


January Demostrator

The opening reception is Saturday evening April 5th from 5:00 - 7:00 PM. Each participant may bring up to five pieces for display. All pieces are to be "for sale" with 30% going to BRMAA. As soon as Tim receives the information as to paperwork, inventory list, and drop off/pick up we will get it out to you.. Please note these dates as we want to have a good showing as this will be the first "all wood show" at the facility. The show will consist of Etowah River Woodturners, Canton, Ga., Apple Ridge Woodturners in Ellijay, Ga., Tri-State Woodturners in Chattanooga, TN and two woodcarving clubs.

One from Blue Ridge, Ga. And one from Brasstown, NC.

For the Tri-State Club transportation of your pieces can be provided by Tim Mehling. If you want Tim to transport your pieces you will need to bring them to the March 15th meeting. (This date may change) The following info will be needed with your boxed/bagged pieces.

Peppermill Steps by Leslie Ballard

BOTTOM

Separate the top from the bottom (band saw or lathe)

Mount the bottom section between centers

"Circleize" your blank

Add a tenon on the top (size doesn't matter.)

Mount tenon in chuck

Make a tenon on the bottom (note it will be part of the design so don't make it too small.)

Smooth bottom and make a mark for drill bit

Drill 1 5/8" hole 3/4 inch deep

Drill 1 1/16" hole as deep as you can, at least past the halfway mark.

Sand and finish the bottom. You won't have access to it again. Make sure the part that sits on the table is slightly concave.

Flip the blank in the chuck.

Drill 1 1/6" to meet the hole you made from the bottom

Bring up a cone center for support.

Roughly shape the peppermill

Remove cone center, finish shaping and sand and finish the top. (Sand and finish inside as best you can because it can be seen when peppercorns are added.)

Mount the blank by the top in a jam chuck.

Bring up the cone center for support.

Finish shaping, sand and finish the mill body

TOP

Mount between centers and "circleize."

Make a tenon on the top and mount in chuck

Smooth the bottom and add a spot for the drill bit to seat.

Drill through the blank with a 9/32" drill bit.

Make a tenon

Flip so bottom is now mounted in the chuck.

Smooth top where P screw will sit so that it looks good when peppercorns are refilled. Make it slightly concave so the P sits flush.

Flip again

Create a 1" or so tenon that will fit inside the mill body.

Make a recess for the small metal plate that will be screwed in that piece.

Shape the bottom of the top.

Sand and finish the bottom of the top

Mount it in a jam chuck and bring up a cone center for support.

Finish shaping, sand and finish the top of the top.

Make a recess for the small metal plate that will be screwed in that piece. Drill 9/32" through the blank Shape the bottom of the top. Sand and finish the bottom of the top Mount it in Pen Jaws and bring up a cone center for support.

Finish shaping, sand and finish the top of the top.

Remove the cone center. Make sure there is a slight concave area at the top where the "P" sits so that it sits flush.
