REPORTS

PRESIDENTS REPORT (Tom) -

Again, a very quiet month with no access to pools till late September when regional restrictions were eased and several of our clubs were able to get back into squad training, albeit in some cases at reduced levels. We, unfortunately, saw some of our clubs that were also hoping to get back in squad training curtailed at the 11th hour due to COVID cases within their areas.

Spoke with Mark Heathcote – CEO of SNSW re the vacant SISA Club Support Officer and I was advised that he was hoping to move towards recruitment once NSW restrictions were eased and all clubs were back into squad training and meets were being held. So hopefully within the next couple of months. Also discussed the issue of membership, where a swimmer joined on a 'lower' level then, as the season progressed wanted to compete at a higher level, what would the cost be? Mark advised that the swimmer would have to pay the difference between the lower to the higher membership levels.

As one could expect, the current COVID situation has impacted swimming all over Australia. This situation affected Swimming Australia's meet calendar and changes were necessary. The resultant flow-on effects necessitated changes to SNSW's Meet Calendar and ultimately SISA's Meet Calendar. A request was received by SISA and the Griffith Swim Club to move the NSW Country Regional Swim Meet to Saturday 8th and Sunday 9th January 2022. This request was accepted by both SISA and the Griffith Swim Club. The only impact to the SISA Swim Meet Calendar necessitated the moving of the Deniliquin Swim Meet from Saturday 8th January to Saturday 29th January.

On 21st September, as SISA President I provided a letter of support for the Hay Shire Council's application for grant funding to replace the swimming pools and associated infrastructure at the John Houston Memorial Swimming Pool complex in Hay under the NSW Government, Office of Sport – Regional Sport Facility Fund, as well as the Federal Government – Building Better Regions Fund. If successful Hay will get a new 8 lane pool as well as new associated infrastructure buildings. Fingers crossed for Hay Shire Council.

Participated in the SNSW Area Presidents' Meeting on 23 September. Mark Heathcote advised that based on current NSW Dept. of health projections NSW would reach 80% vaccination by the second week of October, at which time it is anticipated that NSW would recommence 'Community Sport'. Club nights and swim meets are classed as Community Sport. When Community Sport recommences pools and/or clubs would still need to have QR codes for entry, adhere to NSW Government COVID Safety Plans, have their own current venue COVID Safety Plan and comply with social distancing. It is expected that QR codes for entry will be mandatory for all swimming events into the future.

With respect to participant, spectator, and officials' attendance, based on current discussions it is anticipated that swimming activities, (squad training and meets) will follow other organisations and only permit those persons that are fully vaccinated to attend. Whilst there is no direction yet in respect to the vaccination requirement of junior swimmers, one can reasonably expect that once the adult population is vaccinated, there will be a push to have all young persons vaccinated.

As I have stated previously SISA is travelling so much better than our fellow SNSW Areas, where some metropolitan local governments are not permitting any organised swim training. Recreational use of pool lanes is these areas is restricted to 2 swimmers per lane.
