\$5-8 per pound for raw fleece for medium to coarse wool

This can include heritage shetland, jacob, gulf coast, awassi, karakul and churro. Fleece price is based on quality and condition.

\$7-10 per pound for raw fleece for untested fine to light medium wool. This can include rambouillet, suffolk, hampshire, debouillet, delaine, and so on. Fleece price is based on quality and condition.

For camelid and mohair, prices can be negotiated. We also offer Co-Op trades where you give 50% donated and get product back that is 100% yours OR we blend with same or other fibers to create a unique product that represents Texas. You



will receive product in return as well. We will try to match product to your interests or needs!
