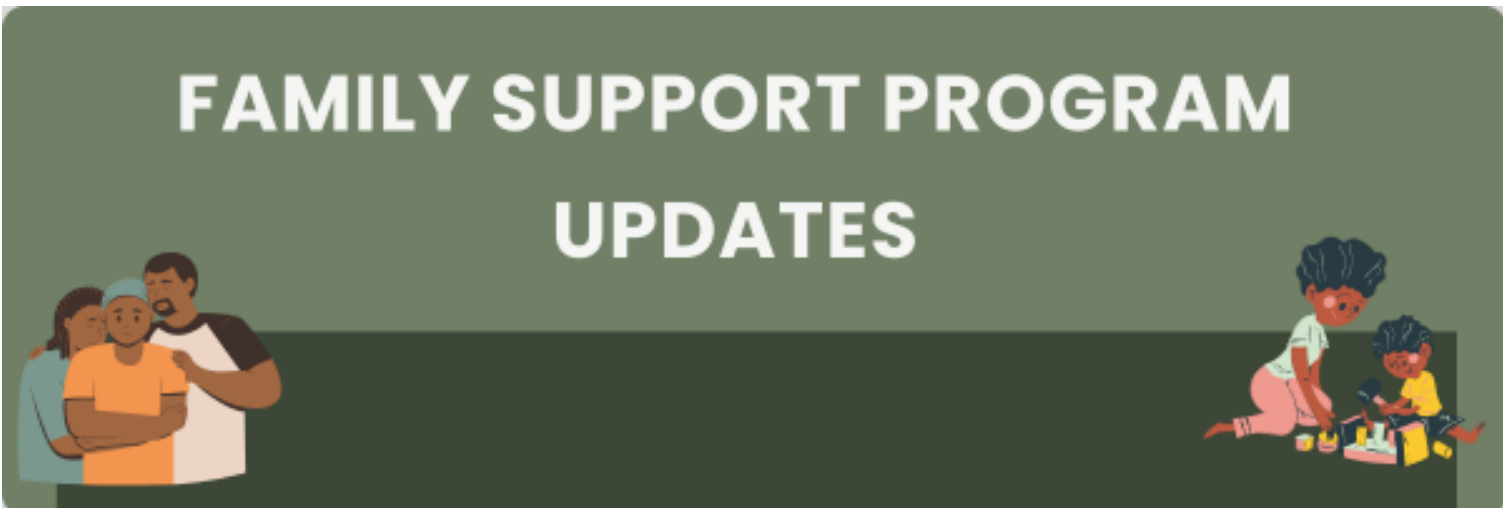

During a prenatal breastfeeding class on December 4, a schoolteacher preparing to welcome her third child shared encouragement and practical insight with other mothers, reflecting her commitment to supporting women in her community. Having discovered Kay Akouchman for this pregnancy after not knowing about us during her first two, she took part in our prenatal and exercise classes before welcoming a healthy baby girl on December 18. At her final postpartum visit on January 30, she expressed heartfelt gratitude for her experience and shared that she will continue recommending Kay Akouchman to families in her community.



Our Family Support Program (FSP) continues to support 14 families. Building on December's momentum, Catherine led a workshop for our older beneficiaries titled **“Dekouvri Sèvis Mwen”** — Discovering My Purpose. Using guided Venn diagrams, participants explored what they enjoy, the talents they hold, what the world needs, and how they might one day earn a living. The session encouraged self-reflection, confidence-building, and a clearer sense of how their skills can contribute to their community. As we look to expand this life-skills work and reach more young people, continued donor support will help us grow and deepen the program.
