A Letter from the Pastor:

Summer is here at last! With temperatures in the mid-90s even before the Summer Solstice took place I don't think anyone had any doubts about summer-like weather being here, but now that it is officially summer (according to those who "officiate" those kinds of things) it's time to put on our flip-flops, our huarache sandals and have "fun, fun, fun" while we listen to the Beach Boys and grab our favorite summer beach reads, whether we're going to the beach or not.

I've shared before that I am always reading a variety of books at any given time so that I have something to dig into regardless of my mood or temperament. I love history and just completed a biography of President Ulysses S. Grant. I set a goal years ago of reading a biography of every U.S. President in order and so began with #1 George Washington and just completed #18 Grant. Along the way reading a brief biography of certain Presidents has inspired me to dig more deeply into that individual's story and so I have picked up additional books about some of these and read them as well. I suspect Grant will be one that I want to read about more extensively as well.

I am reading two daily devotionals currently. The first is titled "365 Saints: Your Daily Guide to the Wisdom and Wonder of Their Lives." This is a book that I inherited when my step-father passed away years ago and it was one I always wanted to get to but never did. In addition, I'm also utilizing "The Upper Room Disciplines for 2022," which is a lectionary-based devotional that was given to me as a gift by Rev. Jim Wagner and that has provided wonderful moments of reflection as we have been working from the lectionary all this year. In addition to these devotionals, I'm about a third of the way through "A Path with Heart: A Guide Through the Perils and Promises of Spiritual Life," by Jack Kornfield. While Kornfield's spirituality is centered in Buddhist practice, his writing about the practices of mindfulness and meditation are applicable across religious boundaries and I have found it both informative and inspiring.

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I have two different books on church leadership in my reading rotation right now. The first is one I referenced in a sermon a few weeks ago, “Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory,” by Tod Bolsinger. Using the story of Lewis and Clark’s expedition in 1804 as a frame, Bolsinger writes about the challenges facing the church at large right now and how local congregations can think about and address the “uncharted territory” with which they are dealing right now. Alongside that I’m also reading “Transforming Church Boards” by Charles Olsen. This book is about how to move a church board from being a knock-off of a corporate board model towards being a more spiritually-centered board focused not so much on day-to-day decision-making but on becoming a board whose primary role is around forward-looking and visioning for the congregation. With our transition to the new Leadership Council, a unified- board model that Chuck Erickson talked about in worship a couple of weeks ago, this book is providing some valuable insight on how to make that gathering a more meaningful experience for the individuals involved as well as the church as a whole.

For an upcoming sermon series on “Faithful AND Inclusive: The Bible, Homosexuality, and the UMC,” I’m in the midst of reading “Unclobber: Rethinking our Misuse of the Bible on Homosexuality.” This book deals directly with those passages of scripture, commonly called the “clobber passages,” that are used to justify the denial of marriage, ordination, and other rites of the church to LGBTQ peoples. Pastor Lucy and I will be bringing that series together later this summer. And then just for fun, I have enjoyed reading from Michael Connelly’s “Bosch” series of police procedurals, along with his “Lincoln Lawyer” series. In addition, Janet Evanovich’s “Stephanie Plum” series about a bounty hunter who gets herself into all kinds of often hilarious predicaments offers just enough escapism to keep me entertained. And for the book club that Lynn and I are a part of we just finished reading “Cultish: The Language of Fanaticism,” which is all about how cult leaders like Jim Jones have used language to recruit, influence, and control those who follow them. A very interesting topic to be sure. So that’s my summer reading list at this point in time. Some are hardback, some paperback, and some are audiobooks. Some are books I own and others are from the Westerville library. What’s on your summer reading list?

News from Associate Pastor Lucy: Otterbein Community Garden

Did you know Otterbein has a Community Garden here in Westerville? Located on Spring Road adjacent to the Equestrian Center, you can't miss it! This lovely garden is full of colorful signs, tables, and vast amounts of produce. The purpose of the garden is to enrich the Westerville community by providing things like: hunger relief efforts through Give Back Garden mission (for local food pantries), an innovative research site for Otterbein, an education site for young people (to raise cultural awareness, among other things), and an environmental gateway to sustainable initiatives. The garden is divided into plots that are cultivated by various groups throughout the community as well as Otterbein students and staff. Gardeners are welcome to use the tools and water provided at the site. A portion of the produce from each plot is donated to food pantries in the community. Otterbein hosts several opportunities for adults and children to be part of the planting, cultivating, and learning happening in the garden. Come see, hear, touch, taste, and smell your way through the garden!

Summer Sundays: Sonbeams!

Families are encouraged to worship together during the 9:00AM service. Our Sunday morning children's church programs are offered at the 11:00 service, during which we also offer Nursery care. After the Children's Message, 3-year-olds* through 6th graders are invited to meet their teachers in the Gathering Space to transition to Sonbeams. Or, families may choose to have children remain in Worship - children's sounds, energy, and emotions are welcome as part of God's joyful noise!



