°C - 37°C). The isolated test organisms were stored on storage media and kept at (2°C - 8°C). It will refresh on nutrient agar and used when needed.

Aloe vera leaves and ten (10) pieces of guava leaves are collected and washed thoroughly to remove the unwanted particles and dusts. The aloe vera leaves arecut into half and inner pulps are separated from leaves with knife. The pulps were grinded in grinder machine and place the gel

specific ingredients are used to make this sanitizer. Next important ingredient use to make this a syrupy texture.

The syrup will then be strained to remove dust. In a 100ml empty bottle, it will be filled with 70ml of surgical spirit. Then, 07ml of guava extract syrup were added into the bottle. Lastly, 01 ml of Dettol is added and mixes the whole mixture to get homogeneous liquid sanitizer. The totalamount of sanitizer is 100ml per bottle. The ingredients used for hand sanitizer are brought from the market. Besides that, the amount of ingredients used to make the sanitizer is listed and the corresponding prices are calculated. The total cost of one bottle of sanitizer (100ml) is calculated.



The main ingredient of sanitizer is alcohol. Alcohol based sanitizer is effective to control the

specific ingredients are used to make this sanitizer. Next important ingredient use to make this transmission of disease and it maintains the hygiene on hand. Besides that, surgical spirits is also used as it contains Isopropyl alcohol. After reviewing on all the side effects of sanitizer, some sanitizer is the aloe vera gel. Aloe vera has high healing capacity. It reduces wrinkles on skin because it contains Polysaccharides and growth Hormone Gibberellins. It also prevents the scar tissue and helps to form new cells. Aloe vera gel also gives relief from skin burn and itching. Aloe vera is one of the famous herbal for skin treatment.

The next ingredient is glycerin. Skin disease like dryness, damaging, cracking of skin, eczema, skin irritating can be recovered by applying glycerin. It accelerates the wound healing process and it shows anti-microbial effect. Glycerin has unique ability to remove dead skin cell and it helps to generate new skin cell which is why glycerin is introduced as and ingredients for this hand sanitizer. Guava extract is effective against bacteria and it shows good activities against intestinal microbes, Vibrio Cholera, etc. Guava leaves has also the ability to heal the wound surface.

Maintaining proper hygiene is an important part of sanitizer. Due to the demand of sanitizer in this pandemic, many new brands of sanitizer have come into the market but there is always a doubt on the effectiveness of sanitizers. If proper amount of alcohol is not used, the sanitizer willnot be effective. In order to check the amount in the sanitizer is accurate or wrong, we have performed two small experiments which are:

- I. Tissue Paper Test
- II. Wheat Dough Test

# Tissue Paper Test

This test is based upon Paper Chromatography. We have drawn circle by ball pen on tissue paper and poured some drops of sanitizer on the circle. If the sanitizer contains sufficient amount of alcohol, the ink will be dissolved into sanitizer and starts spreading. It is observed that the sanitizer slowly diffused and moved out of the circle.

# Wheat Dough Test

In this process, we have poured some sanitizer on 01 table spoon on the wheat and mixed it. If excess water is present, it will turn the wheat into dough. It was observed that there was no formation on the dough. If both hands are rubbed by alcohol sanitizer for 30 seconds, following by a complete air drying. This can effectively reduce population of bacteria, and fungi. The similar result was seen after rubbing the hands by the sanitizer.





A wide range of participants such as: the representative of the Lincoln University Malaysia, Lagos State University, officials from UNIC Abuja, and other Academia attended the conference.





## SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP DECLARATION Issued jointly by the attendees in the International Youth Social Entrepreneurship Summit 2021 August 12-13

WHEREAS there is an increasing realization about the limitation of traditional models of businesses especially from the perspective of sustainable development, environmental conservation and promotion of social values such as equity and inclusivity while creating a network of key stakeholders including entrepreneurs, investors, business angels and international organizations to augment necessary changes in the existing ways of pursuit of economic ideals;

WHEREAS the international community realizes the importance of enterprising ability of young people for the promotion of higher standards of living, full employment, and conditions of economic and social progress and development, with a view to the creation of conditions of stability and well-being based on respect for the principle of equal rights;

WHEREAS the emergence of various models of social enterprises are highlighting the crucial role that innovative business solutions, and in particular the role of youth-led social enterprises and start-ups, can play in achieving social objectives at local, regional and global levels and in addressing pressing social and economic challenges;

WHEREAS there is a recognition of the importance of providing entrepreneurs access to the necessary tools, knowledge, and networks to promote collaboration on the role of youth led social enterprises, and to build the capacities of existing and aspiring social entrepreneurs, leveraging on their respective expertise, with a view to achieving the Agenda 2030 and the SDGs;

Representing a collage of social entrepreneurs, campaigners, NGOs, young innovators, researchers and academicians present at the International Youth Social Entrepreneurship Summit, 2021, we, believe that social entrepreneurship and youth led social entrepreneurship should receive desired attention to empower young women and men in realizing their full social and economic potential and in putting innovative business ideas into practice with a view to achieving higher levels of living and development Consequently, we call upon the decision makers to:

- 1. Increase efforts to build a supporting entrepreneur ecosystem for encouraging social entrepreneurs to successfully create and develop their social enterprises, including rightful legal recognition, improved access to markets, networks, knowledge sharing platforms, and skills (global virtual education and training), and improved access to sustainable sources of finance:
- 2. Establish partnership channels among all stakeholders (young people, government, civil society, academicians, advocates, political leaders and community leaders) for the promotion of entrepreneurship, and particularly social entrepreneurship, for inclusive and sustainable development, and recognize social entrepreneurship as a key driver of job creation and economic independence and empowerment, with a special focus on groups which are underrepresented in the society;

- 3. Develop a strong financial marketplace for social entrepreneurship by giving legal recognition and incentivizing private sector leaders to support financial arrangements such as crowdsourcing, venture philanthropy, and angel funds and other funding channels which provide social enterprises working in the sector of climate change, sustainable development, agriculture extension services, health services etc;
- 4. Accelerate the task of designing activities to increase the number of social enterprises and startups which are committed to jointly take action towards the achievement of the SDGs and promote research on the best practices regarding social entrepreneurship to facilitate sharing of best-practices in different sectors and countries:
- 5. Bring entrepreneurship classes within in the formal education system, with a specific module on social entrepreneurship and create platforms to increase soft skills, digital skills and other leadership attributes of social entrepreneurs;
- 6. Promote networking among aspiring and potential entrepreneurs and social entrepreneurs, local authorities and national governments, international organizations, voluntary organizations, representatives from academia, science, technology and educational institutions, investors, and others, to commit to this Declaration and strive for its observance through their respective strategies to support and enable entrepreneurship, with a particular focus on youth, women.

NEPAL DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE, NEPAL (herein after referred as 'Second Party', the organization which expression, unless excluded by or repugnant to the subject or context shall include its successors in office, administrators and assigns). Address: SOS Marg, Koteshwor, Kathmandu, Nepal.

(First Party and Second Party are herein after jointly referred to as 'Parties' and individually as 'Party')

#### WHEREAS:

A. First Party is a Higher Educational Institution named:

#### LINCOLN UNIVERSITY COLLEGE, MALAYSIA

B. First Party & Second Party believe that collaboration and co-operation between themselves will promote more effective use of each of their resources, and provide each of them with enhanced opportunities towards SDG implementation activities and knowledge exchange that leads to a better life in our society through Social Entrepreneurship programs.

C. The Parties intent to cooperate and focus their efforts on cooperation within area of poverty eradication and corporate social responsibility (CSR) programs through the implementation of UN SGGs.

