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A Letter from the Pastor:

This month as I sit to write this article I can't help but be reminded of where we were a year ago. For one thing, the coronavirus hadn't raised its ugly head and life seemed "normal," at least in part. Lynn and I had just returned from a wonderful vacation in Sedona, Arizona and were getting back into the swing of things when our son-in-law took his life on October 9th. I was scheduled to have lunch with John Comerford, the President of Otterbein that day and as things developed with our son-in-law I had to cancel. The rest of the day was a mix of shock, horror and tears as our family gathered to begin a grieving process that honestly, continues to today. Next week will mark the first anniversary of that horrific day and we are no closer to understanding the "why" of it than we were then.

I don't bring this up to wallow in grief or to elicit on-going sympathy, I bring it up to remind me of how much I have to be thankful for. We're thankful that our daughter and grandson were not physically harmed or worse in the whole sordid event. We're thankful, oh so very thankful, for all the love and support that all of you offered to us in that most difficult time. It has probably never been more important or impactful for us to have a church home and a church family than it was in those days and in the months and now year

that has passed. Our sense of your love and the grace with which you surrounded us extends beyond our ability to express it in words. But we want you to know that your love touched us so deeply that it can never leave us.

As we are wrapping up our current worship series, "New Places for New People," I can't help but wonder how people who don't have a church family like ours in their lives get through difficult times such as these. So many people today are so isolated, so lost and alone in a world that seems to care about productivity more than people, about profit more than peace, and about competitiveness more than compassion. I know that our family is not the only ones who have been on the receiving end of your caring compassion, I've seen it extend to so many others of you who have suffered loss of one kind or another since I've been your pastor. This is who you are, this is how you are. I know there are other people out there who need that kind of caring compassion as well, people who don't know the love that God channels through your efforts. We seek to create new places for new people in order to be the love of God in a world that so desperately needs to know that love.

As we go through the remainder of this year, transitioning from video worship to in-person live-streamed worship, moving from exclusively Zoom-based meetings to more safely-distanced in-person meetings, I hope and pray that you will move forward with your eyes wide open to the potential new ways we can be Christ to our community. I pray that those whom you know and love, but who don't know the love of Christ, especially as experienced through a loving church family, will know that love through you. My wish for them is to experience that love through your invitation and initiative, and feel it most directly in this place, with you people, who are, in the image of God and likeness of Christ, most caring and compassionate.

RETURN TO CHURCH GUIDELINES



ACCESS TO THE SANCTUARY

When we return, please use the eastern most doors on Main Street closest to the parking lot. For those who cannot negotiate the stairs the handicapped entrance

on the south side of the building will be available. If you come in from the south side entrance, sit on that side of the sanctuary. Entrance into the sanctuary will be through the center doors only. We would ask that if a member of your family needs to use the handicapped entrance that all members of the family use this entrance so as to stay together. This will minimize congestion in the Gathering Space and allow for the ushers to more easily seat your family together.

RESERVATIONS



We will have a limited number of seats available, so for a time, we will use a reservation system. Making a reservation in advance will ensure that we have a seat for you in worship. More information about how to make reservations is coming soon.

WORSHIP TIMES



We will return to a live worship service October 25th at 10:00 a.m. Doors will open for seating at 9:40 a.m. It is our hope sometime in the future to have two services.

WELLNESS



Anyone who is sick, coughing, has a sore throat, or a fever is

asked to remain home. We're committed to continuing to provide worship online, so anyone who needs to remain at home whether due to illness, being in a vulnerable group, or other reasons can still join us in worship.

As we enter the building, we will use notouch thermometers to take everyone's temperatures. Anyone with a temperature of 100.4 or higher will need to return home where you can worship with us online.

Everyone over the age of 3 will be required to wear a mask. If you forgot your mask, we'll provide one to you. If you're unable to wear a mask, we ask that you continue to worship with us from home until masks are no longer needed.

Everyone who enters the building must sanitize their hands with provided hand sanitizer, unless a health condition prevents it.

At this time, coffee service will not be available. Please feel free to bring your own drinks, we just ask that your containers have lids to minimize spills and that you dispose of any empty cups or bottles on your way out of the sanctuary or take them home for disposal.

