That ended the relationship that I had with my stepfather. Because of constant conflict, I left home and started down a road I never thought I would take. The partying on the weekend turned into an everyday thing and quickly became my lifestyle. By age 24, I was a full blown Fentanyl and Meth user. I had pushed my family away and burnt every bridge. I was hard headed and the Lord not only had to let me hit rock bottom, but had to let me stay there until my eyes were opened to my surroundings.

I saw where my life was going and I reached out to my sister for help and I meant it this time. My sister found Men's Challenge of the Smokies and we started the process of getting me here. That involved going to jail first to get some things taken care of. Since coming to Men's Challenge, the Lord is showing me how much better life is with Him leading the way. I surrendered my life to Christ and for the first time in years I am at peace and I'm rebuilding relationships with my family.
