## WILLING TO CHANGE

My name is Jacob and I am 25 years old. As a child, I was plagued with cluster chronic migraines. The majority of my childhood was spent in severe pain day after day. Finally, when I was 13, the headaches went away. I didn't understand why God would have let that happen and I turned as far away from Him as possible.

In my early teens, I had begun smoking marijuana and experimenting with drugs. I was trying to get as much enjoyment from life as possible. My habit continually got worse and turned into more hard core drugs. This became dependency on drugs and by the time I was 22, it had turned into using heroin daily. My life became chasing any drug I could get and all I cared about was getting high. Over the next few years there was no joy at all in life. I had lost my mother, close friends and almost my own life to overdose. I died for about two minutes before the paramedics brought me back to life after an overdose.

I became tired of the life I had been living. It was a life of constant struggle and suffering all for my next fix and the very brief sense of counterfeit joy it gave me. I knew I had a decision to make. Was I tired of living that way and willing to change? Once I was willing to try to change, God opened the doors for me. While I was in detox, my dad got me an application. Neither of us thought I would ever make this commitment. Despite my resisting God, I finally surrendered my will and He brought me to Adult & Teen Challenge of the Smokies Men's Center.

Being in the program here has given me the chance to learn about who I am in Christ. I've learned about the purpose of life and how much He loves us. Against all odds, I'm here today growing closer to being the man He planned for me to be and I now have confidence in my salvation because of my personal relationship with Christ.
