My name is Cody and I am from Simi Valley, California. I would say that my life when I was young, was kind of chaotic and on the move a lot. I was a huge sports fan, but I seemed to have a hard time making friends. I heard a lot of fighting at

home. When I was six, I came to Georgia to live with my grandparents, my mom and brother. At this time I started to hear about God and life was good. I was going to church several times each week. I volunteered at church, went to church summer camp, and was involved in other activities there.

When I was twelve, my dad died. I started to develop anger, depression, anxiety, and suicidal thoughts. I was completely out of control and just rebellious. Several months after my dad died, I was sent off to a mental hospital for children and youth. After being there for about three years, I graduated but couldn't go home. So they and my parents found me a place at a group home. This is where my addiction issues started. I was seventeen at the time and it started with a beer. Then it progressed to smoking weed, which I thought I could handle, but I was wrong. I fell so hard into peer pressure and was such a crowd pleaser, wanting to be cool. I started using harder drugs such as meth, prescription drugs, crack, and also had a huge alcohol problem. It had gotten so bad that I almost died from making a bad judgement while in the midst of being on drugs. Not only that, I couldn't even hold a job very long without quitting or going to jail.

Back in June of 2020, I had lost all hope and everything important to me—family, friends, respect of self and others, and a place to live. This is when I genuinely surrendered to Jesus. When I got out of jail, I had someone tell me about a program in Georgia. After a few months, they sent me here so I could get more help and get to know the Lord more.

This program has helped me get back to my Christian roots and also gave me a hope. God is showing me that I am a part of His kingdom. I am grateful for each day that I wake up here at Adult & Teen Challenge of the Smokies Men's Center. I'm also thankful for being able to study His Word and to be sober with a peace and joy. My favorite Bible verse recently is 1 Peter 2:9. "But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye shall shew forth the praises of Him who hath called you out of darkness into His marvelous light".
