Cervical Cancer Screening Program IVA Update:

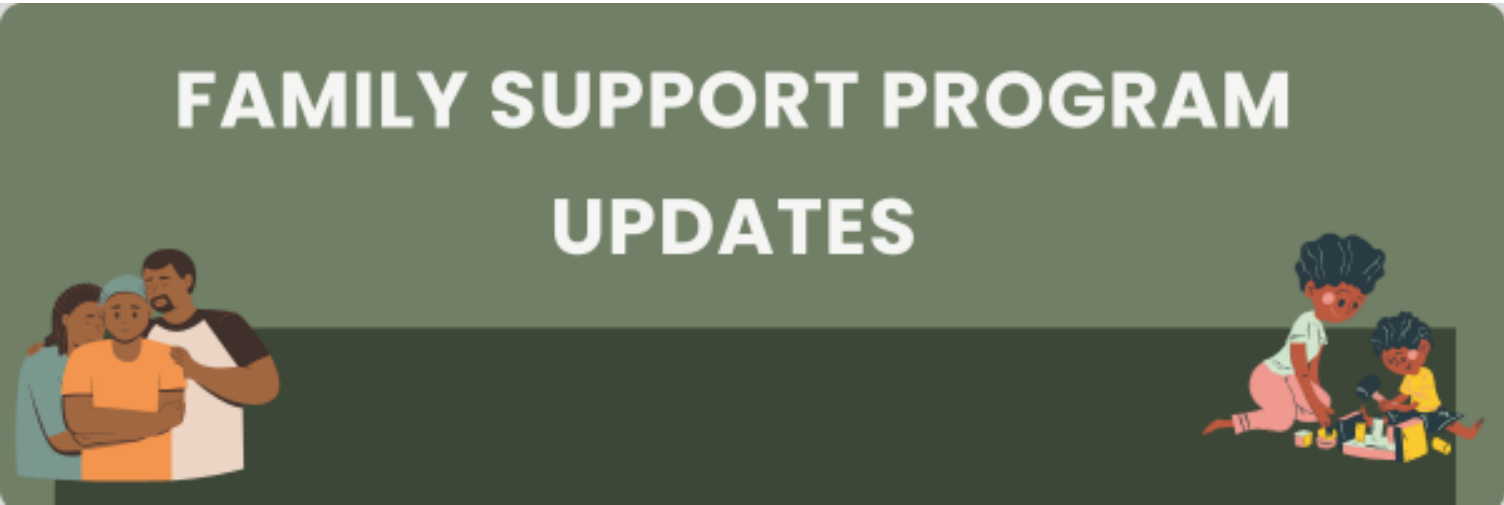
After launching our IVA program in Jacmel in April, our team got to work in Cap Rouge. On May 13th, we visited local markets to raise awareness about cervical cancer and announce our upcoming free screenings. On May 23rd, we screened 51 women—a strong step toward our goal of reaching 500 women in the Sud-Est department this year. We returned to Cap Rouge on May 30th to serve the women who were unable to attend the first session, and 16 of them came for their screenings. Huge thanks to Life Ansanm for welcoming our team and to the women of Cap Rouge for showing up for their health!

Emergency Simulation:

Earlier this month, our midwives and nurses completed an emergency simulation training focused on **abnormal intrapartum fetal heartbeat** and **neonatal resuscitation**. These hands-on exercises help ensure our team stays sharp and ready to respond when women and newborns need us most—because every second counts during a birth emergency.



Our Family Support Program (FSP) currently supports 18 families. One of the children recently transitioned out of the program and is now living with her father in another part of Haiti—we wish them both all the best! Despite the ongoing challenges in the country, the children in our program continue to feel supported and cared for. They are attending school regularly and enjoying time with friends. While some of our beneficiaries faced academic difficulties this term, we recognize the obstacles they're up against and will be organizing workshops to build their confidence and support their success in the final term.
