As you receive this April newsletter we are in the midst of Holy Week.

We have two midweek service offerings for you this year. The first is on Holy Thursday, April 1st, and will be a livestream service including Holy Communion at 7:00pm. That service will actually serve as a lead-in to the Good Friday service that will be pre-recorded later on Thursday evening and come to you via email on Friday, April 2nd. The Good Friday service is built around a liturgical drama set in the Upper Room in the aftermath of the crucifixion. Our worship team is working hard to create a powerful and meaningful Holy Week worship experience for us all and I hope you will make the time to worship on both of those nights.

Easter Sunday will be a little different this year - who knew, right? Weather permitting, we will hold an abbreviated in-person outdoor service at 8:30am in the church parking lot, lasting approximately 30-40 minutes. You received an email from the office on Friday, March 26th with a signup to attend that in-person outdoor service. There is no limit on the number of people who can attend, but we need to have an idea of how many to expect. We ask that you please bring your own chairs for that service and remind you that masks will be required. Further details are in that March 26th email.

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Following that outdoor service, we will have a live-stream only service at 10:00am with our Chancel Choir joining us for the first time in over a year. This service will be a traditional Easter Sunday service and will also include Holy Communion. We hope you will plan to join us, either in-person and outdoors weather permitting at 8:30am or online at 10:00am.

As we prepare for our Easter Sunday outdoor worship service and for our return to regular in-person worship beginning in May we are in need of an ongoing group of volunteers to serve as our "Road Crew" to help set up and tear down the outdoor services. On May 2nd, when we return to in-person worship we will also offer an outdoor service each week at 9:00am when the weather allows and need folks who can take charge of moving the sound system, keyboard, tables, and other miscellaneous equipment in and out of the building each week. If this is something that you would be willing to help with please reach out to either me or our Worship Chair, Julie Porretta. Like you, we are anxious to return to in-person worship, but as I indicated last month, some things will be a bit different for us as we make our way back and this is one of those things. While many people are vaccinated, there are still many who are not and there is currently no plan or schedule in place for the vaccination of children under the age of 16. We want everyone to have an opportunity for in-person worship, however, so offering an outdoor service when the weather allows is one way we can do that while caring for the health and safety of all of our brothers and sisters. I pray that you will support this effort and one another by your willingness to help us make this happen.

As we move towards this most holy of days on Sunday, my prayer for you is that in the midst of all that brings us worry, all that brings us pain, all that brings us sorrow, that in our worship of the God who makes all things new again, the God who takes death in all of its forms and resurrects new life, that you might find joy, comfort, and peace in the presence of that same God who is with you and within you this day and every day. Amen.

## Discovery on Adventure Island VBS/Day Camp/Survivor Camp June 21-25, 2021



This year our theme is Discovery on Adventure Island. Together we will learn to shine God's light in the world! Kids will participate in memorable Bible-learning activities, create fun crafts explore amazing science experiments and serve God through mission projects. Plus, campers at Sugarbush get to enjoy the fun of traditional camping activities such as hiking, campfires and creeking! We are excited to return to "in person" VBS/Day Camp and Survivor Camp this summer. We will follow all current health guidelines (masks, small groups, social distancing, hand washing, etc). Preschool VBS (for 3 year olds-rising kindergartners) will be held outside at the church from 9:00-11:30 a.m. Day Camp (for rising 1st-5th graders) and Survivor camp (for rising 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> graders) will be held at Sugarbush Day Camp from 9:30 a.m.-2:45 p.m. We will also offer an "at-home" VBS option for our preschool and elementary families. Families who choose the "at-home" option will be able to pick up crafts, science experiment and Bible activities to do along with interactive videos for the week.

Families who pre-register will receive more specific information and be asked to return final registration forms along with the registration fee later this spring. The cost is VBS \$25.00, Day Camp \$35.00 and Survivor Camp \$35.00. There is a family cap of \$70.00 for children in the same family attending VBS and/or Day Camp. Survivor Camp is not included in the family cap. Partial scholarships are available if needed.



## **Church Reopening Guidelines**





#### ACCESS TO THE SANCTUARY

When we return, please use the eastern most doors on Main Street closest to the parking lot. For those who

cannot negotiate the stairs the handicapped entrance on the south side of the building will be available. If you come in from the south side entrance, sit on that side of the sanctuary. We would ask that if a member of your family needs to use the handicapped entrance that all members of the family use this entrance so as to stay together. This will minimize congestion in the Gathering Space and allow for the ushers to more easily seat your family together.



