

## Cervical Cancer Screening Program Launch: IVA

Our IVA program officially launched in April! Treating diseases like cervical cancer is especially challenging due to limited access to specialized care in Haiti—so prevention is key. That's why we've set an ambitious goal: to screen 500 women in the Sud-Est department this year. The program will raise awareness about cervical cancer, provide life-saving screenings, offer education on treatment for those who test positive, and ensure women return for follow-ups so precancerous cells can be caught early and treated.

**Akouchman: Ultrasound** 

In April, our four licensed midwives began a one-month comprehensive training on how to use an ultrasound machine and interpret the images—an exciting step toward improving the quality of care we offer our patients. This continued education effort is made possible thanks to the generous support we received during our Giving Tuesday 2024 campaign. A quick update: the ultrasound machine has been ordered and is currently en route to Haiti, and we can't

wait to put this new skill into practice soon!







Our Family Support Program (FSP) currently assists 19 families. We had a new officer join the team last month. Our Family Support Officer, Darline Marcelin, has over 20 years of experience serving vulnerable families in Haiti. Darline is deeply committed to social justice and creating a better future for women and children.
