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# A Letter from the Pastor: by Pastor Jay Anderson

Be Thou My vision,
O Lord of my heart;
naught be all else to me,
save that thou art.
Thou my best thought,
by day or by night,
waking or sleeping,
thy presence my light.

I spoke to you a little in my sermon on Pentecost Sunday about vision. The weekend before that I had the joy of spending the day with our Church Council, the leaders of our congregation, and talking a bit more extensively about vision and mission, about discipleship and outreach, and about structure. It was a great day in which we spent a good bit of time exploring WHY we do what it is we do, HOW we do it, and WHAT that looks like. I greatly appreciate how those leaders present fully engaged in our discussions and work for the day and brought their very best to the tables as we considered how we are called to be the church in a post-pandemic world.

As part of our time together we used a video by Simon Sinek, a business consultant whose work easily translates into the life of the church, as he discussed what he calls The Golden Circle, and the need to find our WHY. And while I can't, in this space, go into all that he talks about in this 18 minutes video, I encourage you to go to YouTube, search for "Simon Sinek The Golden Circle," and then watch the 18:34 version of the video that our leadership team viewed that day. In a nutshell, he proposes that people don't buy what you do, they buy why you do it, and so discovering your WHY is crucial to growth, in whatever form that takes.

And as I shared with our leaders, our WHY is pretty easy! As United Methodists our WHY, that is our Mission, is given to us by Jesus in the Great Commission, as adopted by the denomination:

Our Mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

In that mission statement then, the WHY is *for the transformation of the world.* That is WHY we do what we do, why we worship, why we serve, why we study - *to transform the world.* WHAT that mission statement calls us to do in order to transform the world, *is to make disciples.* We make disciples *in order to* transform the world. The missing piece, then, of Sinek's Gold Circle is the HOW. How do we make disciples? Or thought of another way, HOW do we see ourselves, living into this mission? The "HOW do we see ourselves doing this" piece, "HOW we see ourselves living into or fulfilling our mission" is our Vision. And what does that look like?

Be thou my wisdom, and thou my true word; I ever with thee and thous with me, Lord; thou and thou only, first in my heart, great God of heaven, my treasure thou art. I proposed a vision to our Leadership Team that begins to address that idea, that vision. In order to "make disciples," we must first "be disciples," yet we have no clear discipleship process in place. A discipleship process is a system or process through which one learns about the faith, learns about how to intentionally practice the faith, and how to live into the model that Jesus taught his first disciples. So among many other things, it might include learning how to pray, it might include learning about spiritual disciplines, it might include bible and book studies that help us learn and grow in our faith. Yes, we have the occasional study here and there, and we have a couple of Sunday School classes, but far and away the overwhelming majority of our congregation are not currently engaged in any kind of intentional faith formation or intentional discipleship process, because we do not have one. We can't make disciples for the transformation of the world if we don't first become disciples. As they say in leadership training circles, "you can't lead someone to a place you're not going!"

So I proposed, and the Council approved, moving forward with a structure for an intentional discipleship process that we are beginning to put together now and will hopefully be able to present to you beginning this fall.

That said, it doesn't matter how good our discipleship system is if people are too busy attending meetings all the time and don't have the time to participate. Like most United Methodist Churches we have way too many meetings going on, and while some meetings are important in planning for ministry, most meetings are often mistaken FOR ministry. And nobody likes sitting in meetings anyway! The denomination, in their infinite wisdom, wrote into our Book of Discipline many years ago, an alternative way of organizing that enables the same important work to be done but with fewer meetings. And what it hopes to identify and improve upon is that old 80/20 rule that says 80% of the work is done by 20% of the people. And while I don't know that those percentages would hold true in our congregation, the concept certainly does. When you go to any of the major administrative meetings in the life of the church, you see the same people, week after week, meeting after meeting. If we could reorganize in such a way that would free up multiple hours for people to do things like serve in a mission or outreach, or, to participate in a class or study, that will help them grow in their discipleship. And making disciples for the transformation of the world is what we are called to do. So at our gathering time, the Council also approved moving forward with a process to explore what an alternative organizational structure might look like for us as we seek to live into our mission going forward. We will keep you in the loop as we move forward on this front as well.

