My name is Dalton. I am 27 years old and I've been struggling with drugs and alcohol for 10 years. I did not grow up in a Christian home and I witnessed my parents go through a divorce. I was a bigger kid growing up and was made fun of a lot, which led me to having a bad self image. I just wanted to feel important and accepted by others. I began drinking in the 9th grade and began smoking pot in 10th grade. In

the 11th grade I suffered a baseball injury which introduced me to pain pills. I fell in love with them because they helped give me the confidence I had lacked all my life.

After I graduated from high school, I went to college and my habits went with me. I was smoking, drinking and partying more than ever. I was also using pain pills and other pills daily. Basically, I was using whatever I could get my hands on. I ended up dropping out of college at the end of my junior year. I moved home and continued in a downward spiral with my drug abuse at an all time high and ended up in jail. Shortly after I was released, I met a girl and fell in love but my addiction didn't stop. I married her and ended up leading her down the same dark path I was on. Due to my addiction, and putting it first instead of her, she left me. That was my breaking point. I had never been so broken and lost in my life.

I reached out to my pastor looking for help. The drinking and drugs were causing me more pain instead of taking the pain away. I remember seeing a quote that said "Our greatest fear is the light, not the darkness". That spoke to my heart that just maybe I could actually stop living in the darkness and step into the light and be somebody. I went to church in early January 2020. When the pastor did an alter call, I was the first one to the front. I felt God move in my life that day. As the pastor and others prayed over me, I cried out, "Please God, please God, over and over again.

Two days after that Sunday I was accepted into Teen Challenge. The following day I was in detox and 6 days later I arrived at Adult and Teen Challenge of the Smokies Men's Center. Since being here, God has done amazing things in my life and I am building a personal relationship with Him —something I've never had before. I was baptized on March 9th, 2020. God has given me hope about my marriage and He has begun to restore my relationships with my parents, in-laws, and sister. He has give me hope about my future. I meditate on Jeremiah 29:11, and Philippians 3:13. "But one thing I do: forgetting what is behind and straining towards what is ahead." Thank you God for all you have done!
