My name is Logan. I'm 19 years old and I'm from Chattanooga, TN. I have two older brothers. I grew up around family members who drank and used meth so I didn't have a great childhood. My uncle was a Christian and I went to church with him a few times.

I began smoking cigarettes at age 10 and began to experiment with drugs. I started out smoking marijuana and that led to using pills. When I was 15, I began using meth and soon became a meth addict. I started using ever day and dropped out of school.

When I was 18, I moved to Knoxville, TN to get away from drugs, but I was still using and became homeless. I was walking down the street one day when a pastor saw me. He pulled over and asked me if I wanted help. I said, "Yes, I'm tired of living this way". The pastor helped me get clean and talked to me about God and reading the Bible. He also recommended that I go to Adult & Teen Challenge of the Smokies Men's Center.

I had been baptized when I was in Knoxville, but I fully surrendered to Christ when I came here and I'm glad I did. Since I've been in the program, God has shown me that a complete stranger can love you, even though they don't know you. The Lord has shown me how to love others as well. This program is helping me so much.

I have now been here for almost 12 months and I have come to realize how much I have to be thankful for. Being alive, having a place to sleep, having food to eat, and learning different work skills are some of the things I'm thankful for. The men here are like brothers to me. Having them here to help me along the way is a blessing in itself, as well as being in a place to get off of drugs. When I finish this program, I want to live in the Graduate Cabins and work locally.