Our Summer "Sonbeams" curriculum will be a thorough exploration of *The Lord's Prayer*, that engages with artwork, children books, and yoga, in addition to Biblical resources! Children will be flexibly grouped each week based on the numbers/ages of children attending, sometimes remaining in one large group (3 and 4 year-olds are welcome in the nursery if parents prefer).

The first Sunday of each month is "Family Worship," with all children remaining in the Sanctuary to participate with the traditional liturgy and hymns, and to receive Communion.

On Tuesday, July 19, Master's Men will be taking a road trip to [Urbana's Champaign Aviation Museum](#). Museum volunteers, including our own Irv Bence and Phil Jagucki, are in the process of restoring a B-17 bomber. The B-17 is being rebuilt using parts from various airframes that have seen a wide range of service, including an airtanker, movie prop, search and rescue, and nuclear testing. Volunteers fabricate missing pieces according to the specifications from the original drawings. Among the other planes housed at the museum is a beautiful, fully restored B-25J named Champaign Gal.



We will meet in the church parking lot on the 19th at 8:45 a.m. and carpool to Grimes Field in Urbana. Irv has graciously agreed to lead our tour, beginning at 10:00 a.m. There is no admission charge, but there is a gift shop you can support and donations are accepted.

In 2008 the Champaign Aviation Museum acquired this B-25 aircraft and has been flying and meticulously maintaining it ever since. It is used for airshows, events, warbird ride experiences, and flyovers.

Facilities Update: New Air Conditioning Installed

Those who have been around Church of the Master for a long time tell us that it was in the 80's when air conditioning was first put into the sanctuary. Those mechanical parts had lasted a long time, but last year it was realized that the equipment was not doing the job anymore and needed replaced. Options were explored and proposals reviewed and, in the end, a system very similar to the old one was decided on. The new one being more efficient, due to technology improvements made in the last decades.

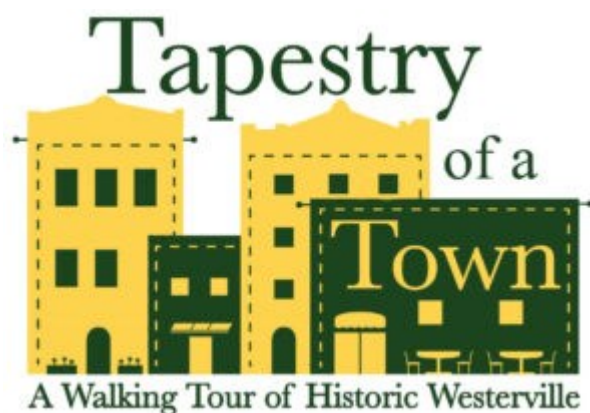
In this environment of busy construction crews and factory delays due to Covid, it took many months after a deposit was paid and an order put in for the equipment to be manufactured and delivered. Then the actual installation could begin, including the logistics of setting a large crane in our parking lot to lift off the old and lift up the new 10-ton condensing units, which sit on the roof. About 10 days of installation and adjustments later, we have a new A/C system, working well, just as the hottest days of summer are upon us.

After two years I'm starting to get settled into the financial secretary position and comfortable enough to address a few things I've seen along this journey.

The first thing I noticed is The Church of the Master has a very generous congregation. Your support of your church even during a pandemic has been nothing short of amazing (at least to me). However; as a numbers guy I'm always looking for ways to save money which brings me to our envelope program. One of the projects I have started is to clean-up our mailing list. I know we have some new members that are not on the list and some members that are on the list that no longer use envelopes. So, I'm asking folks to drop me a note if you would like to receive envelopes or if you would like to be removed from the list (You can email me finance@chmaster.org or drop a note in the collection plate).

The second thing I noted was like me change happens slowly. I know the "if it ain't broke don't fix it" saying very well. Well the church management system we were using wasn't broke but it was expensive. So, we switched to a new system, ChurchTrac. The reason I'm telling you this is because it has some features that I think will make things easier for some members. One feature in particular is an app called connect. This app can give you access to your information in our system from your smart phone or your computer. You can update address changes, see a directory of church members and even see your giving statement any time you like. It's a feature I would like to start rolling out this summer. If the church has your email in the system you can create an account by going to <https://churchofthemaster.churchtrac.com>. If your email is not in the system you can still go to the website above and enter your email. You will receive a message that they can't find you and request you fill out an information form (name, address, telephone number) and that information will be forwarded to us so we can put you in the system, which means we will add your email address to your current record. Once your email is added to our system you can create an account.

I know this maybe a lot for first time, but I'm hoping it will make things a little easier. If you have any suggestions or requests that I can help with please drop me a note.
