Introduction

2024

This Game and Equality toolkit is a short and practical document for coaches to use during the tournament. It explains the tools used to improve equality and social inclusion during the activitees.

It is important to acknowledge that these tools should be used in a similar way in all of the six consortium countries, in order to reach the most optimal result during the European final in Paris in September 2024.

Team selection

2024

The 2024 edition of the Streetwise14 tournament will again count with a girls category and a boys category.

Because we aim for maximum participation of girls in the tournament we use this approach instead of using mixed teams. This approach appeals more to girls who normally do not practice football. The idea of sharing the pitch with their girl classmates invites many girls and introduces those who not regularly play to the sport.

Using school teams is by far the best option for the tournaments, as there are already strong bonds between the participating children. Also children with a handicap will find an easier access to the tournament as they will be playing with their friends from school.

Use of Score Card + Behaviour cards

The main tools for social inclusion and gender equality used in the tournament are the respect score card and the behavioural cards (the green and the blue card).

Each team should value their opponent after the matches on the criteria as presented in the respect score card. The winner of the most respect points at the end of the tournament wins the respect award.

The green and the blue cards can be given out by the referee, the coaches of the opponents team and the organization. These cards all add a respect point (green card) or subtract a respect point (blue).

EQUALITY AND FAIR PLAY SCORE CARD

- Disrespectful attitudes. The team and the bench did not respect the spirit of the tournament
- Attitudes not totally respectful, little team play. Small bits of fair play and equality
- Sufficiently respectful attitudes.
 Team game present but can be improved
- Respectful attitude.
 Teamwork, Equality, inclusion and fair play
- Team and bench best represented the spirit of the tournament

EQUALITY AND FAIR PLAY SCORE CARD



By highlighting the positive in participants, we encourage their mindset and daily thinking, thus fostering an openness to learning and a challenge to overcome despite the difficulties encountered during the session.

This green card reinforces positive behaviors and progress based on the moral development of children and can be used by everyone: tutors, parents, children, young leaders, and other actors. It is a universal tool that can be attributed both individually and collectively in different situations, such as punctuality, personal efficiency in effort, repetition, or perseverance. It can also be linked to conflict resolution, such as the case where no one wants to volunteer to be goalkeeper but a partner volunteers, or autonomy principles like picking up equipment, for example.

To regulate this green card better, Futbol Mas has implemented another equally important tool: the blue card.

This card aims to respond to negative behaviors with a challenge for behavior improvement. It focuses on behaviors harmful to children's individual and collective development and threatening the values promoted by the tournament. Its use must be judicious and cautious, with the aim of inviting improvement and transforming this blue card into a green card, while excluding any idea of punishment or sanction. It is accompanied by a dialogue in a reassuring space or environment, encouraging change and personal improvement.

14 RULES OF JOHAN CRUYFF

On all the Cruyff Courts, also the 14 rules of Johan Cruyff are reinforced. These 14 rules are all important for correct and respectful behaviour on the pitches.
