CONVERSATION with ALL GOD's CHILDREN

INVITATION TO THE LORD'S TABLE and WORDS OF INSTITUTION

We are about to observe the ordinance of the Lord's Supper. We have before us an ordinary table and everyday elements of bread and wine.

What makes these elements special – what makes them sacred – is that they remind us of our Lord Jesus Christ, his life here on earth and his life in us today!

Friends: this is the joyful feast of the people of God!

People will come from east and west, and from north and south,

and sit at table in the kingdom of God.

This is our Lord's Table. Our Savior invites all those who trust in him to share in the feast that he has prepared.

We come to this sacred table -- not because we must -- but because we may.

We come to testify not that we are righteous,

but that we sincerely love our Lord Jesus Christ – and desire to be his true disciples.

We come, not because we are strong -- but because we are weak;

Not because we have any claim on heaven's rewards --

but because in our frailty and shortcomings,

we all stand in constant need of heaven's mercy and help;

We come, not to express an opinion -- but to seek a Presence and pray for a Spirit.

According to Luke, when our risen Lord was at table with his disciples,

he took the bread -- blessed and broke it -- and gave it to them.

Then their eyes were opened -- and they recognized him.

GREAT THANKSGIVING

Let us pray.

Gracious God, you made us in your image to live with one another in love.

You gave us the breath of life and freedom to choose your way...

Through long generations you have been faithful and kind to all your children.

We praise you, most holy God,

for sending your only Son to live among us -- sharing our joy and sorrow.

He told your story -- healed the sick -- and was a friend of sinners.

Obeying you -- he took up his cross -- and died that we might live.

We praise you that he overcame death and is risen to rule the world.

We trust him to overcome every power that can hurt or divide us, and believe that when he comes in glory, we will celebrate victory with him.

Remembering all your mighty and merciful acts,

we take this bread and this wine from the gifts you have given us, and celebrate with joy the redemption won for us in Jesus Christ.

By your Spirit unite us with the living Christ and with all who are baptized in his name, that we may be one in ministry in every place.

As this bread is Christ's body for us, send us out to be the body of Christ in the world. And let all the people say: **Amen!**

The presider lifts and breaks the bread, saying words of scripture:

Jesus said: I am the bread of life.

John 6:35; 15:5

The presider pours and/or lifts the cup, saying words of scripture):

Jesus said: I am the vine, you are the branches.

Come to me and never be hungry -- believe in me and never thirst.

The gifts of God for the people of God. **Thanks be to God.**

COMMUNION

When the Bread is passed, hold it so all may eat together. In giving the bread, the server may say:

1 The bread of heaven. Amen.

2 The body of Christ, given for you. Amen.

When the Cup is passed, drink as you receive it. In giving the cup, the server may say:

1 The cup of salvation. **Amen.**

2 The blood of Christ, given for you. Amen.

When conclude, the pastor says:

Every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you renew your covenant with God.

Almighty God, you provide the true bread from heaven,

your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Grant that we who have received the Sacrament of his body and blood may abide in him and he in us,

that we may be filled with the power of his endless life, now and forever.

Moment for Mission: Times of Crisis with World Central Kitchen

Sunday, August 3, 2025 offered by Rebecca LaBarr First United Presbyterian (the "Red Door" Church), Oneonta, NY



WCK responds to natural disasters, man-made crises, and humanitarian emergencies around the world. They are a team of food first responders, mobilizing with the urgency of now to get meals to the people who need them most. Deploying their model of quick action, leveraging local resources, and adapting in real time, they know that a nourishing meal in a time of crisis is so much more than a plate of food — it's hope, it's dignity, and it's a sign that someone cares.

Last year here at FUPC we focused our Mission efforts for WCK after Hurricane Helene caused devastating floods in western North Carolina. And then again in Florida.

In January 2025, they responded to the devastating fires in Southern California providing meals and relief to affected families and first responders.

In May this year as wildfires force evacuations across Manitoba, Canada WCK was there serving meals at the Billy Mosienko Arena, now a shelter for displaced families.

Now World Central Kitchen's Relief Team is in Central Texas supporting the communities impacted by catastrophic flooding in the Hill Country where, on July 4th the Guadalupe River rose more than 26 feet in just 45 minutes. Working alongside local chefs and community leaders, they are providing meals and water to first responders and impacted families.

Despite significant restrictions on humanitarian aid entering Gaza, WCK teams have delivered over 130 million meals by land, sea, and air. They have set up four large-capacity Field Kitchens in southern and central Gaza and established a network of Palestinian-led, WCK-supported Community Kitchens that provide thousands of meals every day. With the help of local partners, they are expanding food distribution efforts to the north, where the growing influx of returning families is increasing the demand for assistance.

Let us find it in our hearts to support WCK in their efforts to help those in crisis here and around the world. Food Is a Universal Human Right. Please give generously.
