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A Letter from the Pastor: by Pastor Jay Anderson

One of the things I have most enjoyed about the worship series, “Sacred Earth, Sacred Work” that we’ve been doing in July and heading into August is the emotions I see on your faces in the congregation: joy as we have enjoyed drum circles and singing and chanting parts of our worship, deep thoughtfulness as we join together in clenching and then opening fists (and hearts) during our time of prayer, happiness and familiarity in singing songs in worship that we don’t normally think of as either spiritual or worshipful. One of the things I most appreciate about Creation Spirituality is how we are invited to see and experience God “outside the box” of what we in the church have oftentimes come to believe is “normal” or “right” worship practices. Just because we’ve never done something a certain way before doesn’t mean God can’t be experienced in the doing, since God is present in all things, at all times, at all places. Thanks be to God!

As we move forward from this series we’ll be moving toward a focus on our own intentional faith formation. We’ll be doing that in two ways. One, in September we’ll be kicking off our new Discipleship Program, which is a series of educational or faith formation classes for adults to help each of us move further along the Way of Jesus. We’ll have more information about this for you in August, but that is but one part of what we’ll be doing.

The second part is the direction we’re going in worship for the fall. Worship, as well, is going to be discipleship focused as we continue some of the themes we’ve explored through Creation Spirituality and dig a little deeper into the biblical story, starting in Genesis. For many folks, the Bible is, at best, difficult to read and even more difficult to understand. Using as a guide the book *We Make the Road by Walking*, by Brian McLaren, we will join together in a quest for spiritual formation, reorientation, and faith activation, by looking at some of the familiar stories of Bible (Adam and Eve, Cain and Abel, the Tower of Babel, Abraham and Sarah, Moses, etc.) through a broader lens of how we can make the lessons found there applicable in our lives. I’m excited about the opportunity to bring this approach to discipleship into a worship experience and I hope you’ll be as engaged with this as you have been with “Sacred Earth, Sacred Work.”



Also in August we’ll say goodbye to a couple of dear friends. As you know, Erin Flory, our Director of Children’s Ministry for the last two plus years is leaving that position to answer God’s call in her life to return to the classroom. Erin’s last Sunday with us will be August 29th. Emily Knoth, our ministry intern from Princeton Theological Seminary will be leaving us on August 19th before heading to New Jersey this fall to begin her second year of seminary training. Emily will be bringing the message on her final Sunday, August 15th. So we will have opportunity to thank and celebrate both of them during August as well.

And then there’s Covid. At this writing the CDC is considering a recommendation that even vaccinated people mask indoors “in certain conditions.” We’ll explore whether that recommendation will impact our worship services when we can see what case numbers look like locally. We’ll keep you informed. We want everyone to feel welcome to come back to in-person worship, and if that means you would feel more comfortable wearing a mask then, by all means, wear a mask. There is no judgment, only love. It is SO good to have so many people back in in-person worship with us, but we want everyone to feel safe in being here and we’ll support that in any way we can.

A couple of side notes: I appreciate all of you who made an extra effort this past week to complete connection cards. After worship one kind soul pointed out to me that it would be easier if there were pens in the pews. Dug! We hadn’t yet replaced pens in the pews! You’ll find them there beginning this week, along with offering envelopes and prayer cards. And lastly, just a prayer that you all will take care of yourselves and your loved ones. Pastoral care needs have skyrocketed in the last several weeks due to illness, injury, family stresses, and other things (perhaps Covid stress and burnout as well). And don’t get me wrong, I’m not saying this because Lucy and I can’t handle it—I say it out of concern for you and your physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual health. The spiritual practices we talked about a couple months ago in worship, the intentionality of our prayer time in worship right now, are all geared towards helping us to deal with these types of things in healthier, more holistic ways, inviting God into the situation as a source of healing and wholeness, I urge you, if you are not already doing so, to make that time in your day to open your whole self to God and to invite God’s peace and presence into the midst of even the most difficult of situations.

