

A Letter from Pastor Jay By Rev. Jay Anderson

As I write this letter we are about to celebrate Thanksgiving and are putting together the final touches on worship for the First Sunday in Advent, which will have passed as you read this. Life goes on, the wheels keep turning, change comes... these are among the words, the ideas, (the cliches?) that often come to mind as we approach the end of the year, whether that's the liturgical year or the calendar year.

We spent a lot of time this summer exploring what was going on in the life of the United Methodist Church around issues of the Bible and sexuality, and how that was playing out with disaffiliations in the denomination. To that end, I want to use this space this month to keep you up to date on what is going on within the denomination around these issues. This past week your clergy and Lay Members to Annual Conference met in a special called session of the West Ohio Annual Conference, in order to deal with issues of disaffiliation from the denomination by both clergy and congregations. Clergy seeking to disaffiliate were handled in a Clergy Session held prior to the broader Annual Conference session. I am not going to list here the names of those clergy who have chosen to leave the denomination, but rest assured that that number did not include any current or former Church of the Master clergy persons. Disaffiliation for clergy is a two-step process: first they must "retire" from the denomination. That allows them to keep accrued pension benefits as a retiree. Next...

if they plan on moving to the Global Methodist Church, they must then "withdraw" their membership from the denomination, as United Methodist clergy cannot hold membership in two denominations at the same time. Those who are retiring are doing so as of December 31, 2022. Those who are moving to the GMC, or any other denomination for that matter, have "withdrawal" dates of January 1, 2023. Since the GMC has stated they will only accept transfers of clergy who have a church in which to serve, for those clergy who intend to leave but do not have a church to serve in the new denomination as of yet, a withdrawal date has not been set.

For congregations who have voted to disaffiliate, assuming they pay their outstanding apportionments and pension obligations for this year and last year, their disaffiliation date is also December 31, 2022. For a congregation to disaffiliate requires going through an extensive education and discernment process, followed by a $\frac{2}{3}$ vote of the membership at a called church conference. So far this year, 80 churches (out of 960, approximately 8%) within the West Ohio Annual Conference have voted to leave the denomination. Four other churches held votes but failed to get the required $\frac{2}{3}$ margin. In one case, the vote was actually $\frac{2}{3}$ in favor of remaining in the UMC! Assuming those churches meet those financial obligations, they will leave the denomination at the end of the year. I have included a list of disaffiliating churches at the end of this article for your information.

For those churches and clergy who have chosen to leave our beloved UMC we wish them the best and send them off with our prayers. For those of us who remain, however, our work of sharing the love of Jesus Christ with and for all people grows ever more important. We have the opportunity, even the responsibility to, as the song suggests, "show we are Christians by our love." How we love our neighbor is how we love our God. Let us go forward into the new year as a new version of the United Methodist Church, freed from the angst of decades of bitter debate, ready to love God and love our neighbors with all our heart, soul, strength, and mind.

Dewdrops, Rainbows and U2 on Sunday Mornings!

Or, families may choose to have children remain in Worship – children's sounds, energy, and emotions are welcome as part of God's joyful noise!



Class	Ages/Grades	Bible Literacy Content	
Dewdrops	3 years* - Kindergarten	Children are introduced to the Bible, by being read to from a "storybook Bible" format, following the 3-year lectionary cycle.	
Rainbows	Grades 1-3	Children deepen their Biblical understanding by repeating the 3-year lectionary, this time reading a "storybook Bible" for themselves, and occasionally a CEB translation bible with teacher guidance.	
U2	Grades 4-6	Children begin to explore a more mature understanding of the 3-year lectionary content, by regularly engaging with a CEB translation bible, and with additional historical and social context.	

*3-year-olds attending Dewdrops must be potty-trained, as we do not have appropriate facilities to address diapering needs in this classroom.
