





of Black Journalists and Black Honors Caucus. Aleah is also a Spring 2019 initiate of the Kappa Phi Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. and served as President of the chapter in 2020.

Aleah also served as the 2019-2020 Miss Unity of University of Maryland where her platform focused on the protection of Black women's bodies from the disproportionate impact of human sex trafficking; "We're taking our bodies back."

It's her love of asking questions that landed her internships with PBS Newshour Weekend, BET Networks, and the New York State Assembly.

Upon graduating, Aleah worked at Horizon Media where she activated culturally and socially responsible digital advertising campaigns for BET. Aleah then became an Events Social Coordinator with MTV Entertainment Group where she collaborated on social and digital strategy and production for culture-making events from the Movie and TV Awards to the VMAs. Aleah is now at IBM where she strategizes digital journey's to maintain brand reputation.

In addition to that they have held annual toy donations for Christmas, the Rem Bowl which was a 'Turkey Bowl' held during Thanksgiving in honor of a Spring Valley native who passed away due to gun violence, a Health and Wellness Day event, and even a 'Get Out The Vote' rally where Mondaire Jones first announced that he would be running for Congress.

In his free time, he works alongside a team of young entrepreneurs known as team Flushadelphia; a team made up of entrepreneurs who take pride in personal development and family-like mentorship. Their goals are to make a global impact by helping 100 families create an additional stream of income in a year.

J'vanyka Hardy







Mondaire Jones is the 35-year-old Congressman from New York's 17th District, serving Westchester and Rockland Counties.



Chair of the LGBTQ Equality Caucus.

A product of East Ramapo public schools, Mondaire was raised in Section 8 housing and on food stamps by a single mother who worked multiple jobs to provide for their family. He later graduated from Stanford University, worked at the Department of Justice during the Obama Administration, and graduated from Harvard Law School.

He is a co-founder of the nonprofit Rising Leaders, Inc. and has previously served on the NAACP's National Board of Directors and on the board of the New York Civil Liberties Union. As well as past-President of the NAACP Youth Council.

Nastasha Pollard



Nastasha Pollard served as NAACP Youth Council President for two years. She then left Rockland County after graduating from North Rockland High School to attend University of Miami, FL where she received her Bachelor of Science in Nursing and Mathematics.

After working as a Critical Care Registered Nurse at NYU Langone Hospital, Lenox Hill Hospital, NYP Cornell Hospital, and Memorial Sloan Kettering, she went to Florida to complete her Masters in Nurse Anesthesia at the University of South Florida in Tampa. Ra'Vynn served on the National Board in numerous roles. As a member of the Environmental Justice and Climate Change Committee and Convention Planning Committee. She also served as Vice Chair of the Board's Economic Development, Health Committees, and Youth Works Committee. Over the past few years, she has organized community clean ups with Keep Rockland Beautiful, planned and hosted the Dr. Hazel N. Dukes Distinguished Leadership Banquet, organized town halls, conventions, a National Financial Literacy Campaign as well as numerous other events, trainings, and programs.

'THE NEGRO NATIONAL ANTHEM'

Lift every voice and sing
Till earth and heaven ring,
Ring with the harmonies of Liberty;
Let our rejoicing rise
High as the listening skies,
Let it resound loud as the rolling sea.
Sing a song full of the faith that the dark past has taught us,
Sing a song full of the hope that the present has brought us,
Facing the rising sun of our new day begun
Let us march on till victory is won.

Stony the road we trod,
Bitter the chastening rod,
Felt in the days when hope unborn had died;
Yet with a steady beat,
Have not our weary feet
Come to the place for which our fathers sighed?
We have come over a way that with tears have been watered,
We have come, treading our path through the blood of the slaughtered,
Out from the gloomy past,
Till now we stand at last
Where the white gleam of our bright star is cast.

God of our weary years,
God of our silent tears,
Thou who has brought us thus far on the way;
Thou who has by Thy might
Led us into the light,
Keep us forever in the path, we pray.
Lest our feet stray from the places, Our God, where we met Thee;
Lest, our hearts drunk with the wine of the world, we forget Thee;
Shadowed beneath Thy hand,
May we forever stand.