"Where there is no vision the people will perish." Proverbs 29:18

The church in a post-pandemic world WILL be a different place, it's not a matter of IF, it's a matter of HOW and HOW MUCH. We have a talented leadership team and staff here at Church of the Master who welcome the challenges of embracing whatever new vision God has for us as we move forward. I ask for your prayer for our leaders as they prayerfully seek to discern the HOW that God is calling us toward in order to live into our WHY.


Day Camp Set-Up Help Needed – Sunday, June 20th!

# **Music Ministry News**by Christopher Bowling

Commitment is a common thread among all musician, professional and amateur. We are committed to learning our instrument, committed to practicing our instrument, and committed to sharing our instrument, usually in some form of ensemble. Hours of lessons, practice and rehearsals all make us better at what we do. It is also the commitments of our day to day life that discourages many people from be a part of a musical group. We may enjoy singing or playing an instrument but the thought of a long-term commitment for rehearsals is enough of a reason to discourage us from joining a group.

I have always considered the doors of our music ministry open, to allow singers and musicians to participate in the music ministry as their individual lives allowed them. Though that may not have always been communicated clearly. It is with an eye toward the future of our music ministry that I have been prayerfully discerning a new way of doing things. Pastor Jay proposed the idea of choir "sessions" as opposed to a season long commitment to the Chancel Choir. This would be for those who would like to sing but the length of the overall choir season discourages their participation.

Each session would be 7-9 weeks and end with a musical service. The first session will begin with the regular choir season on September 8<sup>th</sup> and will end on October 31<sup>st</sup> with *A Festival of Hymns*. *A Festival of Hymns* is a musical worship experience where we will celebrate traditional hymns of the faith and the hymn writers who brought them to life. Session two will overlap the end of the first session by a couple weeks and will focus towards a Christmas presentation of the first section of Handel's *Messiah*. Sessions three and four will take us to Easter and then on to another musical celebration just before summer. Again, while we are anchoring these sessions with musical worship experiences, our primary focus will be leading the music of the 11 a.m. worship service. I also want to offer another option for participation with the choir, and that is just participating in the major musical services throughout the year. In past ministries, I have always had singers who just wanted to join us for a cantata or masterwork, and I have always welcomed their participation with a modified rehearsal schedule that lead up to each musical worship service.

This is just the first of new ways of doing music ministry that I am prayerfully exploring. In the fall I am hoping to bring back the youth praise team, as well as, exploring ways to grow our present praise ensemble. I am also hoping to bring back the chamber ensemble that played from time to time during our video worship services.

But before the fall, I am looking for drummers, specifically hand drummers. Our upcoming July worship series has a drum circle as a part of weekly worship. So, I am looking for drummers to join us each week and drum during worship. You do not have to have your own equipment, but if you do, you are welcome to bring it with you. We will meet a few times in June, at everyone's convenience, to rehearse before opening worship in July.

#### Soul Reset book study:

Soul Reset: Breakdown, Breakthrough, and the Journey to Wholeness is a 6-week study for everyone who moves at breakneck speed through their daily lives, often relying only on their own strength to bring God's kingdom on earth. Jesus shows us a different way, an easier, unforced rhythm of what kingdom work looks like. It's a balance of work, rest, play, worship, exercise, and eating well—spiritual practices that keep our souls hydrated and healthy as we do the work of the church in the world.

<u>Soul Reset</u> is a call for the church and all of Jesus' disciples to reset and reorder their lives around spiritual practices, to learn to walk through our difficult seasons with our souls connected to the source of Living Water so that we don't burn out or break down. And if we do burn out or break down, we learn to lift one another up and point one another back to Jesus.

The book was written by the late Junius Dotson, General Secretary of Discipleship Ministries, out of his own personal journey. This will be a Zoom study and will be held on Wednesdays from 7-8:30 PM beginning June 23rd and ending about August 4th. Leaders for the study are Harry and Ann Peat. The cost of the book is \$10.
