An official AAW chapter

An Artisan in the International Guild of Miniature Artisans, I am a wood-turner specializing in miniatures, specifically 18th and 19th century replicas in a scale of one inch to one foot. I teach woodturning at UNC Asheville in SkillSet, a community outreach program that began in 2018 as a shop class for girls and now expands its reach to all members of the community. I served 6 years on the board of Carolina Mountain Woodturners, 2 as vice president and 2 as president. CMW is the largest chapter of the American Association of Woodturners. I have demonstrated for clubs in Maine, Tennessee, and North Carolina, and online for the International Guild of Miniature Artisans.

I will demonstrate scaling objects from full size down to 1:12 and show how turning miniatures helps with tool control. My expertise is in 18th and 19th century replica antiques. I will turn to scale a lidded wood bowl, a replica from the Winterthur Museum in Delaware. I will also talk about tools for turning miniatures.



June Demonstrator

Colin did a wonderful presentation turning a platter with a bowl in the center. Starting with a thick round piece of cherry, about 12" x 2" and starting by rounding the blank. Once the face was flat he moved to the back. The blank started taking shape.

Once the platter had shape and the bowl was turned, Colin added some embellishment by cutting 3 rings and added leather string in the rings. A beautiful platter anyone would be proud to put on their table or give as a gift.
