

# A Letter from our Director of Children's Ministry:

We began examining our Children and Youth Ministry program two years ago (before the pandemic), engaging as many of you as we could in a process of identifying our current strengths and future opportunities, as we determine how to best minister to all of our children. One of the things that quickly became apparent was that while we had dozens of young children actively involved in our ministries, by the time we got to youth-age, we had suffered an attrition that left barely one dozen active on a regular basis. Something was happening in the middle years that we felt could be the beginning of this drop-off.

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Previously, we'd created our 4th-6th grade U2 program - a shortened name drawn from the idea that "God loves YOU TOO!" This was meant to serve as a transitional program for students who were too old to feel comfortable with the "little kids" in the children's ministry, but too young to be a part of the activities and curriculum taking place in the youth ministry. U2 was an occasional, fun and fellowship gathering that was a shared secondary responsibility of both the Director of Children and Director of Youth Ministry, who both had other priorities in their roles. While all agreed that this transitional program was important, it could never be a primary focus for either of those who were responsible for it. Might this be where we were beginning to see a drop off in engagement? And if so, what could we do to turn that around?

When Hannah Tonn joined us in the role of Youth Director, we began envisioning more purposefully what a dedicated U2 Ministry might look like. The "old" U2 program was for fun and fellowship only; there was no intentional emphasis on faith development, Christian education, or mission and service -things that children both younger and older were receiving consistently. As Hannah was working to settle into her new role, she also began to outline a specific plan for a U2 Ministry. A small task force made up of staff, teachers, and parents then joined together to flesh out these goals.

Today, we are excited to be inviting you to help kick-off this new U2 Ministry! One of the things we think held U2 back in the past was that it was nobody's primary responsibility. To that end, Hannah—who has great passion for both the love of Christ and the love of our children—has agreed to lead this new ministry, under the oversight of our Director of Children's Ministry, Cindy Hughes. With Hannah's energy, enthusiasm, and education, combined with Cindy's experience in teaching and with our church and children's programming in general, we think we have the opportunity to engage these 4th-6th graders in meaningful ways.

Going forward, U2 will include some familiar aspects, and some new opportunities! Several parents have shared their concerns that the full worship service, with the accompanying sermon and topics, is too much for this age group. To address this, U2 will begin meeting for Faith Development/Christian Education on Sunday mornings during the 11am worship service. When the little kids are released to Rainbows and Dewdrops, U2 kids are also invited to participate in their own education time, using the age-appropriate component of the same curriculum we're successfully using with the younger children. As is the case with Rainbows and Dewdrops, it's completely up to the family as to whether a U2 kid leaves or remains in worship - whatever you feel is best for your child. These Sunday curriculum changes will begin on January 9th.

Additionally, the first Sunday of each month will now be designated "Family Worship" at 11am, with all children remaining in the Sanctuary for the entire service to take part in the traditional liturgy and hymns, and to receive Communion. Including this practice will allow all our children to more fully participate in our congregation, and learn from a younger age what it means to worship in community.

Thursday evenings will also include discipleship and fellowship activities for the U2 kids, regularly scheduled every week to take place at the same time that M&Ms is going on for the little children. With plans for youth programming going on at the same time, it is our hope to make Thursday nights a "one-stop" for entire families! The full schedule of Thursday night activities can be found on page 5 of this newsletter, and is planned to begin on January 13th.



You may have noted that by moving Hannah into this dedicated U2 role, we have left our Youth Program uncovered. First, I would remind you that our two dedicated youth volunteers, Larry Anderson and John Cole, have been present throughout and will continue providing consistency with our Youth Ministry. We are also happy to announce the hiring of Ms. Alyssa Hodge as our new Director of Youth Ministry! Alyssa comes to us from Cleveland, and before that Elyria, where she has experience with children, youth, and family ministry at Good Shepherd United Methodist and Elyria First United Methodist Churches. Alyssa, a mom herself, is a student at Methodist Theological School in Ohio in Delaware, where she is working towards her MDiv. (Masters of Divinity) Degree, possibly with a specialization in Youth and Family Ministry. A team made up of SPRC members, our Youth Volunteers, staff, and youth parents interviewed Alyssa last week and were unanimous in their recommendation that we hire Alyssa to lead our youth. She is a warm, caring, dedicated and thoughtful servant of God whom I am sure you will all embrace. Alyssa will start with us on January 1, 2022. Ministry to our young people, from the Nursery all the way to collegeaged young adults is the most vital and everlasting ministry we do as a church. Everything we do at those ages will impact the future, not only of our congregation, but of the church at large. Especially after two years of pandemic-prolonged adjustments and delays, we are excited about the new direction we are finally able to go with this ministry. We invite you to join us in celebrating and supporting our entire ministry team, our volunteers, and most of all, our young people, as we strive to help them learn to Love God, Grow in Christ, and Live to Serve! Sitting to write this newsletter article has given me a "Groundhogs Day" moment. No, I didn't stick my head out the window and see my shadow, I'm talking about the Bill Murray movie of that name where he is a weatherman sent to cover the famous groundhog, Punxsutawney Phil, and gets stuck in a time loop of reliving the same day over and over again. As I sat to write I re-read my January newsletter article from last year and, honestly, I could have just copied and pasted it here and it would have been just as applicable and not outdated at all.

A year ago I talked about the changes that the pandemic had brought to how we were doing things, about how live-stream worship was so important to how we reached out to everyone, and how we would eventually come through this pandemic but that we would never be able to go back to the way things were before because the world would be a different place. All of that is still true, so in that sense, nothing has changed. Yet at the same time, everything has changed. We are not the same people we were on January 1, 2021, we're not the same church either. As John Wesley said, we are moving on toward perfection but we're not there yet. With God's help, however, we can get there!

