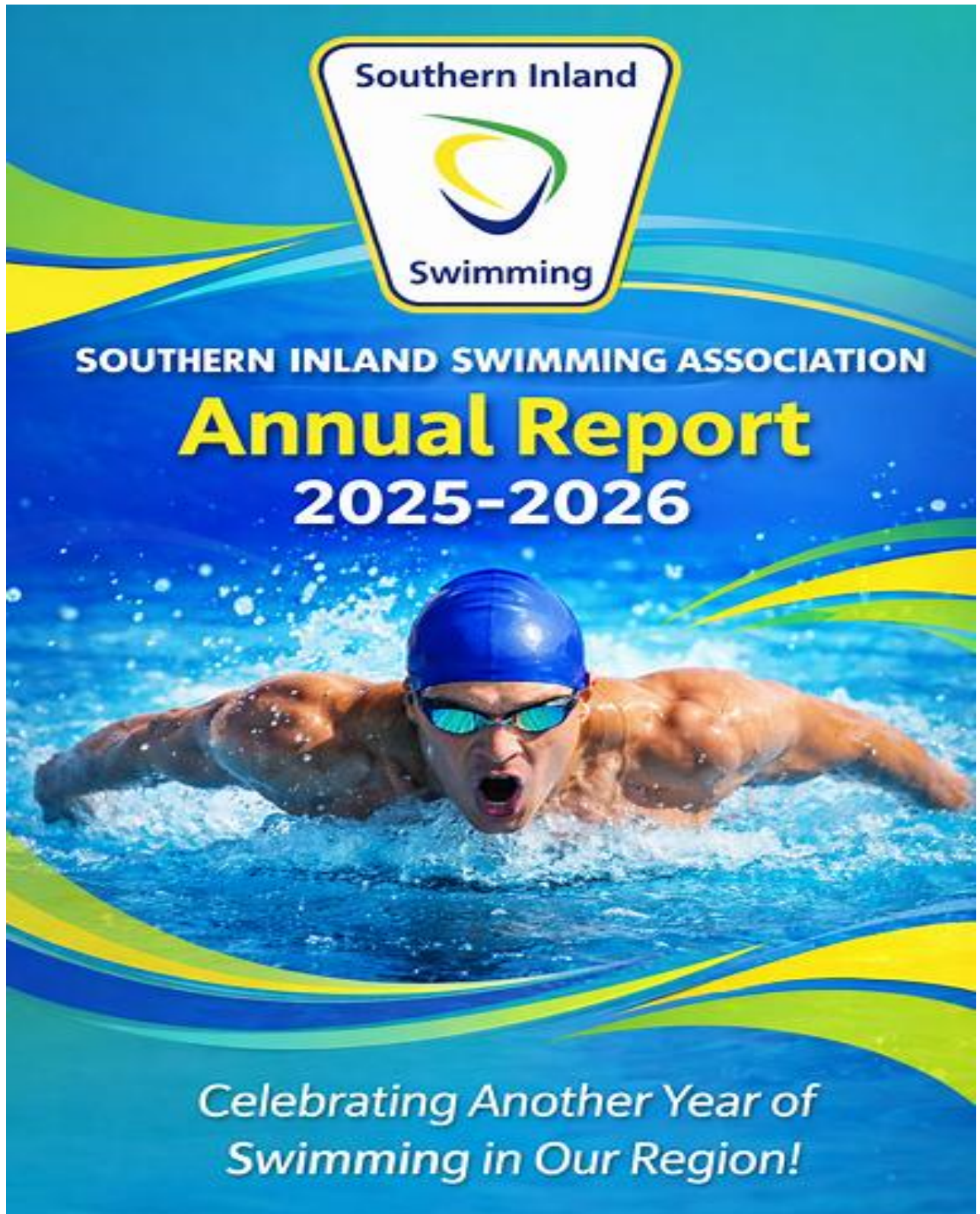

Presidents Report

It is with great pleasure that I present the Southern Inland Swimming Association's Annual Report for the 2025–2026 season.

SISA's registration numbers have remained stable, with only a minor decline from 2,950 to 2,936 members across membership categories. In 2025-2026 we saw the removal of the recreation membership category where some clubs have seen a reduction in numbers due to this category of membership being dissolved. Despite this, participation across the region remains steady & strong. SISA continues to be one of the largest areas in New South Wales.

