My name is Jacob. I'm originally from Havelock, NC and I'm 27 years old. I grew up in a loving home with my mother and stepfather. Early on, sports became a big part of my life. Being part of a team is what made me feel most at peace and it brought me joy. Also, football and wrestling were the outlet I used to deal with anger and frustration.

Leading up to my senior year, I had already experimented with alcohol and marijuana. After graduating from high school, I had extra time on my hands and a lack of healthy ways to vent my negative feelings and emotions. I tried to do so with drinking and smoking. Eventually, the problem had grown much worse and it turned into a habit of hardcore drug use. This culminated in a severe dependency on heroin which caused destruction in my life. It took multiple overdoses for me to admit I needed help and it took divine intervention for me to take the first step towards getting help.

I was going through a dark period in my life. My girlfriend and I had separated and my grandfather had just passed away. When my mother saw me at his funeral, she realized I was in bad shape and offered me help. Still it took another month of heavy drug use and repeated hospitalizations for me to finally accept help.

My mother, stepfather and I researched recovery centers and felt this program is what I needed. I filled out the application and soon after was accepted into this 12 month discipleship program. Without hesitation, I took a leap of faith and came to Adult & Teen Challenge of the Smokies Men's Center. I came not just because I knew I needed it, but also because I wanted a better life. God is creating a new heart in me and now I know I didn't just have a drug problem, but a sin problem. I have accepted Jesus as my Lord and Savior, and I was baptized on August 27, 2020. I have peace and joy in my life now and confident hope for my future in Christ.