D. Both Parties, being legal entities in themselves desire to sign this MOU for advancing the mutual interests.

E. NEPAL DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE, NEPAL, the Second Party was founded as a not-for-profit making and non-political-non-governmental and a social development organization (SDO) in 2003. As a Civil Society Organization (CSO), NEDI is strongly believed and applying mutual partnership and good coordination with government institutions, development partners and all concern stakeholders including private sector.

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISESE SET FORTH IN THIS MOU, THE PARTIES HERE TO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

#### 1.0 COOPERATION

1.1 Both Parties are united by common interests and objectives, and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations within the



Institution and its related wings. The Parties shall keep each other informed of potential areas where supports are truly needed and shall share all information that may be relevant to secure additional opportunities for one another.

The Parties shall cooperate with each other and shall, as promptly as is reasonably practical, enter into all relevant agreements, deeds and documents (the 'Definitive Documents') as may be required to give effect to the actions contemplated in terms of this MOU. The term of Definitive Documents shall be mutually decided between the Parties. Along with the Definitive Documents, this MOU shall represent the entire understanding as to the subject matter hereof and shall supersede any prior understanding between the Parties on the subject matter hereof.

#### 2.0 SCOPE OF THE MOU

- 2.1 The organizational level of this MOU will be between NEDI and LUC for engaging with Nepal SDGs Forum and campaigns in both countries on capacity building, awareness raising, knowledge sharing on SDGs and 2030 agendas.
- 2.2 Both Parties will be co-organizer or participant of events or activities of interest, especially, those that have something to do with the UN SDGs.
- 2.3 Both Parties will be co-organizer or participant of events or activities of interest and exchange knowledge that leads to a better life in our society through Social Entrepreneurship programs.
- 2.4 Research Volunteers: Organize research programs academic and non-academic by LUC and NEDI on different thematic areas.
- 2.5 Event Volunteers: Event Volunteer will support to promote events, technical inputs, event host and the necessary support.
- 2.6 Student Volunteers: Both Parties can arrange the student exchange, volunteering in between Nepal and Malaysia and engage in different community activities as well as social work activities.
- 2.7 Short academic and non-academic course. Both Parties will be engaged to prepare short and long term academic courses related to SDGs and Social Entrepreneurship and promote globally.
- 2.8 Both Parties agreed to share and use the logos of both parties as necessary during events and programs.
- 2.9 The MOU will voluntarily apply for both Parties and will be renewed each year by improving and agreeing terms and conditions as necessary.
- 2.10 This MOU will not indicate any financial obligation however both parties can prepare the Terms of References and agreement paper based on a particular event/activity/program.
- 2.11 Certification: In the case of short academic and non-academic courses, upon the completion of the course, First party in affiliation with Second party will issue certificate to the beneficiaries. This certificate will serve as evidence of completion of the specified program.
- 2.12 Both Parties to obtain all internal approvals, consents, permissions, and licenses of whatsoever nature required for offering the program on the terms specified herein.



#### 3.0 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

3.1 Nothing contained in this MOU shall, by express grant, implication, Estoppel or otherwise, create in either Party any right, title, interest, or license in or to the intellectual property (including but not limited to know-how, inventions, patents, copyrights and designs) of the other Party.

#### 4.0 VALIDITY

- 4.1 This Agreement will be valid until it is expressly terminated by either Party on mutually agreed terms, during which period the Second Party as the case maybe, will take effective steps for implementation of this MOU. Any act on the part of the Parties after termination of this Agreement by way of communication, correspondence etc., shall not be construed as an extension of this MOU.
- 4.2 Both Parties may terminate this MOU upon 30 calendar days' notice in writing. In the event of Termination, both parties have to discharge their obligations.

#### 5.0 RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES

5.1 Neither Party is authorized to use the other Party's name in anyway, to make any representations or create any obligation or liability, expressed or implied, on behalf of the other Party, without the prior written consent of the other Party. Neither Party shall have, nor represent itself as having, any authority under the terms of this MOU to make agreements of any kind in the name of or binding upon the other Party, to pledge the other Party's credit, or to extend credit on behalf of the other Party.