Major Events and Championships

NSW Regional Country Championships – January 2026

SISA was honoured to be one of three host locations for the NSW Regional Country Championships. The event, held at the Leeton Regional Aquatic Centre and hosted by the Leeton Yanco Swimming Club, was conducted with outstanding professionalism. SISA extends its congratulations to Leeton Yanco Swimming Club, Swimming NSW, and Leeton Shire Council for their exemplary organisation and delivery of this two-day meet. I would like to thank the Carlie Foundation for supporting regional swimmers with there grants.

SISA Long Course Championships & Speedo Sprints Heats

The 2026 Long Course Championships and Speedo Sprints Heats were held at the Oasis Aquatic Centre, Wagga Wagga, on 30 January and 1 February. This event recorded the highest participation numbers for the season. Despite extreme heat on Day 1, the meet proceeded smoothly, with SISA implementing additional welfare measures, including the use of indoor facilities to provide a cooler environment for swimmers.

SISA acknowledges the Wagga Wagga Swimming Club for hosting an exceptional two-day event and thanks the Oasis Centre management for their cooperation under challenging conditions. We were also privileged to welcome Federal Member Michael McCormack, Mayor Dallas Tout and SISA sponsor Vicki Meyers (Deniliquin Freighters) to officially open the Championships.

Program Enhancements

This season saw the introduction of additional 50m events on Saturday, enabling younger swimmers to participate in non-championship events across both days. The Speedo Sprints and Long Course Championships continue to grow in scale and significance.

Congratulations to the top-performing clubs:

- Wagga Wagga Swim Club – Overall Long Course Club Champions
- Griffith Swimming Club – Runners-up
- Albury Amateur Swimming Club – Third place

Speedo Sprints 2026

The 2026 Speedo Sprints Finals were highly successful, with 69 SISA swimmers representing the region at the Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre (SOPAC). This event provides an invaluable



experience for swimmers aged 8–13 years, and SISA extends its appreciation to the coaches and managers who travelled to Sydney to support our athletes.

Advocacy for Age Group Expansion

SISA continued its advocacy to Swimming NSW for the expansion of the Speedo Sprint age groups. SISA would like to see this program be extended to include 14-year-olds in the first year and 15-year-olds in the second year. This initiative is designed to support the retention of teenage swimmers by providing meaningful and age-appropriate competition pathways for athletes who may not yet meet Senior State Age qualifying standards. Expanding these age groups is an important strategic measure that will strengthen participation, enhance engagement, and help ensure that swimmers in this age bracket remain connected to the sport or we will see further decline in this age group.

Brophy Invitational Meet – March 2025

The Brophy Invitational Meet was held at the Australian Institute of Sport, with SISA fielding strong teams from the Southwest, Murray, and Riverina zones. This year, Southwest combined with Riverina/Murray to form two competitive teams. SISA congratulates all junior swimmers, coaches, and managers who represented the region with pride.

Club Meets and Volunteer Support

SISA remains committed to providing competition opportunities across the region, and this season saw several of our clubs successfully host well-run and well-supported meets. Entries and participation levels have remained steady overall, although a small number of meets experienced a decline in entries throughout the year.

One ongoing challenge for clubs at the grassroots level is the financial impact of the Swimming NSW meet levy of \$1.50 per entry, a cost that has now been in place for several years. This levy, paid by the host club upon the upload of entries, continues to place significant pressure on meet budgets. Clubs must carefully balance this expense alongside other operational costs while still maintaining strong participation levels to ensure the viability and success of their events. Within the SISA region alone, SISA and its affiliated clubs collectively outlaid 15,841.50 in the 2025–2026 season solely to cover time-upload levies.

I extend my sincere thanks to all clubs that hosted meets this season, and to the parents and volunteers whose dedication ensures these events operate efficiently and to the high standard expected across our region.

Junior Development Squad

SISA continues to lead the state in junior development through its unique area-based Junior Development Squad program. In 2026, 59 swimmers accepted invitations to join the squad. The program runs from May to October (excluding July) and is delivered by coaches from across NSW and within the region.

This program is fully funded by SISA following the cessation of the \$5,000 annual development funding previously provided by Swimming NSW.



Country & State Championships and National Representation

SISA recorded an increase in participation at the NSW Country Championships, with 93 swimmers competing in 2026 compared to 89 in 2025.