Some of the things that are new and different are outlined in other places in this newsletter. Cindy Hughes' article about the new and exciting changes to our U2 ministry for our 4th-6th graders is a big part of that and we are excited about how that transition will benefit that group of kids. I am so thankful for Hannah Tonn's work in helping to make this transition possible and for her willingness to take on that ministry. With that change comes the addition of a new staff member, Alyssa Hodge, as our new Youth Director. You'll get to know her better soon, but she is a student at MTSO in Delaware working towards her MDiv. degree and has experience at two different UMC churches in Youth and Family Ministry. So please welcome Alyssa when you get the chance to meet her. It is our hope and expectation that these transitions will help us to strengthen your youth and children's ministry from top to bottom, and that along with our campus ministry led by Associate Pastor Lucy Kelly, we will continue to grow our ministry for young people into young adulthood.

Some things have been more challenging for us this year. I know we announced in December that we had hired a new Office Administrator, but I have to tell you we're back to square one on that. (Lesson learned: don't announce a hire until they actually show up for the first day of work!)

We have had other staff turnover this past year with Bev Pancoast's leaving Youth Ministry, April Smith's retirement from Facilities Management, and Amber Fullah leaving for full-time work with benefits, but that is in keeping with the trends in churches as well as in the private sector nationwide - people are looking for different things, people are stepping out of the work force, and the church is not exempt from that. Our SPRC is looking into how we might be able to address that in the new year, but your expressions of appreciation to our staff for their hard work and your generous love offering during the holidays goes a long way in helping them to know how much their efforts are appreciated as well.

And then as Lucy reported elsewhere in this newsletter, your generous support for the RIP Medical Debt Campaign, what we named *Project Jubilee*, was simply overwhelming. When Emily Knoth first approached us with this idea I thought it a good one, but honestly thought the goal of \$10,000 was ambitious for a year when the economy was mediocre at best, and when the pandemic was still touching all of us so directly. And when after the first week we reported only a couple of hundred dollars in donations I was adjusting my expectations downward, thinking we'll do well to hit \$3,000-\$4,000 this year. Little did I suspect that you would come on strong at the end and blow right through that \$10,000 goal even before we got to the last week of the campaign. As of the last Sunday in December we were at over \$11,000 with gifts still coming in. As I have to write this article before the campaign ends, I can't share a final number with you, but I can certainly report that you have once again amazed and humbled me with your generosity in supporting this outreach campaign on top of having just supported our 2022 stewardship campaign and everything else you have done all year.

So what does 2022 hold for us? Who knows! But I can tell you this much, even as I am officially getting out of the "prediction business" until this pandemic is truly behind us, I have faith that whatever we set our minds to as a church, as the body of Christ in this place at this time, we can do. All things are possible with Jesus Christ - we can do all things with God. Knowing that, and knowing you, I am confident that 2022 will be a good year for Church of the Master.

# Children's Ministry Newsletter—January 2022

#### Important update for Sundays: Rainbows, Dewdrops, and now U2!

Families are encouraged to worship together during the 9:00 a.m. service - we have activity bags to help your children stay engaged. Our Sunday morning children's church programs are offered during the 11:00 service, during which we also offer Nursery care.

About 10-15 minutes into the Worship service, children of any age are invited forward to participate with the Children's Message, then following this, 3-year-olds through 6<sup>th</sup> graders are invited to meet their teachers in the Gathering Space to transition to their classrooms (see below). Or, families may choose to have children remain in Worship — children's sounds, energy, and emotions are welcome as part of God's joyful noise!

<u>Beginning on February 6<sup>th</sup></u>, the first Sunday of each month will be "Family Worship," with all children remaining in the Sanctuary to participate with the traditional liturgy and hymns, and to receive Communion. (Nursery care will still be offered as an option during "Family Worship.")

Class	Ages/Grades	Bible Literacy Content		
Dewdrops	3 years* - Kindergarten	Children are introduced to the Bible, by being read to from a "storybook Bible" format, following the 3-year lectionary cycle.		
Rainbows	Grades 1-3	Children deepen their understanding of Biblical persons and content by repeating the 3-year lectionary, this time reading a "storybook Bible" for themselves, and occasionally a "children's translation" Bible with teacher guidance.		
U2 – beginning Sunday, 1/9!	Grades 4-6	Children begin to explore a more mature understanding of the 3-year lectionary content, by regularly engaging with a standard Bible (simplified translation), and with additional historical and social context.		

<sup>\*3-</sup>year-olds attending Dewdrops must be potty-trained, as we do not have diapering facilities in this classroom.

During this transitional year, we want to give flexibility to parents to make the best choice for their child regarding class placement. If your 3-year-old is more comfortable going to the Nursery instead of Dewdrops, if your 4<sup>th</sup> grader is better served by attending Rainbows, or if your 6<sup>th</sup> grader is ready to "graduate" from U2 and remain always in Worship, etc., we want to support you in these accommodations. Please chat with our Educational Ministry Team!

# Thursdays are for M&Ms (Music and the Master) Returning 1/13/22!

It has been such a blessing to be meeting in-person for M&Ms! Even though children 5-11 now have the opportunity to be vaccinated, Covid cases continue to climb; therefore, we are still *not offering dinner* when we resume January 13<sup>th</sup>. If you need to bring food for your family to eat in between activities, feel free to find a table or an open classroom to distance yourself safely from others while your masks are off.



We are excited to be offering an enhanced schedule of activities on Thursday evenings, now encompassing all of our young people from birth through high-school! We hope this makes it more convenient for your whole family to participate in meaningful faith and fellowship.
