My family finally realized after multiple attempts of trying to help that I needed professional help that they couldn't give. My mother was taking me to church at the time and the pastor knew I was struggling with fixing my life. He recommended that I come to Teen Challenge to get the help I needed.

After many tries to do things myself, I came to Men's Challenge and surrendered. I saw how others had joy and peace and I envied that. I wanted what they had and that took me giving up my past and surrendering. Since I have Christ, the Lord has showed me that I didn't just have a drug problem but a character issue. He is also showing me there is hope, peace and love through him. What I'm working on right now is learning how to be a stronger man for my blood family, and my family from Christ.
