My name is Sam, I am 30 years old and from Cherokee, NC. At the age of 3, my dad was sent to prison on drug charges, which led my mom through a series of abusive relationships. I had a some what normal childhood till the age of 11. I started rebelling, fighting and smoking—doing anything and everything to not deal with reality. I was in a

state of confusion for a few years.

At the age of 16, I had a close call with death while drunk and high on pills. I fell off of a 45ft. bridge. I severely injured my back to a point where the doctors said I wouldn't walk again. I was prescribed Oxycotin and was instantly hooked and in love with it. Once my prescriptions ran out, I turned to the streets hustling and manipulating everyone to stay high.

This continued on a downward spiral leading to multiple jail and prison sentences from the age of 18 to 29. Finally, in December 2019, I knew I needed something different in my life. I didn't want to be angry and have hatred, but didn't exactly know what it was I needed.

Godly people always seemed to surround me and got me wondering what they had. I began attending church services and NA programs, where I met someone who works with the Haywood County Sheriff's Department. Through a course of 3 months, he helped me get into Adult & Teen Challenge of the Smokies Men's Center.

Before I found God, I felt like the weight of the world was on my shoulders. After 3 months in the program, I had surrendered to Jesus Christ and on June 17th, I was baptized in the Cullasaja River. The Lord has been showing me that I have a lot to work on—anger, entitlement, trust, and faith to name a few. God is also showing me how to forgive myself and grow in a life that would please Him. I'm so thankful for being sober and for the Hep C treatment I have received. Also, I'm thankful for being in a place filled with brotherly love.

Romans 7:14-15, reminds me about the struggles with sin: "So the trouble is not with the law, for it is spiritual and good. The trouble is with me, for I am all too human, a slave to sin. I don't really understand myself, for I want to do what is right but I don't do it. Instead I do what I hate". This keeps me from becoming discouraged and know transformation through God is at hand.
