PREPARATION, FORMULATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF HERBAL SOAP AND DISTRIBUTION TO LOCAL COMMUNITY



INTRODUCTION

Herbal soap is made from natural ingredients such as juice, extracts, and vitamins derived from fresh medicinal plants. The complexity of combining various herbs makes the job both enjoyable and challenging. It's a lot of fun to come up with one's unique combination using artistry and creative imagination.

Herbs are natural and are safe, but those with sensitive skin should also be vigilant about herbal ingredients that may irritate the skin. Making herbal soaps is the same as with any other soap making. The trickiest part of it is choosing the herbal ingredients for the family. Soaps with synthetic chemicals strip the skin of its protective oils and may cause dryness, flaking, and skin dehydration.

AIM

The purpose of this project is to provide community-based support for the prevention of communicable disease and to promote good hygiene.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. To provide community-based support.
- 2. To help community who is unable to purchase hand soap.
- 3. To promote Lincoln University College (LUC) Faculty of Pharmacy.
- 4. To instill awareness and promote practice hygiene.
- 5. To estimate the effective soap and the complete protection time provided by asanitizer after application on the skin.

Laboratory Studies

Sequence of stages for evaluation of technical grade hand sanitizer materials and single-dose formulations of sanitizer products applied to human skin for personal protection.

Sanitizers containing alcohol concentration between 60% - 85% are suggested to kill 99.99% of microorganisms on hands. The sanitizers are effective on bacteria, virus and vice versa. Therefore, we were forced to assess the efficacy of alcohol-based hand sanitizers only on the selected bacteria but not on virus (SARS-CoV-2) due to our laboratory set up constraint for viral isolation and growth. Following this assumption and reviewing related literature, Staphylococcus Aereus, Escherichia Coli, Pseudomonas Aeruginosa, Klebsiella Pneumoniae, Salmonella Typhimurium and Shigella Boydii were selected at the department of microbiology laboratory at Lincoln University College (LUC).



The microorganisms were isolated from clinical specimens with culture, gram stain and biochemical test. During the study, clinical specimens were inoculated on chocolate agar, blood agar, and Monnitol Salt agar incubated overnight $(35^{\circ}C - 37^{\circ}C)$ for colony isolation.

On the second day, the gram stain test was examined to differentiate gram positive from negative bacteria for all colonies. At the third day, the test organisms were isolated with biochemical tests using their biochemical characteristics after overnight incubation (35° C - 37° C). The isolated test organisms were stored on storage media and kept at (2° C - 8° C). It will refresh on nutrient agar and used when needed.

Aloe vera leaves and ten (10) pieces of guava leaves are collected and washed thoroughly to remove the unwanted particles and dusts. The aloe vera leaves arecut into half and inner pulps are separated from leaves with knife. The pulps were grinded in grinder machine and place the gel

specific ingredients are used to make this sanitizer. Next important ingredient use to make this a syrupy texture.

The syrup will then be strained to remove dust. In a 100ml empty bottle, it will be filled with 70ml of surgical spirit. Then, 07ml of guava extract syrup were added into the bottle. Lastly, 01 ml of Dettol is added and mixes the whole mixture to get homogeneous liquid sanitizer. The totalamount of sanitizer is 100ml per bottle. The ingredients used for hand sanitizer are brought from the market. Besides that, the amount of ingredients used to make the sanitizer is listed and the corresponding prices are calculated. The total cost of one bottle of sanitizer (100ml) is calculated.



The main ingredient of sanitizer is alcohol. Alcohol based sanitizer is effective to control the

specific ingredients are used to make this sanitizer. Next important ingredient use to make this transmission of disease and it maintains the hygiene on hand. Besides that, surgical spirits is also used as it contains Isopropyl alcohol. After reviewing on all the side effects of sanitizer, some sanitizer is the aloe vera gel. Aloe vera has high healing capacity. It reduces wrinkles on skin because it contains Polysaccharides and growth Hormone Gibberellins. It also prevents the scar tissue and helps to form new cells. Aloe vera gel also gives relief from skin burn and itching. Aloe vera is one of the famous herbal for skin treatment.

The next ingredient is glycerin. Skin disease like dryness, damaging, cracking of skin, eczema, skin irritating can be recovered by applying glycerin. It accelerates the wound healing process and it shows anti-microbial effect. Glycerin has unique ability to remove dead skin cell and it helps to generate new skin cell which is why glycerin is introduced as and ingredients for this hand sanitizer. Guava extract is effective against bacteria and it shows good activities against intestinal microbes, Vibrio Cholera, etc. Guava leaves has also the ability to heal the wound surface.

Maintaining proper hygiene is an important part of sanitizer. Due to the demand of sanitizer in this pandemic, many new brands of sanitizer have come into the market but there is always a doubt on the effectiveness of sanitizers. If proper amount of alcohol is not used, the sanitizer willnot be effective. In order to check the amount in the sanitizer is accurate or wrong, we have performed two small experiments which are:

I. Tissue Paper Test II. Wheat Dough Test

<u>Tissue Paper Test</u>

This test is based upon Paper Chromatography. We have drawn circle by ball pen on tissue paper and poured some drops of sanitizer on the circle. If the sanitizer contains sufficient amount of alcohol, the ink will be dissolved into sanitizer and starts spreading. It is observed that the sanitizer slowly diffused and moved out of the circle.

Wheat Dough Test

In this process, we have poured some sanitizer on 01 table spoon on the wheat and mixed it. If excess water is present, it will turn the wheat into dough. It was observed that there was no formation on the dough. If both hands are rubbed by alcohol sanitizer for 30 seconds, following by a complete air drying. This can effectively reduce population of bacteria, and fungi. The similar result was seen after rubbing the hands by the sanitizer.