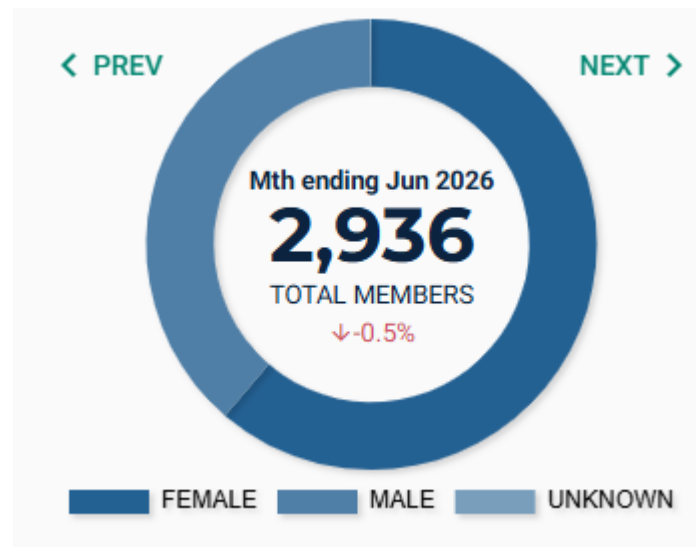

Membership Overview

SISA membership for 2025–2026 includes:

- 1,214 Full Member Swimmers
- 560 Club Supporters
- 1015 Club Swimmers
- 111 Life Members
- 28 Second Claim Members

Women represent 61.3% of the membership, with men comprising 38.7%.



Teenage Retention

Retention of swimmers aged 14–18 remains a challenge:

- 2024–2025: 333 swimmers (11.3%)
- 2025–2026: 307 swimmers (10.5%)

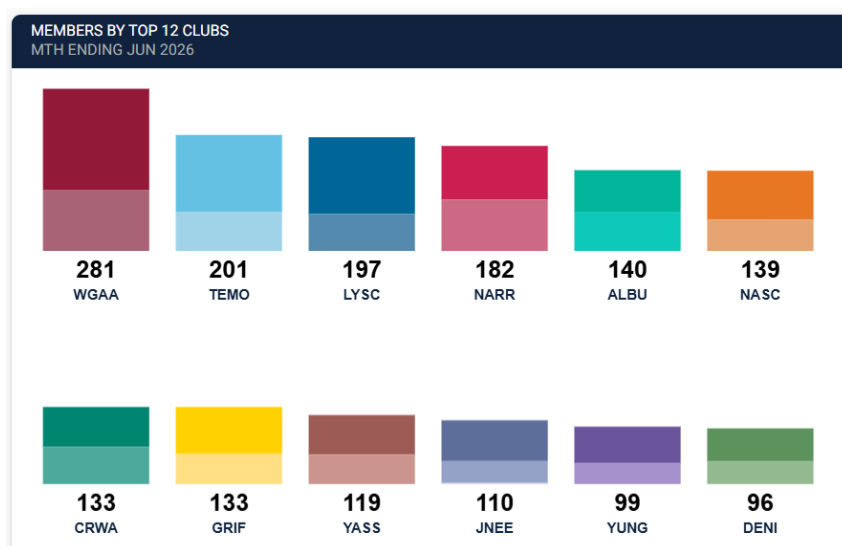
This decline reflects broader pressures, including academic demands, part-time work, travel requirements, and limited competition pathways for regional teenagers. Strengthening teenage



retention remains a key strategic priority for SISA to keep this age group engaged and something to aim for.

Top Clubs by Membership

Wagga Wagga Swim Club leads the region with 281 members, followed by Temora and Leeton Yanco. SISA is encouraged by the continued growth of smaller clubs and looks forward to further development in the 2026–2027 season.

Technical Officials

During the 2025–2026 season, SISA implemented a targeted initiative to strengthen the depth and sustainability of Technical Officiating across the Area. Recognising that the successful delivery of meets is dependent on a reliable and growing officiating base, SISA introduced a requirement for all clubs hosting a meet to train **two new individuals**. parents or junior members aged 16 years or older—to become accredited Technical Officials.

These new officials were expected to support their club's hosted meet and were encouraged to contribute to additional meets throughout the season. This approach directly addressed the long-standing reliance on a small group of dedicated officials and reinforced the importance of shared responsibility across all clubs.

The initiative was well received, with clubs responding positively and proactively. As a result, SISA recorded an increase in both accredited officials and new trainees undertaking officiating modules. This growth has strengthened the Area's operational capacity and supports the continued delivery of high-quality, well-officiated competitions into future seasons.

