Summer "Sonbeams" on Sunday Mornings!

Our Sunday morning children's church programs are offered during 11AM Worship, at which we also offer Nursery care. About 10 minutes into the service, children are invited forward to participate with the Children's Message, then afterward, preschool through 6th graders may transition to their classrooms. Or, families may choose to have children remain in Worship – children's sounds, energy, and emotions are welcome as part of God's joyful noise!



During the summer months, we offer our Sonbeams program: children will be flexibly grouped each week based on the numbers/ages of children attending, often remaining in one large group (3* and 4 year-olds are welcome in the nursery if parents prefer that space instead of a multi-age environment). Sonbeams runs June 11 through Sept 27. Our Sonbeams curriculum will be *An Illustrated Earth: Celebrating God's Creation.* It is designed to draw children into conversation with Bible stories that celebrate water, plants, food, and animals as elements of God's creation. Each lesson provides opportunities to focus on the story with open-ended questions and creating meaningful art.

*3-year-olds attending Sonbeams must be toilet-trained, as we do not have appropriate facilities to address diapering needs in this classroom.



School and Hygiene Kits

Church World Service (CWS) school and hygiene kits--Help fill kits that will be sent to folks around the world who are fleeing war or natural disasters, or who are living in extreme poverty.

- ✓ Pick up bags and a supply list in the Gathering Space on Sunday, July 16th or 23rd.
- ✓ Returned filled bags to a cart in the Gathering Space on August 13th-20th.



Last year 108,390 hygiene kits and 45,570 school kits were distributed by CWS around the globe. Some of the school kits stayed in our local area. Community Refugee and Immigration Services (CRIS) requested 275 kits that were distributed to many newly-arrived refugee children for whom school supplies were unaffordable. Kashi Adhikari, who works at a local Nepali community center that received some of the kits, said that having new school supplies greatly increased the children's enthusiasm for going to school. He added that such simple acts of kindness can really help refugees adjust to their new lives in the Columbus community. In addition, CWS provided 240 school kits for folks in need in the Franklinton neighborhood west of downtown Columbus. Over 60% of residents in this area live below the poverty line, and 93% of public elementary school students in Franklinton are eligible for free or reduced lunch. Prior to receiving the CWS kits, many students did not have the supplies they needed to start the 2022-2023 school year.

NNEMAP Fundraiser— July 15, 2023

NNEMAP Food Pantry (Near Northside Emergency Material Assistance Program) is one of the local missions that Church of the Master supports. They have a tasty event coming up that you might want to attend!

"A Taste of German Village and The Brewery District" will be held on Saturday, July 15th from 1-4 on the lawn of Grange Insurance on South High and Frankfort. This event has 16 local restaurants from German Village and the Brewery District tabling samples of their food. It is a rare opportunity to experience all these wonderful culinary experiences in one place. Grange Insurance is the sponsor with supporting sponsors Hausfrau Haven and Seventh Son Brewery/AOH providing the libations.
