One of the many blessings that we all experience at Church of the Master is the outstanding music ministry. Starting with our M&Ms children's program which introduces our children to the joys of singing and music, all the way up to our Chancel Choir, music is a vital part of ministry and life here at Church of the Master. I have always been a part of the music ministry at every church I've ever been involved in, all the way back to childhood, so I've seen and been part of a lot of music programs in my 62+ years, and this is one of the best. On May 8th we'll hear from all (or nearly all) of our various musical groups, sharing their gifts and their songs, in a wonderful worshipful experience. 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Children's Ministry Newsletter May 2022

Sundays: Rainbows, Dewdrops, and U2!

Families are encouraged to worship together during the 9:00 a.m. service - we have activity bags to help your children stay engaged.

Our Sunday morning children's church programs are offered at the 11:00 service, during which we also offer Nursery care. After the Children's Message, 3-year-olds through 6th graders are invited to meet their teachers in the Gathering Space to transition to their classrooms (see below). Or, families may choose to have children remain in Worship – children's sounds, energy, and emotions are welcome as part of God's joyful noise!

The first Sunday of each month is "Family Worship," with all children remaining in the Sanctuary to participate with the traditional liturgy and hymns, and to receive Communion. Including this practice regularly will allow our children to more fully participate in our congregation, and learn from an earlier age what it means to worship in Christian community! (Nursery care will still be offered as an option during "Family Worship.")

Rainbows	Grades 1-3	Children deepen their understanding of Biblical persons and content by repeating the 3-year lectionary, this time reading a "storybook Bible" for themselves, and occasionally a "children's translation" Bible with teacher guidance.				
U2	Grades 4-6	Children begin to explore a more mature understanding of the 3-year lectionary content, by regularly engaging with a standard Bible (CEB), and with additional historical and social context.

Mission Spotlight

This is the second in a series spotlighting the various local and global ministries our congregation at Church of the Master supports to make a difference in people's lives.

The Charitable Pharmacy of Central Ohio began as a joint project of the West Ohio Conference of the United Methodist Church. Its purpose is to provide affordable pharmacy services along with coordinat-



ing access to health care for people living at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level. The pharmacy is located at the Livingston United Methodist Church on Parsons Avenue. Due to the generous support of the central Ohio community, they have been able to expand to a second location in the North Linden Area. The North Linden location also has a fresh market and training to provide clients with nutritional food.

The following is a quote from a letter I received from the Charitable Pharmacy I would like to share:

"One patient in particular stays with me. He came to the pharmacy for the first time after he lost his apartment and health insurance. We qualified him for 12 months of service, prepared his prescription medications, and took them out to his car. While there, our advanced pharmacy student informed him that she wanted to set up his next appointment to pick up his refills. He looked at her in disbelief and said "You mean I get to keep coming back?" and began to weep. Your support and advocacy provided him with hi medications and support at a time when he needed them the most."

"When Kids Come Out" – A Four-Session Class for Parents of LGBTQ Children offered this time on Zoom

When a child comes out to his/her/their family, it often raises many questions for both the child and for the family. For example:

What does it mean for the family when a child comes out to his/her/their parents?

What does it mean for the parents' relationship to their church?

What does it mean for the parents' own faith?

How do parents navigate their own "coming out" after their children have come out to them?

What does the delay in the General Conference mean for me and my family and our church?

The sessions are designed to provide a safe space where questions and concerns can be dealt with openly and honestly.

These questions are among those that will be addressed in the series of four classes that will be held on Wednesday evenings: April 20, 27, May 4, 11, 2022.

This session of the class will be held on Zoom this spring. The meetings will begin at 7:00 pm and conclude by 8:30 pm.
