ON THE PSALMS

Let's think about the Psalms. The psalms are ancient Israel's prayer and hymn book. Our call to worship on Sunday mornings usually includes a responsive reading from the psalms, but I would like to invite you to pray the psalms daily as a spiritual exercise and communion with God. I have recently rediscovered the practice of daily praying the Psalms, often out loud. When we sing or pray the Psalms, we are actually singing and praying about Jesus Christ, who is at the center of the Psalter. We pray of his:

1. eternal divinity (Ps. 45:6–7) 2. work of creation (Pss. 33:6; 102:25–27) 3. birth (Ps. 40:6) 4. life of obedience to the law of God (Pss. 40:7; 45:7) 5. facing the opposition of the world (Ps. 2:1–3) 6. entry into Jerusalem (Ps. 118:19–26) 7. crucifixion (Pss. 22:1–21; 118:27) 8. burial (Ps. 16:10) 9. resurrection (Pss. 2:7; 16:10; 22:21–31) 10. ascension (Pss. 24:7–10; 47:5–7; 68:18) 11. present reign from heaven (Pss. 47:8; 110:1)12. worship by all nations (Pss. 22:27–31; 47:1; 66:1; 67; 72:5–11) 13. coming again to judge (Pss. 96:13; 98:9)

When we sing the Psalms we are also singing the very words of Christ in his agony (Pss. 22:1–21; 69:1–29; 88) and ecstasy (Pss. 16:11; 17:15; 22:21–31). We are saying what he said when he prayed. We are uniting ourselves to him by faith and identifying ourselves with his sufferings and glories.

Almost every Psalm speaks of the spiritual warfare between the church and the world, the righteous and the unrighteous, and of all the sufferings the church goes through in this life. Join me in praying the Psalms regularly and let me know how it affects your prayer life and your Christian walk. I look forward to hearing from you.

FAMILY PROMISE

On April 8 and 9 members of Marshallton UMC we once again acted as support host to St,. James Episcopal Church by serving meals to the families in the Family Promise network, meeting and greeting them, and staying overnight. Shelva Lewis and her team served on Wednesday evening and June Pesikey's team served on Thursday evening. We also had a new team serve on Saturday evening. Lauren and Steve Temple and their Children were the serving team that evening. It continues to bless both the Family Promise families and the ones providing the service.

We will be performing these support host operations in again June and August. If you have not yet been a part of one of these teams, we encourage you to sign up for one of the evenings scheduled for later this year. This letter was received recently from our missionaries serving at the Mulungwisihi site in the Congo. It explains so well how important our small contributions to this mission truly are and how they are helping to do God's will.

March 2015

Dear friends.

We want to thank you so much for your continued support to the Seminary and the Women's School. Again and again, you have stepped in and shared to a Church far away and to men and women you do not now. However, they know you are helping them receive the education for their lives and the future. The church in Congo continues to grow and affect the communities. Despite the instability of the country, Methodist churches, schools, hospitals and dispensaries continue to bring life to people. Praise the Lord for His Faithfulness. Praise the Lord for the faithfulness of His people called into ministry.

We arrived in Zambia, last year, at the beginning of May. The month was spent teaching pastors and some of their wives at the Kafkumba Pastor's School. This is comparable to our conference course of study where the pastors come in for 4 weeks a year over an eight year period to receive ordination. These pastors serve as lay pastors in churches. The session in Zambia was for pastors from Zambia and Tanzania. Both of these countries are relatively new fields for our church. The growth is very good and they need pastors.

In June we returned to Mulungwishi to complete the academic year which we had started in September through November 2013. What a blessing it was t be again with our students at both the Seminary and Women's School. Likewise, fitting back into life in the community was special. Lori rejoined the team with the nutrition program and dispensary. One of our students, Kongolo Madjesi, had dream one night when a person came to him and asked if he knew St. Paul. He said he did not. At that point he saw St. Paul holding a basket full of books. Madjesi was told that he would be like St. Paul. He feels that this was his call into the ministry. Madjesi went on to take the entrance exam for several times before he was

admitted. Between exams he kept teaching in our Methodist schools waiting for the Lord's timing. He now is in Ministry along with his classmates and their wives. Madjesi is learning and developing into the call put on his life and using St. Paul as his model. Continue to be in prayer for them.

In August, Mulungwishi hosted the Congolese session of the Kafkumba Pastor's School. It is easier for the pastor students from Congo to travel and study at Mulungwishi. It is great that during our Seminary and University vacation, our campus can host this session. The fourth year students come with their wives allowing them to also have classes. All their meals are prepared at the Women's School which means 400 rolls baked a day in a wood oven! All the leaders and professors of the Kafkumba Pastor School are graduates of the Mulungwishi Seminary.

We began the next academic year again in September and October before returning to the United States. We are always so humbled to be teaching these pastors and their wives. In each couple we see commitment and faithfulness to the Lord's calling in their lives. Some travel for more than three weeks, in difficult conditions to come to school. One of the pastors walked 100 miles to the nearest place where he could catch a truck and ride on top....for the next 150 miles (about 4 days) to get to Mulungwishi. Many of these pastors serve in areas where there has been conflict. They go to parishes where there is no prepared places for them to live, or church building. Their salaries are 25-30 dollars a month and many times there is not the right schools available for their children. Their dedication and fidelity to their call has blessed us and we see the results in the growth of the Church. Indeed we are spoiled in having a small part in What God is doing in this part of the world.

Our plans are to return once more to Africa I April. Our schedule and activities will be the same. We want to encourage your continued support of the Seminary and Women's School through the Advance Special (Mulungwishi Theological Seminary # 05773A and Mulungwishi Women's School # 08112A). The advance Specials continue the Programs under the Congolese leadership. Your gifts and prayers not only count for the present education of these pastors but continues on with their ministries.

Thank you again for your continued faithfulness to th ministry in Congo. We covet your prayrs as we continue in this ministry.


