For Immediate Release — Justice for Ohio Kids

As a mother and a survivor, I never imagined my deepest childhood trauma would one day collide with the life of my own son. When I was only eight years old, I was sexually assaulted by Dan Davis — an experience that fractured my innocence and shaped the rest of my life. I spent years fighting to heal from what was done to me. I learned to bury the pain, to keep moving, and to survive in silence, believing the past could never rise again.

But on January 6, 2025, the nightmare I thought I had escaped returned when my son Thor, who was just fifteen years old at the time, was assaulted. In an instant, every wound from my childhood reopened. The fear, the heartbreak, the helplessness — it all came rushing back. But unlike when I was eight, this time I refused to be silent. This time, I refused to let the system fail another child.

Thor deserved safety. Every child does. But the laws failed him. The safeguards failed him. And the people responsible for protecting our children failed him. What happened to my son should never happen to any family — not in Ohio, not anywhere.

I am speaking out today not because it is easy, but because it is necessary. I am speaking out because no parent should have to relive their childhood trauma through the suffering of their child. I am speaking out because the system must change — and change begins with truth, accountability, and the courage to demand better.

Justice for Ohio Kids was created from my pain, my son's pain, and the countless other families silently carrying their trauma. Our mission is simple: expose the failures, protect our children, and fight for laws that ensure no predator, no school, and no institution can ever again hide behind loopholes or weak policies.

I will not stop fighting. I will not be silent. My son deserves justice — and so do all the children of Ohio. We call on lawmakers, the media, and every parent to stand with us. Our children cannot wait. Their safety cannot wait. The time for change is now.
