Welcoming unhoused inside... the bitter winter temperatures and wind chill have reminded those of us with warm homes and food on the table how challenging it must be for our unhoused neighbors. Thankfully there are people in our community responding to the need.

When it is dangerously cold the County buildings in Cooperstown and Oneonta, the Warming Station, and First United Methodist on Chestnut Street in Oneonta are opening their doors. Covers of Love: Karen Jones coordinated the Covers of Love ministry for 15 years at St. Paul’s Episcopal in Sidney. They created bedrolls for the unhoused in Broome and Chenango counties from quilts, wool blankets, and sheets which were filled with clothing, food, and a Bible. The sewers prayed over each finished bedroll for the person who would receive it. Now the group is asking for new or gently used sleeping bags instead of making bedrolls.

In memory of Karen, we are doing a special appeal for Covers of Love. Kathy Watkins, Senior Warden at Saint Paul’s, wrote about their Mission Wednesdays. They are open from 9:30 AM to 12 Noon except for the 1st Wednesday of the month. Volunteers work on Covers of Love and run a Free Clothing Room. At 11:00 AM they serve a Free Hot Meal. They usually feed about 30 people. Well done for a small congregation of six people all over 70 years!

Covers of Love collection boxes are outside our church offices and the music room to receive sleeping bags, underwear, socks, tee shirts, sweatpants & sweatshirts, gloves, scarfs, hats, coats, non-perishable snacks (ex. individual peanut butter packets, cheese crackers, tuna packets, fruit snacks) and Bibles. The completed bags are distributed to the homeless community in Binghamton and through Catholics Charities Offices locally.

To donate money – please mark it “Covers of Love.” Checks should be payable to St. Paul’s Episcopal Church (25 River St., Sidney, NY 13838) with Covers of Love on the memo line. Deadline for this special appeal is Sunday, March 1st. Pastor Walton-Leavitt will take all donated items and monetary gifts to Sidney on Monday, March 2nd.

Worship & Music: The Sacrament of Holy Communion will be celebrated on Transfiguration of the Lord Sunday, February 15th. If joining from home, please have your elements nearby.

Ash Wednesday (February 18th) begins the Season of Lent. Many churches use a rite called the *Imposition of Ashes*. The sign of the cross with ashes on the forehead is a powerful reminder of our sinful nature and our total dependence on God for forgiveness and salvation.
