Cost	Paid by the state; free for students	AP exam fee
College Credit Awarded	Credit awarded by maintaining a C average in the course (without the 6 points)	Must pass exam to receive college credit
College Credit Acceptance	Accepted across the state of Georgia	Accepted at universities across the country. Individual colleges determine minimum score and credit acceptance
Rigor	Considered a rigorous course by colleges	Considered a rigorous course by colleges

HISTORY 2111

U.S. HISTORY I TO 1877



- Study of **U. S. History to 1877** to include the post-Civil War period.
- Include geographical, intellectual, political, economic and cultural development of the American people.
- **Topics include:** colonization and expansion; the Revolutionary Era; the New Nation; nationalism, sectionalism, and reform; the Era of Expansion; and crisis, Civil War, and reconstruction.

HISTORY 2112

U.S. HISTORY II SINCE 1865

- Study of **history of the United States from 1865 to the beginning of the twenty-first century**
- Include geographical, intellectual, political, economic and cultural development of the American people.
- **Topics include:** the Reconstruction Period; the great West, the new South, and the rise of the debtor; the Gilded Age; the progressive movement; the emergence of the U. S. in world affairs; the Roaring Twenties; the Great Depression; World War I; World War II; the Cold War and the 1950's; the Civil Rights Movement; the 1960's and 1970's; and America since 1980.

ENGLISH 1101 COMPOSITION AND RHETORIC

- Students **practice various modes of writing, ranging from exposition to argumentation.**
- Students **review standard grammatical and stylistic usage in proofreading and editing.**
- Students **write a research paper using library resources** and using a formatting and documentation style appropriate to the purpose and audience.



ENGLISH 1102 LITERATURE AND COMPOSITION

- Students **read literature analytically** and meaningfully and to communicate clearly.
- Students analyze the form and content of **literature in historical and philosophical contexts.**
- Topics include reading and analysis of **fiction, poetry, and drama;** research; and writing about literature.

MATH DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES

MATH 1103 **QUANTATIVE REASONING**

- Focuses on quantitative skills and reasoning in the context of experiences that students will be likely to encounter.
- Enhance mathematical thinking and understanding.
- Applications
- Basic functions and graphs

MATH 1111 **COLLEGE ALGEBRA**

- Emphasizes techniques of problem solving using algebraic concepts.
- Topics: fundamental concepts of algebra, equations and inequalities, functions and graphs
- Applications

MATH 1113 **COLLEGE PRE-CALCULUS**

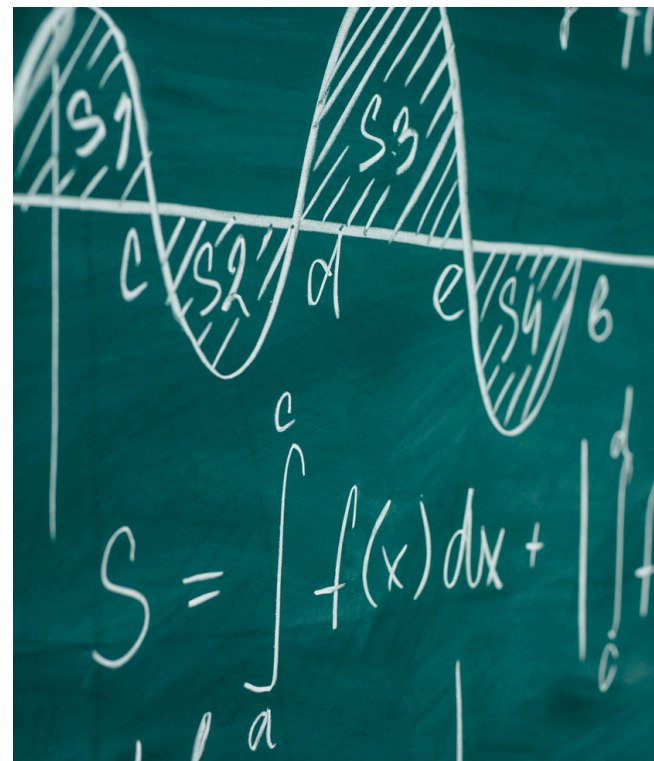
- Prepares students for calculus and statistics
- study of polynomial, rational, exponential, logarithmic, and trigonometric functions and their graphs, counting principles, limits and Derivatives
- Applications

MATH DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES



MATH 1131 CALCULUS 1

- Topics include the study of limits, continuity, Differential calculus and Integral calculus
- Real Life Applications
- Prepared for Cal 2



OR

MATH 1127 INTRO TO STATISTICS

- Emphasizes the concepts and methods fundamental to utilizing and interpreting commonly used statistics
- Topics: descriptive statistics, basic probabilities, sampling distributions and hypothesis testing
- Real life applications

HOPE SCHOLARSHIP IMPACT

The **Zell Miller Scholarship** is a merit-based scholarship that provides **full tuition** at a public postsecondary institution and tuition assistance at an eligible private postsecondary institution. A student must graduate with **a minimum 3.7 GPA** along with **a minimum composite score of 26** on the ACT.

The **HOPE Scholarship** is a merit-based scholarship that provides assistance towards the cost of tuition at eligible public and private Georgia postsecondary institutions. A student must graduate with **a minimum 3.0 GPA**. It covers **most of college tuition** costs.

Dual Enrollment credit “is included in determining a student’s high school HOPE GPA.”

Poor performance in a Dual Enrollment course will affect high school GPA, which can, in turn, affect your initial eligibility for the Zell Miller and HOPE Scholarship.
