

## MIDWIFERY CENTER UPDATES

**Birth & Patient Registration Update:**

- Babies born in September: 11
- Babies born in October: 9
- New patients: 12

Our midwifery team recently partnered with Profamil for cervical cancer screening training, allowing us to invite 69 former patients for screenings, with 12 referred for follow-up care.



On October 25th, we also hosted a breast cancer awareness and screening day, surpassing our goal by screening 110 women. We're grateful to our Haiti team and donors for making this essential work possible!

## FAMILY SUPPORT PROGRAM UPDATES

Our Family Support Program (FSP) currently assists 18 families with children from toddlers to young adults, helping prevent placement in institutions. We're supporting 3 university students, 4 high schoolers, 8 elementary students, and 3 kindergarteners, covering costs for education, healthcare, housing, and more. Our social worker, Mirlande, also secures resources for children with learning challenges to support their success. Stay tuned for stories in our upcoming newsletters—thank you for being part of this essential program!

## RECYCLING CENTER UPDATES

Our recycling program has been on hold for two years due to gang violence and road closures between Port-au-Prince and Jacmel. Despite this setback, we remain committed to creating income opportunities and are exploring alternative solutions. We welcome any ideas and appreciate your continued support.