Please limit use of the restrooms to emergencies only and limit occupancy to one person (and a parent or aide) at a time if at all possible. A changing table will be available in the Nursery room.



WORSHIP

Our services will be designed to be as touchless as possible by holding doors open, eliminating paper bulletins and hymnals, individually packaged

communion elements, and using offering collection boxes after worship instead of passing the plate. So that we can continue to connect to the Holy Spirit through music and liturgy, there will be limited singing and responses done at a quiet level or you can express your love of God by humming, clapping, dancing, raising our hands, etc. instead of singing.



CHILDREN

Children's Sunday School, Rainbows, Dewdrops and nursery care is not currently available. Children are encouraged and welcome to worship with their families. Parents-- know your little ones are loved by

their church family! We are excited to hear their voices and rustlings while we worship together. We know there will be challenges for you as we navigate this season together and we are committed to showing grace in all circumstances. Children's Ministry programming will continue through our weekly M&Ms (Music and the Master) program. To be added to the M&Ms e-mail list, contact Erin Flory (children@chmaster.org).

THANK YOU!

We thank you all for working with us to take care of each other. You may not be in a vulnerable group or concerned about catching the virus, but these measures will help us to protect those who are. These guidelines will only work if we all do our part to keep each other safe.



SAFE DISTANCING

Individuals or families should maintain safe distancing in the sanctuary and Gathering Space. Please wait to be seated by the ushers, who will place those who are living in the same household in seats together, and maintain 6 feet of distance between those who are not living together.

Please allow our ushers to seat you, move chairs or rearrange seating.

We are all looking forward to seeing each other again and will naturally want to give each other hugs or handshakes; but during this season we will greet each other with smiles and waves that maintain 6 feet of safe distancing.

When leaving worship please wait to be directed by the ushers and use the specific exits they guide us to, so we can avoid creating bottlenecks and maintain safe distancing.

Thank you for putting the safety of our Church of the Master family members first! These guidelines serve as a roadmap for reopening the building based on currently available information. Nothing in these guidelines are to be considered absolute as the current COVID-19 situation is fluid and evolving. A potential detour is the return to a second closure if the Franklin County COVID-19 situation would worsen.

Report on the 2020 West Ohio Annual Conference

Greetings to fellow members and friends of Church of the Master. For the past five years, I have had the honor and privilege to serve as your representative as a Member of the West Ohio Annual Conference. As a quick refresher we are part of the Capital Area North District (one of eight Districts in West Ohio). Each clergy and an equal number of lay members usually meet at Lakeside, Ohio, up near Marblehead, the first week in June. We gather to worship, receive reports, pass a budget, vote on a slate of officers, etc. We celebrate clergy retirements and witness the Bishop ordain new clergy members. Usually, the last agenda item is hearing the Bishop "Fix" appointments as he annonces who is moving and to where. We greet former Pastors and catch up with friends that we may not have seen since last year and enjoy Lakeside and Lake Eire. Then came March of 2020 and COVID-19! As we began to live into the reality of Social Distancing and Zoom, the West Ohio Conference staff scrambled to plan for a meaningful Annual Conference with about 2000 attendees via computers! What does virtual conference mean? We will certainly need training. How will we vote? What if some members don't have internet? What about the conference offering? How can we learn about the legislation that we have to vote on? What if we have questions about the legislation?

So, I began to receive emails about training sessions for on line procedures, information sessions about the upcoming legislation issues, I even received a specific voting number! I attended, via Zoom Webinar, a training session on what to expect Annual Conference to look like, how to vote, how to ask a question (I. Type your request into the Q & A Box: ask a question, make a motion, etc. Wait for the Bishop to recognize you, press the Raised Hand icon so the techs can find you, unmute your mic [the tech can't do it for privacy issues] then you can speak). We then practiced voting via our cell phones.

The Virtual Annual Conference began on Saturday, September 12 at 9:00 AM with Bishop Palmer broadcasting from the sanctuary of Church of the Messiah and Ann & I setting at our kitchen table! He, the broadcast crew, some of the conference staff and several musicians, were masked except when they were presenting or performing. Reports were given remotely by the various committee chairs, votes were taken and the necessary business was conducted. Oh, and the appointments were fixed. Pastor Jay was reaffirmed as our Pastor for 2020-2021! The Bishop preached twice and adjourned us at 1:30 PM.

