PRESIDENT REPORT – (Tom Murphy) 2020-2021

I am pleased to present this report which highlights the continuing strong achievements of our SISA Swimmers, Coaches, Officials and Management Committee members despite the ongoing impact and restrictions associated with the COVID 19 situation.

During the past twelve months, our SISA swimming community continued to experience COVID restrictions to the extent that SISA had to cancel the 2021 SISA Short Course Championships. Our SISA community has had to come to terms with COVID vaccinations, boosters, and the dreaded regular Rapid Antigen Tests – commonly referred to as 'RAT' tests. There is still several of our clubs that continue to experience difficulties with Councils and pool operators in respect to numbers permitted within a pool complex. I am sure I speak for the entire SISA swimming

Saturday, January 8th and Sunday 9th January saw the Griffith Swim Club host the 2022 SNSW Country Regionals. This event was a fantastic opportunity for the Griffith SC and the Griffith Regional Council to showcase their new 50m pool. The meet was very well supported with two great days of competitive swimming on display. As the SISA President it very pleasing to see that 15 of the 22 technical officials officiating at the meet were from SISA. Congratulations must go to Felicity Palmer and Peta Serafin from the Griffith SC for all the time and effort they put in to ensure the meet's success.

The 2022 SISA Long Course Championships and Speedo Sprints were conducted at the West Wyalong Swimming Pool on Saturday 5th and Sunday 6th February 2021 and thanks and congratulations must go to the team from the West Wyalong Swim Club for their professionalism in hosting this meet. Over the last few years, the SISA LC Championships have been hosted over two days and having regard to our competitor numbers and the success of the meet, this format appears to be working well.

The Brophy Invitational meet was cancelled for the second consecutive year. This situation allowed SISA to again host an Invitational Meet to allow the former swimming Zones of Murray, Riverina and South-West to come together and compete against each other. A special thank you must go to Ged Horsley and his team from the Wagga Wagga SC for hosting the meet. I am pleased to witness and acknowledge the commitment of several of our councils within the SISA that are upgrading their aquatic environments. Be it the pools or the pool environs at Temora, Gundagai, Hay, and Junee. I would like to offer my thanks for your commitment to our sport.

I continue to be extremely proud of the way the SISA Community has embraced the inclusiveness of all swimmers. It has become the standard for all Clubs within SISA to include Multi-Class events in their swim meet programs. SISA can be extremely proud of the success of our MC swimmers, not only those that compete at the highest level but those that try their best to achieve a 'personal best' each swim. Special congratulations to Ashley van Rijswijk (Wagga Wagga) who competed in the Tokyo Para Olympics. SISA's other MC swimmers motivated by Ashley's success are now competing at the representative level.

DEVELOPMENT CONVENOR REPORT – (Billy Nicholson)

Southern Inland has seen a very successful 2021-22 season throughout all levels of competition. Our Speedo Sprints team consisted of 60 swimmers which ranked 10th overall. We also had a bronze medal in the 8-10 years girls medley relay and Georgia Wheeler (Young ASC) earnt a silver medal in her individual backstroke event. SISA swimmers also saw plenty of the podium at the NSW Country, NSW State and Australian Age meets.

In development over the previous LC season, SISA ran a small yet valuable development clinic in Lockhart in February for swimmers to on skills and prepped the swimmers for their next level of the school carnivals. Some of our dedicated technical officials (Tom & Kayleen Murphy, Ged & Priscilla Horsley) attended and gave valuable advice to both the swimmers and parents. Their help was greatly appreciated.

After a two-year absence from development activities, SISA looks set to host a wonderful development program in 2022. The aim of the annual SISA development program is to provide swimmers, coaches and officials with the opportunity to learn, share and connect through the area's personnel and resources. Below is a general outline of the activities to be undertaken this year.

SISA National Age Representative Squad (NARS): Camp at the AIS with Mountains and Plains Swimming (MPS) and Swimming ACT (SACT). Further details for this camp will be released once all three areas decide on a suitable date.

SISA Senior Age Representative Squad (SARS) & SISA Junior Age Representative Squad (JARS): Joint weekend clinic in Wagga Wagga. As of June 2nd, SISA awaits confirmation from the guest coach to confirm dates. This information will be released to participants as soon as possible. These swimmers will also have the opportunity to attend an event in Sydney on the 24th and/or 25th of September. Swimming NSW are finalising details for this event, which is likely to include 'Swim League'.

SISA Blue Squad & SISA Green Squad: These swimmers will have the opportunity to attend a clinic in 1 of 3 locations. Locations will likely be based in each zone (Riverina, South West and Murray). Some clubs have been approached to provide details on their local facility to assist SISA in choosing these locations. These clinics will be held at the beginning of the 2022-23 LC season and will be facilitated by SISA coaches. There is also initial planning to provide these swimmers with a 1-day Swim League type of event – more details will be sent out when provided by Swimming NSW.

SISA Yellow Squad: This squad will be an open invite for all swimmers over the age of 15 years, and will either be a face-to-face, online or blended format of information sessions. The sessions will be providing information around long-term participation in swimming, both in and out of the water. This will also most likely be held closer to the next LC season.

A total of 284 swimmers were invited into our development program this year, coming from 26 different SISA clubs. A breakdown of the number of invites in contrast to the number of registrations (as of June 2^{nd} 2022) can be seen in the table below. Note that development dates are yet to be set and therefore numbers are fluid.

There has been a pleasing number of SISA members stepping up and obtaining Technical Official credentials during the 2021-2022 season.

The modules available online are – General Principals, Timekeeper/Chief Timekeeper, Clerk of the Course, Check Starter, Judge of Stroke, Inspector of Turns, Recording, Starter, and Dolphin Training. There have been 63 online modules completed by members of various clubs in the SISA Area. The following clubs had members complete the online modules – Wagga, Albury, Young, Griffith, Deniliquin, Leeton Yanco, Cootamundra, Narrandera, GT Aquatics, West Wyalong and ANL. This has been followed up with 54 practical assessments being completed over the season, which is fantastic after the disruptions we have had over the past 12 months.

In 1989, Chris began volunteering to officiate at District Meets and he has worked at these meets now for over 25 years. Chris was first elected to the Swimming NSW Technical Swimming Committee in 2014 and still serves on this Committee presently, often travelling by car from Deniliquin to Sydney to attend the meetings.
