REPORTS

PRESIDENTS REPORT (Tom) -

Really great to see meets happening and kids back in the pools swimming.

Sunday 30 October attended the Albury swim meet. Well supported and run meet. It was pleasing to see that SISA officials filled the majority of officiating roles, in particular Murray Zone officials.

Saturday 5 November attended the Wagga Wagga 125th Anniversary swim meet. The WWSC was formed following a meeting on the 4th November 1897 and has proud swimming history within southern NSW. The meet was very well supported from throughout SISA, the ACT, as well as swimmers from SOPAC. Mark Heathcote, CEO of Swimming NSW attended as well as former Olympic and Commonwealth Games medallist James Magnussen who competed in a skins event.

I am aware that Kayleen is in the process of finalising names for the SISA Area Technical Swimming Committee. The establishment of this committee led to amendments to SISA By-Law 13.

SISA has purchased a Square Contactless Card Reader so that SISA products can be purchased with a credit card at swim meets. Information from Michelle Mawbey is that this facility is working very well.

On Thursday 24 November took part in the monthly SNSW Area Presidents' meeting.

- SNSW in partnership with Newcastle University and NSW Institute of Sport have established a new regional Performance Hub based in Newcastle. Elite swimmers in the Coast and Valley region and beyond will now be able to train in Newcastle at the University of Newcastle. Athletes will be coached by an internationally recognised swimmer, coach and sport scientist, Sander Ganzevles.
- · SNSW membership is up 9% compared to the same time last year. Although Mountains and Plains and Western Region are still being heavily affected by flooding.
- SNSW will soon be conducting a facilities audit across all of NSW to ascertain the number of swimming pools there are, their lengths, lane numbers, age and condition as well as supporting infrastructure. SNSW may call upon Areas and Clubs to assist with this audit. Once SNSW has the information they (SNSW) will have supportive data to lobby Local, State and Federal Governments for new pools, supporting facilities etc. But first SNSW must know what there is, and what condition it is in.

What is evident, is that a majority of NSW pools were built following the success of Australian swimmers at the 1956 Melbourne Olympics. These pools would now be approaching 60 years old. They have provided a long and valuable service to the community, but they are tired and old and need refurbishing or replacing.

On Saturday 26 November attended the Coleambally Development swim meet. Very well supported with good attendance at the development session in the morning run by Billy and over eighty swimmers competing in the development carnival held in the afternoon.

On Sunday 27 November attended the Young swim meet. Again, the meet was well supported from mainly the South-West Clubs. The meet ran very well and it was pleasing to see that two of our SISA Technical Officials (Mark Lake and Steve Madden) who are close to embarking on the Refereeing Course