Just as a side note, we accomplished all of the necessary business in 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours instead of 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ days! This will undoubtably come up in several budget meetings before next June! To say that this year's Annual Conference was slightly different is an under statement!

Also of note was that because the scheduled General Conference (scheduled every four years with world wide representatives) didn't' t meet because of COVID-19 and was rescheduled for September of 2021, controversial type legislation from West Ohio Annual Conference to the General Conference was absent from this year's agenda.

Using Zoom Webinar does seem to limit heated debate, lobbying and picketing over issues but I did miss the fellowship. Once again, thank you for the privilege and honor of representing you.

October Message from the Health Cabinet

"When I was a boy and I would see scary things in the news, my mother would say to me, "Look for the helpers. You will always find people who are helping." — **Fred Rogers**

Since the beginning of this pandemic we have all found ourselves pushed and stretched in new and sometimes uncomfortable ways. Things have especially changed for us in our roles as caregivers as we parent, care for family members and friends and in our caregiver work life. We became busier and more stressed as schools and community programs closed and as the world around us shut down. Now, as programs and schools are starting to open back up it is important to acknowledge how hard you've worked caring for loved ones and community members over the past 6 months. And now, as things continue to shift and change it is important to remember to also care for yourself as a caregiver. After all, Proverbs tells us that "a cheerful heart is good medicine" and that "a heart at peace gives life to the body", both God's way of telling us to care for ourselves so that we can care for others.

To get you started, below is a list of ideas of how to care for YOU- a caregiver, helper and unsung hero in the pandemic.

- **Be Compassionate... to yourself!** -Caregiving is hard and there is no such thing as a perfect caregiver. Be as compassionate and kind to yourself as you are to others. Remember that God does not call us to be perfect but rather to "love your neighbor as yourself." (Mark 12:31) So remember to give yourself some grace too!
- **Exercise** Even a quick five-minute walk outside in the morning, during your lunch break or after dinner can help clear your head and help ease some stress. Exercise has been proven to have a positive impact on mood and cognition! "Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your bodies." (1 Corinthians 6:19-20)
- Eat a healthy diet- While it is easy to turn to comfort food in times of stress, remember to include healthy foods in your diet. Eating a healthy balanced diet can have a positive impact on mood, sleep and your physical health! "So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God." (1 Corinthians 10:31)
- **Sleep-** Especially as a caregiver for young children/infants, getting good quality sleep can be hard. Try to prioritize sleep as much as you are able. If you are having a hard time falling asleep, try taking deep belly breaths and listing the things you are grateful for. "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14:27)
- Connect!- Take time to spend with or talk with loved ones and friends. This pandemic has isolated many of us, so take the time to reach out to a loved one or friend. Even if it isn't a long interaction it can help brighten up both of your days! "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way, you will fulfill the law of Christ." (Galations 6:2)
- Create! Studies have shown that being creative can help increase resiliency skills. One thought behind this is that creative processes can help us view problems or situations in different light. Different creative outlets include music, crafting, journaling, hobbies, science experiments with kids and more! "For the gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable." (Romans 11:29)
- Ask for help This is a hard one for a lot of us, but if you find yourself struggling or overwhelmed, reach out to friends, family members or community organizations like Church of the Master. "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you." (John 15:16)

Roofing & Gutters Project

The roofing and gutter project is almost complete! Work has progressed as expected with only a few minor weather setbacks. This has been a rather complex job in that there was reconstruction of the box gutters followed by relining with the same rubber membrane that is applied to the flat roof on the building. This all involved the crew working from atop a mechanical lift.

The replacement of the shingles could not be started until the majority of the box gutter reconstruction was complete. There are four sections of roof that are shingled and this process included tearing off the two layers of old shingles as well as the underlay materials. We did find a hole in one section that required new lumber. Equipment used for this repair was a crane to lift the new packages of shingles to the roof and load up the old materials. A dump truck was on site to collect the debris.

The crew usually started by 7:00am and worked until 4:00pm or later. Keep in mind we were not their only customers so they were running between other job sites at times. If there is a blessing to come out of this time of pandemic, it is that we were able to have this important work done with very little inconvenience to the congregation and community. For that we are most thankful!
