



JOIN OUR CAMPAIGN TO SAVE OTMOOR FROM THE ROAD BUILDERS

A major new road between Oxford and Cambridge is part of the government's 'growth corridor' plan to facilitate a million new houses, with a target for Oxfordshire equal to six towns the size of Oxford.

Because of the tight government timetables, there has been no Strategic Environmental Assessment and no public consultation. Instead, Highways England will decide their favoured corridor behind closed doors in July 2018.

One of their four potential routes, 'S2', goes around the east of Oxford, cutting through twelve miles of green belt and rural villages before joining the A34 at Abingdon.

It would have to go across, or alongside, Otmoor. Either would be devastating. From what little information has been released, the CPRE believe it would follow the route overleaf.
