
At the clinic, **2025 brought both challenges and learning**, including continued insecurity

that made accessing supplies more difficult and a hurricane that tested our systems. After a drop in births in 2024, we closely examined how a more rigid upfront fee—while nominal and never a requirement for care—may have unintentionally discouraged some women from returning. In 2025, we adjusted this approach at **Kay Akouchman**, and birth numbers rebounded as a result. Removing this barrier means we now depend more heavily on donor support to meet the true cost of care. We closed the year by celebrating our team's hard work together and remain deeply grateful to our donors for sustaining this progress.

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We're pleased to share that **Olive Tree Projects** has joined the **Hope for Haiti** network as a Haiti healthcare partner, giving us access to their **Healthcare Gifts-in-Kind (GIK)** Program when equipment, supplies, and medications are available through their partners and donors. While this support is valuable, providing medications to our patients remains a significant and ongoing cost for Olive Tree Projects. As items become available, this partnership will help strengthen care at **Kay Akouchman**, and we're grateful for the collaboration as we continue serving families in Jacmel.


