Buring the past few weeks a general discussion has been going on in which it is freely asserted that people Turkish or Armenian origin are not entitled to the United States citizenship, and that an order to that effect has been sent to the Courts issuing naturalization papers. It is almost impossible to obtain, from the discussion of the subject in the press, any clear idea of the merits and the status of the subject. This agritation is causing a great deal of concern to the Armenians, resident in America, whose intentions are to become American citizens and establish themselves permanently in this country.
