#### Dewdrops, Rainbows and U2 on Sunday Mornings!

Our Sunday morning children's church programs are offered during 11AM Worship, at which we also offer Nursery care. About 10 minutes into the service, children are invited forward to participate with the Children's Message, then afterward, preschool through 6<sup>th</sup> graders may transition to their classrooms (see below). Or, families may choose to have children remain in Worship – children's sounds, energy, and emotions are welcome as part of God's joyful noise!



Class	Ages/Grades	Bible Literacy Content
Dewdrops	3 years* - Kindergarten	Children are introduced to the Bible, by being read to from a "storybook Bible" format, following the 3-year lectionary cycle.
Rainbows	Grades 1-3	Children deepen their Biblical understanding by repeating the 3-year lectionary, this time reading a "storybook Bible" for themselves, and occasionally a CEB translation bible with teacher guidance.
U2	Grades 4-6	Children begin to explore a more mature understanding of the 3-year lectionary content, by regularly engaging with a CEB translation bible, and with additional historical and social context.

Parents have flexibility to make the best choice for their child regarding class placement. If your 3 or 4-year-old is more comfortable in the Nursery instead of Dewdrops, if your 4<sup>th</sup> grader is better served by attending Rainbows, or if your 6<sup>th</sup> grader is ready to "graduate" U2 and remain in Worship, etc., we support you in these accommodations. 


Tuesday November 8 at 1:30 there will be a Circle meeting/ World Thank Offering Service in the chapel.

Westerville Habitat Partnership: Soup for Shelter and Progressive Christmas Concert December 9, 2022



Soup for Shelter 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at the Otterbein Campus Center. Your ticket includes a handcrafted bowl made by Columbus Academy students, a bowl of soup (served in a disposable bowl), bread, cookie, and beverage. Profits from this event are used to provide materials for the annual Walls Build in August.



Progressive Christmas Concert 7:00 p.m. to 9:15 p.m. This walking event stops for concerts at each of the three Uptown Westerville churches-Church of the Master, Church of the Messiah, and First Presbyterian Church-all within about a block of each other. Ticket holders attend a short concert in each of the three churches and are led to the next by costumed guides with lanterns. It's a great way to get into the holiday spirit, see beautifully decorated historic churches, and hear great music provided by the choirs and musicians of our five member churches.

Those needing assistance for mobility issues will have van transport between churches provided by the Church of the Messiah. The van will be available there after the first concert (at 7:30) so participants need to start their concert tour at Messiah.

- What is the impact on you and your family and especially your LGBTQ+ child if the congregation you attend is considering disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church or has voted to disaffiliate from the UMC?

The sessions are designed to provide a safe space where questions and concerns can be dealt with openly and honestly.