2025–2026 Long Course Season

Outstanding Athlete Achievements

Throughout the 2025–2026 Long Course Season, swimmers across the Southern Inland Swimming Association continued to excel, achieving remarkable results across all levels of the sport. Athletes attained:

- JX Phoenix Gold, Silver, Bronze and Blue status
- Qualification for Speedo Sprint Finals
- Brophy Development Team representation
- NSW Country, Youth and Senior State qualifying times
- National qualifying times
- Progression to the Australian Swimming Trials, with athletes striving for selection to the Australian Dolphins Team for the Commonwealth Games in Glasgow

These achievements reflect the dedication, discipline, and commitment demonstrated by swimmers and their coaches throughout the season.

Junior Development Squad – 2026 Program

One of SISA's most significant and successful initiatives has been the establishment of the Junior Development Squad, targeting swimmers aged 10–14 years. Due to the overwhelming success and positive feedback from the inaugural program, SISA continued the initiative in 2026, targeting swimmers aged 10-15 years with 59 swimmers accepting invitations.

The program:

- Operates at the Junee Aquatic Centre from May to October (excluding July)
- Provides structured winter training opportunities for developing swimmers
- Invites coaches from both within and outside the SISA region to lead sessions
- Exposes swimmers to a variety of coaching styles, voices, and technical perspectives
- Remains the only area-run program of its kind in NSW and Australia, reinforcing SISA's commitment to junior athlete development

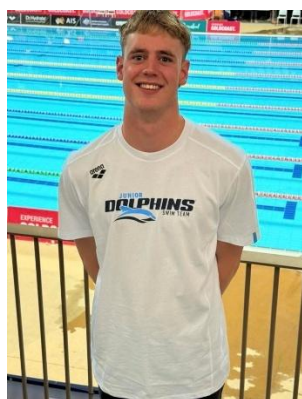

Entry fees remain \$4.00 per event, with an additional \$1.50 Swimming NSW meet levy applied where required, ensuring affordability while meeting all obligations.

Riverina Zone Annual Report 2025–2026

The 2025–2026 season has been another highly successful year for the Riverina Zone, highlighted by strong participation at local carnivals, excellent representation at championship events, and continued growth in opportunities for swimmers across the region.

Throughout the season, clubs across the Riverina hosted a number of well-attended and professionally conducted meets, attracting swimmers from throughout the Southern Inland region and beyond. Attendance figures were particularly encouraging, demonstrating the ongoing strength and popularity of swimming within the area. Wagga Wagga Swim Club hosted 187 swimmers, Griffith Swim Club 127 swimmers, Leeton Yanco Swim Club 106 swimmers, Deniliquin Swim Club 102 swimmers, Finley Swim Club's Short Course Meet 114 swimmers, and Narrandera Swim Club 135 swimmers.

A major highlight of the season was the hosting of the NSW Country Regional Championships in Leeton in January 2026. This prestigious event attracted 284 swimmers across two days of competition and showcased both the excellent facilities and the strong organisational capabilities within the Riverina. The Southern Inland Swimming Association Long Course Championships, along with the Speedo Sprint Heats, were also successfully conducted in Wagga Wagga at the end of January, drawing 286 swimmers across two days of racing.

Representative swimming continued to be a strength of the Riverina Zone. The combined Riverina/Murray Brophy Team consisted of 48 swimmers. Through collaboration with the South West Zone, swimmers were exchanged between teams, ensuring that all athletes who expressed interest were provided with an opportunity to compete. This cooperative approach maximised participation and contributed to a positive and inclusive experience for all swimmers involved.

Riverina swimmers continued to achieve strong results at higher levels of competition throughout the season. Nineteen swimmers represented their clubs at the NSW Senior State Age Championships in December 2025. Thirty-nine swimmers qualified for and competed in the NSW Country Championships in February 2026, while 14 swimmers attended the NSW Youth State Age Championships in March 2026.

The season concluded with eight Riverina swimmers qualifying for and competing at the Australian Age Championships on the Gold Coast in April 2026. In addition, five Riverina swimmers achieved the qualifying standards to compete at the Australian Swimming Trials held at Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre (SOPAC)—a significant accomplishment and a testament to the high calibre of swimmers emerging from the region.

The Riverina Zone also celebrated several individual achievements during the season. Congratulations to Abbie Donelan and Ruby Cooper (Wagga Wagga Swim Club) on their selection in the Sharks Squad, and to Andre Labara (Wagga Wagga Swim Club) on his selection in the Flippers Squad. These honours recognise the athletes' dedication, commitment, and talent, and reflect the quality coaching and support provided across the Riverina.

The continued success of the Riverina Zone would not be possible without the tireless efforts of club committees, coaches, technical officials, and volunteers. Their dedication ensures the delivery of quality competitions and valuable development opportunities for swimmers throughout the region.
