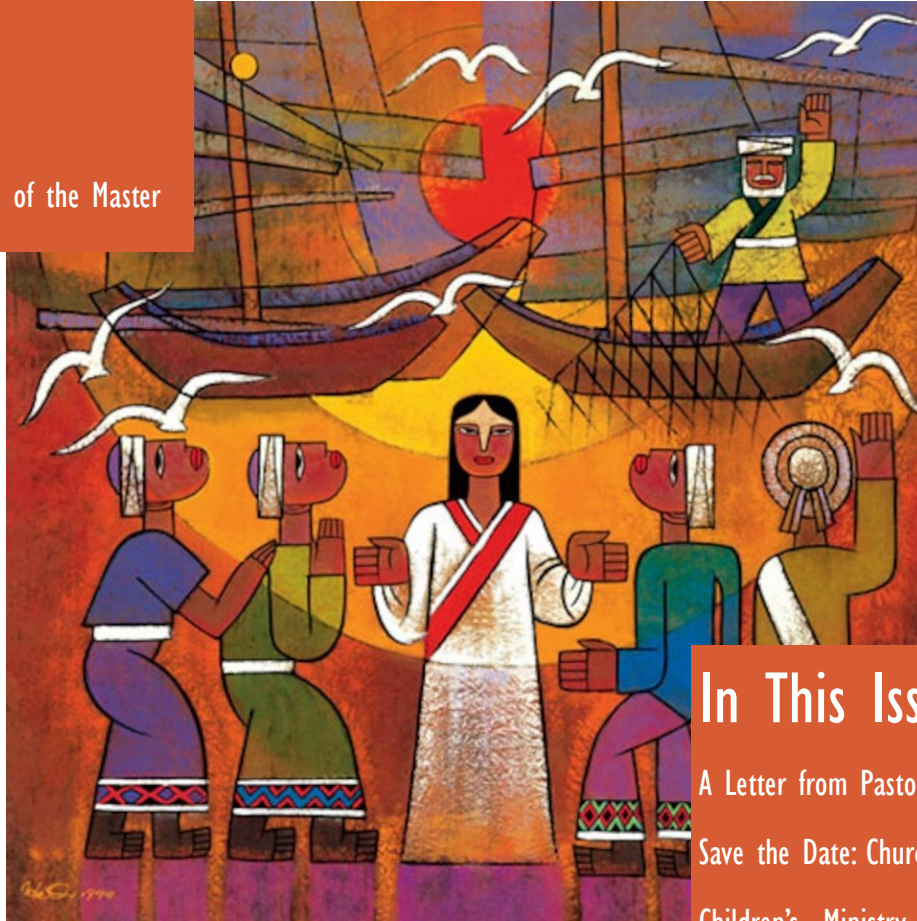

A Letter from the Pastor By Pastor Jay Anderson

What is a disciple? Well, most simply a disciple is a follower. So then, if we expand the question to ask, what is a disciple of Jesus Christ then logic would suggest that a disciple of Jesus Christ is a follower of Jesus Christ. But what, then, do we mean or how do we understand the nature of being a disciple of Jesus Christ? Well, the Wesleyan understanding of a disciple according to The General Rules of Discipleship in our United Methodist Book of Discipline states that, “A disciple is a witness to Jesus Christ in the world who follows His teachings through acts of compassion, justice, worship, and devotion under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.” The late Rev. Junius Dotson, who at the time of his death last year was the head of the UMC General Board of Discipleship, offered this simpler definition: “A disciple is one who knows Christ, is growing in Christ, serving Christ, and sharing Christ.”

The mission of the United Methodist Church is “To make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.” The “making of disciples” and the “transforming of the world” are two sides of the same coin; it is both the purpose behind being a disciple, as well as the result of people becoming disciples. So I assume, understanding the inherent pitfalls in assuming, that people who attend church are people who both find themselves and *desire to be*, somewhere on the path of getting to know Christ, growing in Christ, serving Christ, and sharing Christ. Otherwise, honestly, why would we be here?

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Understanding that discipleship is a journey, a process, or as Jesus called it, “a Way,” we all need ongoing opportunities to be reminded about various aspects of what it means and what it looks like to be a disciple, and to find ways of moving further along that way. There are easily understood and measurable milestones to progressing on the way to becoming a better disciple, such as time spent reading or studying scripture, time spent in prayer, worshiping or serving in some way. But there are also some aspects of discipleship that are less about measuring and more about experience and growth, particularly spiritual growth.

At the same time, discipleship is not a “one and done” kind of learning either. We don’t learn everything we need to know about following Jesus in Sunday School, Confirmation, or any adult book study. We learn something new every time we read or study a passage of scripture, even if it’s one we’re very familiar with. No two prayers are understood or experienced in the same way, even if it’s a universal or communal prayer like the Lord’s Prayer. No two worship experiences or service opportunities are the same, nor do they result in the same outcomes in our or someone else’s lives. That’s why we keep going back, why we keep studying, keep worshiping, keep serving, keep giving, and keep bearing witness to our faith with our lives in various ways.

In October and November we will be going back to the basics of discipleship for some refreshers on the basics of discipleship. We’ll explore the importance of worship, of scripture, of prayer, of service, of community engagement, of generosity, and of witness to not only our growth as disciples, but also as to how our discipleship can transform the world. We’ll do this in the context of worship that will include World Communion Sunday, Children’s Sabbath, the presentation of 3rd grade bibles, Laity Sunday, All Saints Day and much more. You’ll hear from many voices as we travel this way together, and you’ll be invited each week to make a commitment to grow incrementally in your own faith journey in each of these ways. We will explore together what it looks like to live a Real Life, Fully Alive in Christ. We hope you will join us each week as travel this road together in these final weeks before the turn of the liturgical year at Advent.

