- Prices are per POUND. We work in ounces in the mill and might show this on our notes.

- Price includes tumbling, washing, picking/fiber separator, draw frame, spinning, plying and skein/cones.
- · Prices are per POUND.

Note for Suri: A \$5 service will be applied for removal of heavy veggie matter. We do recommend a 10-20% Blend with other fibers BUT it is not necessary.

- \* Not all fiber will qualify for lace. We will discuss this if issue arises. We will swatch out the fiber to make sure it can handle the spin.
- \*\*\* Great for Navajo weaving or general weaving

All skeins will be washed once for final rinse and set.

If blending your own fibers together just let us know what ratios you think you want. We weigh everthing to make sure percentages add up. 70% fiber A to 30% fiber B (example). Please do not put them in the same bag. Just make sure you mark the bags as 1 of 2 and 2 of 2. Or "pair with" ....

- Prices are subject to change without notice.
- CPP is the Cost Per Pound.
- Customers will be given a date when their fiber should arrive at the mill.
- We cater to small and medium flock raisers, heritage groups and artisans but will have space for customers with acquired fleece to process.
- Projects exceeding 60 pounds may require extended processing time due to the care we provide with each and every ounce.
- A \$25.00 fee will be charged for all returned checks.
- Outstanding accounts will be assessed a 5% charge per month on any balance due over 30 days. After 90 days, items from accounts unpaid will become the property of The Sheepwalk Fiber Mill, LLC.
