## Jan Demonstrator


### John Lucas


Jeff Brocket did a great demo on making a footed Platter/bowl. These pictures will be a good reminder of the process he used in his presentation.

# Dec. Christmas Dinner




The dinner at the Privateer Yacht Club gave families opportunity to enjoy an evening together with great food, fun playing games, and fellowship

Beware some videos share some erroneous information. Watch for people doing unsafe things—that is a good indication not to follow their channel. On the other hand, there are a lot of good professional turners that can teach us many good lessons. You are encourage to watch then go practice what you learn. The “doing” or practicing what you see will be a great way toward deeper learning.

# Safety Tips

It's been said, Life is too short to turn junk wood, or similar phrases. There is a good chance it could blow up causing damage and personal injury to the turner. Before turning such wood, ask yourself if it is worth the risk? Maybe your time would be better spent turning a better piece.

If the piece of wood presents great grain or for some reason would be a terrific piece when finished, there are some things you can do to make it safe to turn. Try filling the crack with CA glue, epoxy or resin. This could add interest by highlighting the flaw. Patching is another option.



# Useful Ideas, Tips, Tools & Techniques



In this digital age filing cabinets have become somewhat obsolete for many people and can often be found in garage sales quite inexpensive. They make wonderful storage places for turning supplies. If looking for one try to secure "full suspension" cabinets. They will make life much easier. How do you know if they are full suspension? Look for the metal guides the drawers slid out on. Drawers are much easier to get in and out, especially if they have weight on them. I have four lined up in my workshop and every drawer is filled. You may have to use a box inside as the sides often are not the full height of the drawer.