I think the journey is best summed up in the words of our Welcome Song: *“Let’s walk together for a while, and ask where we begin to build a world where love can grow and hope can enter in. To be the hands of healing, and to plant the seeds of peace...”*

Dewdrops, Rainbows and U2 on Sunday Mornings!

Our Sunday morning children's church programs are offered during 11AM Worship, at which we also offer Nursery care. About 10 minutes into the service, children are invited forward to participate with the Children's Message, then afterward, preschool through 6th graders may transition to their classrooms (see below). Or, families may choose to have children remain in Worship - children's sounds, energy, and emotions are welcome as part of God's joyful noise!



Class	Ages/Grades	Bible Literacy Content
Dewdrops	3 years* - Kindergarten	Children are introduced to the Bible, by being read to from a "storybook Bible" format, following the 3-year lectionary cycle.
Rainbows	Grades 1-3	Children deepen their Biblical understanding by repeating the 3-year lectionary, this time reading a "storybook Bible" for themselves, and occasionally a CEB translation bible with teacher guidance.
U2	Grades 4-6	Children begin to explore a more mature understanding of the 3-year lectionary content, by regularly engaging with a CEB translation bible, and with additional historical and social context.

Parents have flexibility to make the best choice for their child regarding class placement. If your 3 or 4-year-old is more comfortable in the Nursery instead of Dewdrops, if your 4th grader is better served by attending Rainbows, or if your 6th grader is ready to "graduate" U2 and remain in Worship, etc., we support you in these accommodations. Please chat with our Educational Ministry Team!

*3-year-olds attending Dewdrops must be potty-trained, as we do not have appropriate facilities to address diapering needs in this classroom.

Greetings to you all! I'd like to share from Father Gregory Boyle's book, Barking to the Choir. He writes, "I was saying mass at the San Fernando Juvenile Hall. With nearly three hundred detained minors – mostly gang members– a homie reads from Psalm 138. I'm seated, vested, eyes closed, choosing to listen to this kid's proclamation, rather than follow along in the liturgical sheet that rests on my lap. He reads, with an over-abundance of confidence, "The Lord...is EXHAUSTED."... I open my eyes and hurriedly refer to my sheet. It says, "The Lord is exalted", but I think "exhausted" is way better. I'm not sure I want to spend eternity with a God who wants to be exalted, who longs to be recognized and made a big deal of. I would rather hope for a humble God who gets exhausted in delighting over and loving us."

I have to agree. A God who understands exhaustion is a God who understands me and you. Humans who are doing our best, but still, at times, need encouragement to fight our exhaustion. Sisters, as we head into the fall, let us encourage each other, share the load, don't let exhaustion win as we work towards our goal of helping women, children and youth. Don't forget, that includes us. Be community, be part of the Kin-dom. Our local United Women in Faith at times feels that exhaustion at times, but like all the women who came before us, we carry on. Puerto Rico Needs Our Help (From NewsNet, the e-newsletter of the West Ohio Conference of the UMC)

Since Hurricane Maria in 2017, the people of Puerto Rico have been preparing for **the next big storm**. Each year on June 1 - the start of the Atlantic hurricane season - stores begin selling out of generators, gas-powered appliances, canned food, and bottled water. Across the island, the Methodist Church of Puerto Rico has not only repaired the damage from Maria, but has also helped churches and communities become more resilient to climate change. **Now, five years later, the next big storm has come. Hurricane Fiona, while less powerful than Maria, dumped as much as 31 inches of rain on towns and villages across Puerto Rico. Widespread flooding swept away bridges, damaged homes, stripped pavement off roads, and left millions without drinking water. The electric grid, which took almost a year to fully repair after Maria, is still down for more than half of the island. Already, the Methodist Church of Puerto Rico - under the leadership of newly elected Bishop Lizette Gabriel Montalvo - has begun to assess the damage and assist those in need. But following a hurricane that caused an estimated \$10 billion of damage to Puerto Rico alone, they need our help.**



Consider what you can do...

PRAY - Pray for the people of Puerto Rico as they suffer yet another collective trauma. Pray for the Methodist Church of Puerto Rico as they help survivors and communities rebuild.

GIVE - Give to UMCOR's U.S. Disaster Response and Recovery fund, 100% of which goes to providing aid on the ground, including immediate relief and long-term recovery.

Who is Nancy Day?



Nancy, while a student at Otterbein, gave a concert every year of her original music. She wrote all of the string, brass, woodwind, percussion, bass, guitar and vocal parts for each show, featuring other talented students. She also wrote the music for members of the Columbus Symphony, who accompanied her concert at the Scioto River Amphitheater.

Her senior year, featuring 30 students, she performed two nights in Battelle Fine Arts Center, because of the large crowds she drew. Also her senior year she completed her first song collection called *Nancy*, which included 10 other student musicians.

In 2000 Nancy was chosen as the first Otterbein Alumni to perform as part of the Artist Series. In this concert she featured strings, bassoon, flute, guitar, bass guitar, drums and french horn, and also included the Otterbein Concert Choir and the Children's Choir associated with Otterbein, directed by Amy Chivington. Through the years, Nancy has written the music for five musicals. And most recently, this past July, Nancy was invited to be a performer at the National Women's Music Festival in Wisconsin.

Nancy performs and teaches music for her living today in the Boston, Massachusetts area. Nancy has always followed her calling with her music and since her first album, has written and produced 17 original song collections.
