TRUSTEE REPORT

The 3736 Old Capitol Trail house has been repaired due to storm damage. This was covered by liability insurance minus deductible as was removal of tree which came down in storm and caused damage. There is one remaining tree to be removed before winter if possible.

The carpet in parsonage family room has been replaced. This cost of \$1100 was in the refurbishing budget.

Attached you will note a copy of the "Index" for the Procedure & Guideline book to which we are continuing to add items. A copy is maintained in the Trustee Office, Pastor's Office, and in the Administrative Assistant's office. You may review the book any time you like, but we prefer it not be removed from the office. With each copy of the Chatter we will include a copy of this index and a list of "Areas of Responsibility" for your use. These persons and/or procedures will change from time to time, therefore, a current sheet with each publication.

The freezer in the heater room was recently repaired. This freezer was originally a donation to the church and has been running efficiently until this repair (\$259).

We need to install a hand-washing sink in the kitchen to meet State standards. Billy Snyder is taking care of this.

We have water damage on the ceiling of the Sanctuary, apparently from leaves and debris catching between the main roof and bell tower and not allowing drainage.

Our roofer feels confident that there will be no further leaks at this time. However, we have to evaluate and decide on plan of repairs for the ceiling.

The Trustees continue to care for the ground and general repairs of the church, parsonage and rented properties.