Associate Pastor News:

I have had the pleasure of serving in ministry at Church of the Master in a variety of roles. My husband, Brian, likes to remind me that there is always room for ice cream, it just fills in the holes. So, Brian and I jokingly called me the "ice cream" of the church: I would fill all of the holes. Now that I am serving as your Associate Pastor, I thought you might like to know my specific roles. I have been, and will continue to serve in three major areas of ministry: pastoral care, campus ministry, and technology. Pastoral care is the strongest part of my ministry calling and I am delighted to serve in this way. I enjoy visiting/calling parishioners, connecting people, and supporting our staff. The staff have graciously allowed me to lead fun games and activities in staff meetings, and we have all been asking "get to know you" questions each week. With April's help, we created a prayer room upstairs (overlooking the gathering space) with a changeable altar, where anyone can quietly gather for prayer. I have hosted centering prayer for the staff, which begins with lighting a candle on the altar and sharing a reading, then a time to simply sit in silence and listen to God. Campus Ministry is growing and changing, which is exciting! I am hopeful that we will be able to connect with students through zoom and in-person gatherings for discipleship development and fellowship. I want to continue to help CoM strengthen their relationship with Otterbein and keep our young adult church family connected. Finally, as we have all experienced in the past year, technology continues to connect us to each other and to the world. I enjoy learning new technology and will continue to work closely with our staff to develop new and meaningful ways to utilize technology in ministry. My (usual) Sabbath day is on Thursdays. My office is open and all are welcome!

Campus Ministry News:

The Campus Task Force (CMFT) met this week to discuss plans for this school year. Aaron Shear has joined our team! We discussed things we will be able to do and things we cannot do (due to Covid). We will not be serving spaghetti dinner this fall, but are hopeful about serving in the spring (pending guidelines during the pandemic). We will discontinue midnight pancakes (partially due to Otterbein offering the same meal for students on the same weekend each semester and partially due to other reasons). We will begin the semester with our Monday Morning Coffee Ministry; starting August 23rd (the first day of classes). Emily Knoth and Pastor Lucy will be leading a study on Paul with the undergraduate and graduate students that previously gathered on zoom last spring. These young adults were eager to read through and learn from Adam Hamilton's book, Making Sense of the Bible, and are excited to begin a new study. We will restart Puppies and Prayers, which is an animal-therapy ministry that our college students really enjoy. The CMFT is learning about Dinner Church, a ministry started by Fresh Expressions, to begin planning a new ministry of serving students a free meal and offering a short worship service and small group discussion time. We are excited about this new possibility and will spend this fall and winter making plans and gathering volunteers for this ministry. CoM continues our strong connection with Promise House and the Center for Student Engagement, with the hope of being able to host Fall Plunge this year. Fall Plunge is a tradition at Otterbein that offers first-year students the opportunity to connect with non-profits around the community in order to serve and strengthen relationships with Otterbein and the community. As students get back on campus and into their routines, look for new episodes of our pod-cast "Building Bridges." We look forward to hosting events safely this year and reconnecting with students, both Otterbein students and all of our young adults from Church of the Master who are back to their institutions of higher learning this fall. Additionally, Rev. Judy-Guion Utsler, Otterbein's Chaplain, has begun gathering various faith leaders throughout the Westerville community to form a Chaplain Affiliates program. We will meet monthly to discuss how we can serve the students and help them grow in their faith. This program will also allow leaders better access on campus to connect with students and access to occasionally dine with students on campus.

1 hand held pencil sharpener


1 large eraser - (2 inches at least)

Health Cabinet Huddle

At this point you've heard or read that Church of the Master is walking to Nicaragua this summer in honor of El Porvenir. Have you gotten to the point of asking, "Are they there yet?" The answer is ALMOST! We are making great progress on our walk to Nicaragua and are getting close! As of today, we have collectively walked 2,627 miles and are 82% of the way there! We have now made it from the Gulf Coast of Mexico to the Pacific side of Mexico down to Puentes Margaritas, Mexico! (We are approximately where the red dot on the map is.)

In happy news, El Porvenir was able to reach their recent fundraising goals in partnership with One Day's Wages. Church of the Master's Missions and Outreach committee contributed to this by sending \$3000! One Day's Wages matched El Porvenir's donations of \$43,590 for a total of \$87,705 to go specifically towards the planned projects in Posoli. Funds will be used for building latrines and water systems as well as restoring their watershed. When the Posoli project wraps up, 65 homes will have water piped directly to their homes, 35 families will have latrines, and 20 families will have vented cookstoves (meaning less wood burned and less dangerous smoke in their homes). For some folks, church service can be overstimulating- too loud, too much to focus on, too overwhelming. For others, church service can be under-stimulating—our eyes wander, we find ourselves wishing we had something to fidget with, or maybe doodle on. So the S.A.L will help solve these issues.

The S.A.L will be open for anyone to use, whether you're 1 or 100. Whether service is too loud or whether you need some extra sensory input to get through it. You'll just walk over, grab what you need before the service, and drop it into the "used" bin when service is over. By the time the next Sunday rolls around, everything will be sanitized and ready to use again.
