ADVENT WREATH CELEBRATION: Christ Candle

One of the gifts of celebrating Advent each year is the reminder that the gift of Jesus is given to us -- and for us -- again and again. We are always discovering anew the depths of God's love through the gift of Jesus Christ. Hope, peace, joy, and love make up the path we walk through Advent in anticipation of the coming Christ child.

Candle Lighting: The purple and pink candles are lit.

Reading: Luke 2:1-20

Once again, we experience Christmas with music, readings, and memories.

Tonight, we will hear a part of the familiar story using different versions of the Bible. Listen now to part of the Gospel of Luke, chapter 2, from *The Voice translation (2008)*.

Narrator: Around the time of Elizabeth's amazing pregnancy and John's birth, the emperor in Rome, Caesar Augustus, required everyone in the Roman Empire to participate in a massive census – ² the first census since Quirinius had become governor of Syria. ³ Each person had to go to his or her ancestral city to be counted.

⁴⁻⁵ Mary's fiancé Joseph, from Nazareth in Galilee, had to participate in the census in the same way *everyone else did*. Because he was a descendant of *King* David, his ancestral city was Bethlehem, David's birthplace. Mary, who was now late in her pregnancy *that the messenger Gabriel had predicted*, ⁶ accompanied Joseph. While in Bethlehem, she went into labor ⁷ and gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped the baby in a blanket and laid Him in a feeding trough because the inn had no room for them.

Reflect: Jesus Christ is born today! Hope, peace, joy, and love are gifts from God that draw us to his manger scene. They are also the gifts we take forward with us into a new year.

Candle Lighting: The Christ candle is lit.

Prayer: Let us pray.

On this holy day, I open my heart to you, Lord Jesus. Help me sense your presence. Grant me hope in chaos -- peace in the face of fear –

joy each day to move forward – and love to show me the way.

Guide my steps, Lord that I may live as you would have me live.

And let all the people say: Amen.

Practice: Read the Nativity story in Luke 2:1-20 each of the twelve days of Christmastide – using different translations, if you can. Note any words that stand out to you.
Write them down and use them to compose prayers for the year ahead that will help you discern how God is speaking and calling to you.

By the light of the Holy Spirit shining in our midst -open our hearts and minds, O God, to your Word -present now and always for the sake of your holy name. Amen.

Listen for the Word of God from Small Man to Big Man (Paul to Titus), chapter 2, from the First Nations Version of the New Testament, a dynamic translation.

EPISTLE READING: Titus 2:11-14 – Walking with Wisdom (FNVNT)

¹¹ For the gift of Creator's great kindness that sets people free has shined its light on all human beings. ¹² It instructs us to turn away from all that does not honor our Creator and from the desire to walk in the ways of this world. It instructs us to walk with straight and firm steps on a good and sacred path in this present world. ¹³ For we are looking and waiting for the blessing of the bright-shining appearance of the one who set us free and made us whole -- our Great Spirit, Creator Sets Free (Jesus) the Chosen One. ¹⁴ He paid the highest price to set us free from all our wrongdoings and purify for himself a people whose hearts burn with fire to do good deeds.

This is the Word of the Lord. [PAUSE] ALL: Thanks be to God.

GOSPEL READING: Luke 2:1-7 (FNVNT – *Humble Birth*)

- ¹⁻² When the time drew close for Bitter Tears (*Mary*) to have her child, the government of the People of Iron (*Romans*) ordered that the people be numbered and put on government rolls. This happened during the time that Powerful Protector (*Quirinius*) was the governor of Bright Sun (*Syria*). ³ All the Tribal Members were required to travel to their own ancestral village to register.
- ⁴⁻⁵ He Gives Sons (*Joseph*) and Bitter Tears (*Mary*) set out on a long journey from Seed Planter Village (*Nazareth*) in Circle of Nations (*Galilee*), to House of Bread (*Bethlehem*) in the Land of Promise (*Judea*), the village of their ancestor, the great chief Much Loved One (*David*).
- ⁶ The time for Bitter Tears (*Mary*) to have her child was upon her! ⁷ But no place could be found in the lodging house, so He Gives Sons (*Joseph*) found a sheep cave where it was warm and dry. There she gave birth to her son. They wrapped him in a soft, warm blanket and laid him on a baby board. Then they placed him on a bed of straw in a feeding trough.