#### RESERVATIONS

A link to reserve seats will be sent out on Monday and you will have until Friday at noon to reserve your spots. If you do not have access to email, please call

the church office before Friday at noon to reserve spots. Understand that once capacity in the sanctuary has been reached, overflow seating is available in the fellowship hall.



#### WELLNESS

Anyone who is sick, coughing, has a sore throat, or a fever is asked to remain

home. We're committed to continuing to provide worship online, so anyone who needs to remain at home whether due to illness, being in a vulnerable group, or other reasons can still join us in worship.

As we enter the building, we will use notouch thermometers to take everyone's temperatures. Anyone with a temperature of 100.4 or higher will need to return home where you can worship with us online.

Everyone over the age of 3 will be required to wear a mask. If you forgot your mask, we'll provide one to you. If you're unable to wear a mask, we ask that you continue to worship with us from home until masks are no longer needed.

Everyone who enters the building must sanitize their hands with provided hand sanitizer, unless a health condition prevents it.

At this time, coffee service will not be available. Please limit use of the restrooms to emergencies only and limit occupancy to one person (and a parent or aide) at a time if at all possible. A changing table will be available in the Nursery room.



#### WORSHIP TIMES

We will return to in-person worship services on May 2, 2021. There will be a 9:00 a.m. outdoor service and an 11:00 a.m. indoor service. Masks are required at both worship services. If weather permits for the outdoor service, we request you bring your own chair. Parking in the church parking lot is unavailable until the conclusion of the outdoor service.



#### WORSHIP

Our services will be designed to be as touchless as possible by holding doors open, eliminating paper bulletins and

hymnals, individually packaged communion elements, and using offering collection boxes after worship instead of passing the plate. Masks will be required for the entire service and during liturgy and singing.





Rainbows, Dewdrops and Nursery care will be available during that 11:00 a.m. service starting on May 16<sup>th</sup>. Families attending the outdoor service are encouraged to

worship together. Nursery care will not be provided during the 9:00 a.m. outdoor service. Ongoing Children's Ministry activities will continue throughout the summer. To be added to the Children's Ministry email list please contact Erin Flory chidren@chmaster.org).



Individuals or families should maintain safe distancing in the sanctuary and Gathering Space. Seating and exiting will be guided by the pastor and the ushers.

We are all looking forward to seeing each other again and will naturally want to give each other hugs or handshakes; but during this season we will greet each other with smiles and waves that maintain 6 feet of safe distancing.

#### THANK YOU!

We thank you all for working with us to take care of each other. You may not be someone who is in a vulnerable group or concerned about catching the virus, but these measures will help us to protect those who are. They only work if all of us buy in and do our part to keep each other safe. Thank you for putting the safety of our Church of the Master family members first! These guidelines serve as a roadmap for reopening the building based on currently available information. Nothing in these guidelines are to be considered absolute as the current COVID-19 situation is fluid and evolving.

6 to 14 oz pump spray insect repellent

Scrub brush (with or without handle)

Re-usable cleaning wipes (no Terry cloth, microfiber or paper towels)

Scouring pads (no stainless steel pads with soap on them)

36 to 50 clothespins

50 to 100 ft clothesline (cotton or plastic)

N95 particulate respirator dust masks

Kitchen gloves

Work gloves (cotton with leather pads or all leather)

Did you know that being outside has a lot of good physiological benefits for you? #### Option 1: OhioHealth MyChart

If you received care at OhioHealth in the past three years and have an OhioHealth MyChart account, we will notify you when you can schedule your first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine through MyChart. Sign in today to verify your email address. If you do not have a MyChart account, request an activation code at MyChart.OhioHealth.com or through the OhioHealth app.



#### Option 2: OhioHealth COVID-19 Vaccine Hotline

If you're not an OhioHealth patient or can't schedule online, call (614) 533.6999 weekdays from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.



#### Option 3: Retail clinics and community locations

Visit Vaccine.Coronavirus.Ohio.gov for a list of locations providing the vaccine across Ohio. If you have the opportunity to get the vaccine at another location in your community, we encourage you to take advantage of it.

At OhioHealth, appointments are limited by the number of doses we receive. If no appointments are available when you try to schedule, check back. We will continue to add new openings as we get more vaccines. OhioHealth physician offices cannot schedule your vaccine, so please do not call or message your providers with appointment requests.

This program is similar to the online ordering system used at grocery stores but made specifically for food pantries. Orders are picked up curbside when clients schedule their visit.

#### Income Eligibility Guidelines for Food Assistance:


If you live in the Westerville School District and have a total combined income of all people in the household which is currently below these levels, you can visit WARM up to every two weeks for food and household supplies for your family.
