# **A Letter from the Pastor:** by Pastor Jay Anderson

Happy March! Last month I wrote about the reasons I enjoy February, among them being that it is the shortest month. When I think about March there are other things that I like, one of them being that if it is not a leap year and February is its usual 28 days, then the dates for Sundays in March are the same as for the month of February. I know that's kind of a

"church geek" thing, but when we're planning for worship weeks in advance that is somewhat helpful, at least to me! I also like that Spring begins in March, although we have to go three weeks in before we get to it and even then, it's likely to be just as cold and snowy on the first day of Spring as it was on the first day of Winter - maybe even more so. I love that March Madness takes place (mostly) in March, even though the finals leak into April. Growing up in the basketball-mad state of Indiana has always nurtured a love for the really good quality games that the tournament brings, even if I don't always sit and watch them all. And I love that we usually begin the season of Lent in March with Ash Wednesday Worship. Ash Wednesday has always been one of the most meaningful worship services of the year for me, even though it is often one of the lightest attended.

This year on Ash Wednesday we will begin a series for Lent titled **"Good Enough: Embracing the Imperfections of** *Life and Faith,"* based on a book of "40-ish" devotions by Kate Bowler and Jessica Richie titled, "Good Enough: 40ish Devotionals for a Life of Imperfection." Our series will explore, through the scriptures of the Revised Common Lectionary, how we can push back against our society's urgings and expectations to always climb the ladder, seeking more and better, and instead nurture what it is we already have into a life and faith that is good, or at least good enough. After two years of pandemic and trying to figure out what is "right" and what is "better" or "best," sometimes we just need to hear and have affirmed that what we are doing is enough, that God loves us and blesses us as we are, where we are, and that we don't need to strive to go higher, faster, or farther. Instead, we'll urge you to find what works for you, what patterns, what disciplines, whatever, and let that work to connect you with God without pressuring yourself or being pressured by others to do more, to try more, to strive more...

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So, whether you worship in-person or on-line, I hope you'll join us this season. Our Ash Wednesday service, on March 2nd, will be live-streamed, so if you are a young family with kids and getting to a 7pm worship service just doesn't work for you, or if you're an older adult who doesn't feel comfortable driving after dark or when you don't know what the weather will be like or the condition of the roads, then plan on joining us online. I think everyone needs to hear this message of Lent, but especially our younger families who are juggling so much with kids and school and activities and pandemic and work and careers. I Invite you, after you get the kids to bed on Ash Wednesday, to settle in, give yourself a little break, and just be affirmed that you are enough, that what you do is enough, that God loves you for who you are, not what you do.

And just a brief word in conclusion about our pandemic protocols. Several cities and school districts have removed their mask mandates in the past couple of weeks, making masking optional in some cases. We have taken our lead on our masking protocols from both the CDC and the local schools throughout the pandemic. We continue to monitor case numbers, hospitalization numbers, as well as the number of Covid deaths being reported and are considering what, if any changes, to make to our masking guidelines. There are a couple of concerns in particular that are shaping our response. First, case numbers being down is a good thing, but there is no way of knowing whether that is because the virus is in decline or because more and more people are home-testing and those positive tests are not reported anywhere. That means that hospitalization and death rates are, perhaps, the more important numbers to be considered. And second, with many schools making masking optional only in the last week or so, we want to see what the impact on cases in the schools are, whether they spike or stay steady, before we change our policy, lest we have to immediately turn it around. So for now, we will maintain our requirement for masking in the building, but will be monitoring this information regularly, revisiting it every couple of weeks. We'll keep you advised, but for now, in order to best protect both our oldest and youngest members, especially those under five years old for whom no vaccine is yet available, as well as those who are immunocompromised, we will continue to require masks in the building.

### Church of the Master perks up Otterbein with Monday Morning Coffee

From free coffee to good fellowship, the Church of the Master has served the Otterbein community for more than 170 years.

For the past ten years, the Otterbein community has benefited from the Church of the Master's (COTM) Monday Morning Coffee (MMC) ministry. Between the hours of 9 a.m. and 11 a.m., anyone is welcome to step through the red doors and grab a donut and a cup of coffee. The team is always ready to serve outdoors or indoors, depending on the weather.

The Church of the Master has been dedicated to serving the Otterbein community since 1851, just four years after Otterbein was founded. The Otterbein community has benefited greatly over the years as COTM has provided community outreach, various ministries, covenant meetings, worship services, pancake and spaghetti dinners. Leading COTM's on-campus ministries for the past four years, Pastor Lucy Kelly recently became the Associate Pastor for Church of the Master. "Everyone's welcome, when we are outside, when families are walking by with their kids and dogs, we invite them to come on up," said Kelly.

Sam Dorff, an MMC veteran volunteer of over eight years, added, "The administrative ladies over here [pointing towards Clippinger Hall] stop in most Mondays. We even get the professors in here."

Pastor Kelly added, "There are professors that come in that really need a chance to talk, so they'll come in and they'll chat for five minutes with us. You can just tell their week has just been loaded and they really enjoy coming in and telling us anything and everything. So, they appreciate it."

What started out as coffee, tea and hot chocolate a decade ago has grown into a full-blown breakfast served to the community. Kelly makes sure that everyone, even those with dietary restrictions, can start their day a little brighter. Gluten-free snacks are offered alongside the donuts - Schneider's is a student favorite. Judie Salyer, a 1963 Otterbein Alumna, has been here since day one. Salyer and Bev Pancoast started the MMC ministry 10 years ago. "Four or five years ago we started serving donuts and we were going through only four or five dozen back then, now we are up to nine. Donuts are paid for and supplied by the MMC team." Elizabeth Foster, a musical theatre major, looks forward to seeing the MMC team on Mondays. "I have 8 a.m.'s every day, so it helps me get out of bed. They are always just so kind to me when they walk in and always have a smile on their faces."

"We gain as much from this as the students do, maybe even more. It's nice that we can actually provide this ministry. We are open doors here, and we are all about inclusivity, and in that all are welcome. That is a big part and aspect of our ministry," Kelly said.

#### Sundays: Rainbows, Dewdrops, and U2!

Families are encouraged to worship together during the 9:00 a.m. service - we have activity bags to help your children stay engaged.



Our Sunday morning children's church programs are offered at the 11:00 service, during which we also offer Nursery care. After the Children's Message, 3-year-olds through 6th graders are invited to meet their teachers in the Gathering Space to transition to their classrooms (see below). Or, families may choose to have children remain in Worship – children's sounds, energy, and emotions are welcome as part of God's joyful noise!

The first Sunday of each month is "Family Worship," with all children remaining in the Sanctuary to participate with the traditional liturgy and hymns, and to receive Communion. Including this practice regularly will allow our children to more fully participate in our congregation, and learn from an earlier age what it means to worship in Christian community! (Nursery care will still be offered as an option during "Family Worship.")

Dewdrops	3 years* - Kindergarten	Children are introduced to the Bible, by being read to from a "storybook Bible" format, following the 3-year lectionary cycle.		
Rainbows	Grades 1-3	Children deepen their understanding of Biblical persons and content by repeating the 3-year lectionary, this time reading a "storybook Bible" for themselves, and occasionally a "children's translation" Bible with teacher guidance.		
U2	Grades 4-6	Children begin to explore a more mature understanding of the 3-year lectionary content, by regularly engaging with a standard Bible (CEB), and with additional historical and social context.


